SUPPORTER MESSAGE

The Rangers support are renowned for their incredible backing, both in noise and in colour, and we encourage every supporter to play their part in creating a positive and safe atmosphere at Ibrox.

The club reminds all supporters that unacceptable conduct has no place at Rangers. This includes discriminatory or offensive singing, chanting, or banners; the use of pyrotechnics; throwing missiles or any other objects; violence or threatening behaviour; and entering the trackside area or field of play.

Supporters must not enter the trackside area or field of play at any time and should follow the instructions of stewards, club staff, and Police Scotland throughout matchday.

The events following our Scottish Cup fixture on 8 March demonstrated how quickly incidents can escalate, the serious risks this can create for supporters, staff and others within the stadium, and the significant reputational damage such incidents can cause to the club and the wider Rangers support.

SANCTIONS ALREADY IMPOSED ON THE CLUB

Immediate

A future Scottish Cup home match played behind closed doors, and a £100,000 compensatory payment to the opposing club.

Suspended

A further match behind-closed-doors and £100,000 payment to the opposing club, triggered by any further relevant breach in the Scottish Cup before the end of the 2027/28 season.

Unacceptable behaviour can also have serious consequences for the individuals involved, including removal from the stadium, club sanctions, and potential criminal action.

The consequences of supporter misconduct can therefore extend well beyond those directly involved and impact thousands of other Rangers supporters.

We ask everyone attending to support the team passionately and responsibly, and to help ensure Ibrox remains a safe and welcoming environment for all.

YOUR MATCHDAY AT A GLANCE

The key times for Sunday in one place. With a 12:00 kick-off, please plan your journey in advance and aim to arrive early.

10:00	Subway opens (Sunday hours 10:00 – 18:00) Ticket Office opens (10:00 until kick-off)
10:15	A fan march will depart Cessnock Station Supporters are advised to factor this in to travel plans, and we would advise those attending to be mindful of the local community.
10:25	Latest time to park inside the stadium footprint for those with permits Argyle House, Broomloan Road and Ibrox Car Parks. Enter via Broomloan Road.
10:30	Turnstiles open Have your e-ticket downloaded and ready to present on your phone. Rangers Store and Edmiston House Café also open.
11:00	Rangers Fan Zone opens at Edmiston House presented by Park's Motor Group Free entry with a valid match ticket, first-come, first-served. Under-18s must be with an adult (Challenge 25 in operation).
12:00	Kick-off Copland Rear, Main Stand Rear and both Govan corners regularly see queues close to kick-off. Please be in your seat in good time.
FT	Full time There will be a short delay before vehicles can leave the stadium while supporters clear the area. Staff will also need a few minutes to set up the player exit before supporters gather behind the barriers.
18:00	Subway closes Plan your journey home before you set off.

This is a cup tie. If the scores are level after 90 minutes there will be extra time and, if needed, penalties.
Allow for a possible later finish when planning your journey home.

TICKETING

- Please note that season ticket smartcards are **not** active for this fixture.
 - All supporters have received e-tickets/QR codes within their ticket confirmation emails. For those on CCCS, e-tickets were sent on Thursday, 10 September from 'noreply@rangers.co.uk'.
- Please note that a mobile-friendly e-ticket format is in use, and these should be scanned directly from a mobile device.
- Supporters who have chosen a print-at-home ticket may either print their ticket or scan it from a mobile device.
- Supporters printing their e-tickets should ensure the size of the QR code can still be recognised by the turnstile system.
- Please download your e-ticket in advance of arriving at the stadium.

STADIUM ENTRY

- Turnstiles will open at 10:30, and information on how to use the turnstile system can be viewed here: [BACK TO IBROX | QR Code Entry](#).
- Supporters in the Copland Rear, Main Stand Rear, and Govan East/West Corners are advised to arrive early, as these areas regularly experience queues closer to kick-off.
- Supporters with tickets for the Club Deck can enter the stadium via turnstiles at both the east and west staircases. The available turnstiles are 19–23 at the east and 50–56 at the west of the stadium.
- We recognise that not all supporters are able to arrive early for various reasons. However, where possible, we encourage early arrival to help ensure a smooth entry.
- Please be reminded, Ibrox Stadium is cashless. Only contactless and card payments are accepted at internal kiosks.
- Supporters with specific access requirements are recommended to contact disabilitymatters@rangers.co.uk for assistance.
- The club continues to explore ways of improving stadium entry and we greatly appreciate the co-operation and understanding of supporters as we work towards this.

HOW TO GET TO THE STADIUM

- **Fan march:** A fan march will depart from Cessnock Station at 10:15. Supporters travelling via Paisley Road West are advised to factor this into their journey plans and allow additional time. Those taking part in the march are kindly asked to be mindful of the local community.
- **By Subway:** The Subway operates reduced hours on Sundays and is only open from 10:00 until 18:00. Supporters are encouraged to plan their journey in advance and take these operating hours into account.

Contactless payment is available at Subway gates. Please use the same card or device when tapping in and out to ensure the correct fare is charged. Further Subway information is available [here](#).

- **By Car:** Supporters travelling by car are encouraged to check the latest travel information via [Traffic Scotland](#) before setting off.
- **By Bus:** First Glasgow services 9 and 9A run regularly from Glasgow City Centre to Paisley Road West, a short walk from Ibrox Stadium.

- **By Train:** Rail journeys can be checked in advance on the [ScotRail website](#) or app.
- **By Supporters Bus:** Supporters buses are advised to park in the following areas:
Helen Street to the west of the stadium.
Govan Road, Woodville Street and Carmichael Street to the east of the stadium.

Rangers encourages supporters buses to only use these designated areas.

MATCHDAY PARKING

- Limited parking will be available in the Broomloan Road (Away) Car Park for this fixture on a first-come, first-served basis. Parking is priced at £10 per vehicle, with both cash and card payments accepted.
- No match-by-match parking is available in the Albion Car Park; this is for seasonal permit holders only.
- All supporters parking within the stadium footprint (Argyle, Broomloan and Ibrox Car Parks) must enter via the Broomloan Road entrance. We kindly ask that you park no later than 10:25.
- Please note there may be a short delay after the final whistle before vehicles can safely exit to allow supporters to clear from the footprint of the stadium.
- Glasgow City Council enforces a pavement parking ban, with fines issued for illegal parking. Areas with exemptions can be viewed [here](#).



PLAYER-SUPPORTER ENGAGEMENT

We know many supporters, particularly younger fans, value the chance to see and meet players when they arrive at and leave Ibrox.

We want to improve those opportunities and make the process work better for supporters, players, and staff. We are looking at different ways to do that, both on matchdays and at other times throughout the season.

For Sunday's match, the current player entry and exit arrangements will remain. There will be more stewards in the area to help manage access, support supporters waiting to see the players and make sure the area operates safely.

The player entrance and car park are busy before and after matches, with players, staff and vehicles moving through the area. We therefore ask supporters to follow the guidance of stewards and club staff and to help us make the experience as positive as possible for everyone.

At the end of the match, staff will need a short period to put the player exit arrangements in place before supporters gather behind the designated barriers.

We cannot guarantee that every supporter will get the chance to meet or speak to a player, but we do want to create better and more consistent opportunities for supporters to engage with the team.

MATCHDAY SAFETY

BODY-WORN CAMERAS

As part of a national rollout across Police Scotland, officers may be wearing body-worn video cameras at matches. The cameras are intended to support policing activity and enhance safety.

PYROTECHNICS

Supporters are reminded the use of pyrotechnics is illegal within Scottish football stadiums, and any supporter found to be in possession of a pyrotechnic device at any match will be arrested. The club will be sanctioned for any use of pyrotechnics within a stadium.

Face coverings are also prohibited under ground regulations.

SMOKING ZONES

Smoking, including all pipes, e-cigarettes and vaporisers, is strictly forbidden inside the ground at all times. Failure to comply may result in ejection from the stadium and the potential loss of ticketing privileges.

The club is operating designated half-time smoking zones in all areas of the stadium, with the exception of the Main Stand and Club Deck. Please use the following exits:

EDMISTON HOUSE

The Rangers Fan Zone presented by Park's Motor Group will open at 11:00, with live entertainment, a bar and food stalls. Entry is free by showing a valid match ticket, on a first-come, first-served basis.

The two-storey venue is also home to the Rangers Store and Edmiston House Café which will be open from 10:30.

Under-18's must be accompanied by an adult (18+), and the venue operates a strict Challenge 25 Policy. Any customer without a valid ID will be refused entry.

CHARITY COLLECTION

The Rangers Charity Foundation's official bucket collection for this fixture will be Community Veterans Support.

Community Veterans Support is a beacon of hope for armed forces veterans. They create a welcoming environment where veterans can meet, relax, find peer support, and access additional services.

LOCAL COMMUNITY

Supporters attending Ibrox Stadium are reminded of their responsibilities to the local community.
