TICKETING

- There will be a ticket collection for this fixture, with members of the Rangers Ticketing Team in attendance to facilitate it.
- The ticket collection point is **The Old Irish Pub, Bergen**.
- Tickets will be available for collection on matchday between 12:00 and 16:45 (local time).
- **Address** – Øvre Ole Bulls Plass 9, 5012 Bergen, Norway
 - **Coordinates** – 60.3926° N, 5.3209° E
 - **What3Words** – ///glider.gums.insist
- We encourage supporters to collect their ticket as early as possible to allow for a smoother process.
 - A valid form of photographic ID will be required to collect your ticket.
- Please note that you will only be able to collect your own ticket, and no other supporter can pick it up on your behalf.



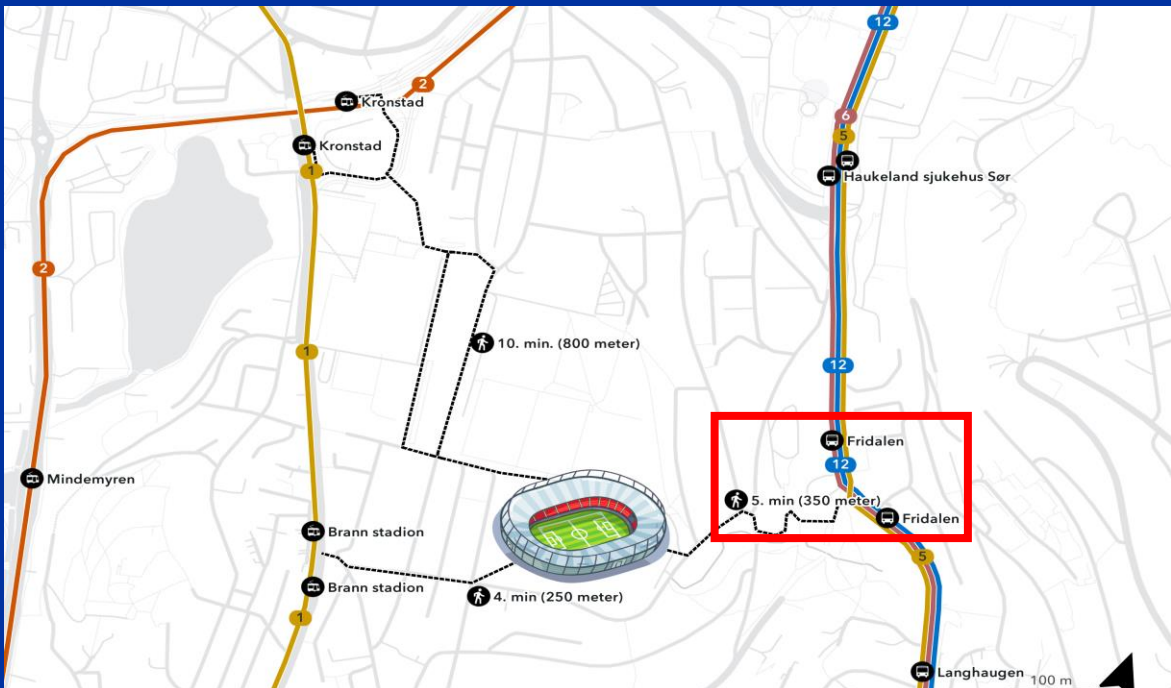
RECOMMENDED SUPPORTER AREA

- Following advice by local authorities, supporters are recommended to gather at The Old Irish Pub within the city centre, which has been chosen as the location for the ticket collection to optimise convenience for supporters.
- There will be a live singer on Wednesday and Thursday, with the bar offering 15% off drinks for Rangers fans.
- Eight shuttle buses have been arranged to transport fans from The Old Irish Pub to the stadium before the match.
- Please avoid 'Fotballpuben', as this bar will be used by home supporters on matchday.



HOW TO GET TO THE STADIUM

- **Shuttle Buses:** Eight shuttle buses will transport supporters from The Old Irish Pub to the stadium before the match. Each bus will complete two full runs, with an estimated journey time of around 15 minutes. Supporters should begin boarding from 16:45 (local time).
- Shuttle buses will drop supporters at Fridalen, which is an approximate 5-minute walk to the stadium.
 - Shuttle buses will not operate post-match.
- After the match, the police will escort fans on foot to a nearby tram stop (approximate 15-minute walk), allowing for a return to the city centre.



STADIUM & ENTRY DETAILS

- The stadium will open 90 minutes before kick-off.
 - Access is via Entrance 5.
- Our supporters will be situated in sections C & D, with unreserved seating.
- Supporters who have any accessibility requirements should email disabilitymatters@rangers.co.uk as soon as possible.
- Please note, there will be an approximate 45-minute holdback at the end of the match to allow for safe access to a nearby tram stop.



ENTRY DETAILS

- Flags must be submitted for approval before Wednesday 22 October, please email your request, including a photo and dimensions, to slo@rangers.co.uk. If you have submitted your flag for a previous fixture, you are not required to re-submit it.
- We have been advised that battery packs will be permitted, but they should not exceed 13cm x 6.5cm.
 - Bags smaller than A4 are permitted.
- There are no storage facilities available at the stadium.
- Various refreshments will be available within the stadium, including soft drinks and food items.
 - No alcohol will be sold in the away end.

USEFUL INFORMATION

Passport Requirements

Norway follows Schengen area entry rules. Your passport must have been issued less than 10 years before your arrival date and must be valid for at least three months after the day you plan to leave the Schengen area. If your passport was renewed before 1 October 2018, check carefully, as it may have a date of issue that is more than 10 years ago.

New European Union Entry/Exit System

From 12 October 2025, the EU began to introduce a new Entry/Exit System (EES) for travellers entering the Schengen area. On your first trip after this date, you may need to register biometric details (photo and fingerprints) at a designated booth before immigration. The process is free, and children aged 11 and under will only have their photo taken.

This may add a few minutes to border checks while the system is rolled out, and passports will continue to be stamped during the transition. Once fully implemented, EES will replace manual passport stamping with biometric records.

SUPPORTER MESSAGE

Across the continent, the Rangers support are renowned for their incredible backing both in noise and in colour.

Supporters are, however, reminded the club remains under a suspended stand closure sanction. That means should there be any repeat of what UEFA deems as 'racist and/or discriminatory behaviour', it could lead to further sanctions and a full stand closure.

In addition, the club is under a suspended away section ban which will be triggered if pyrotechnics are used at future fixtures. Should this occur, it would result in Rangers supporters being locked out of a key away match, directly impacting those who travel in such numbers to follow the team.

Both sanctions mean thousands of fellow Rangers supporters could be deprived of the opportunity to attend important games, while the players on the pitch would lose a significant proportion of the amazing support you provide.

Discriminatory behaviour includes (but is not limited to) illicit singing, chanting, or the displaying of banners.

Ahead of this match, and indeed the remainder of the season, the club also reminds supporters the throwing of objects onto the pitch is unacceptable, illegal, and will lead to serious consequences for the club and the potential arrest of the individuals responsible.

We call on all our travelling support to back the team in the right manner and prove once again what a force for good the Rangers support can be.
