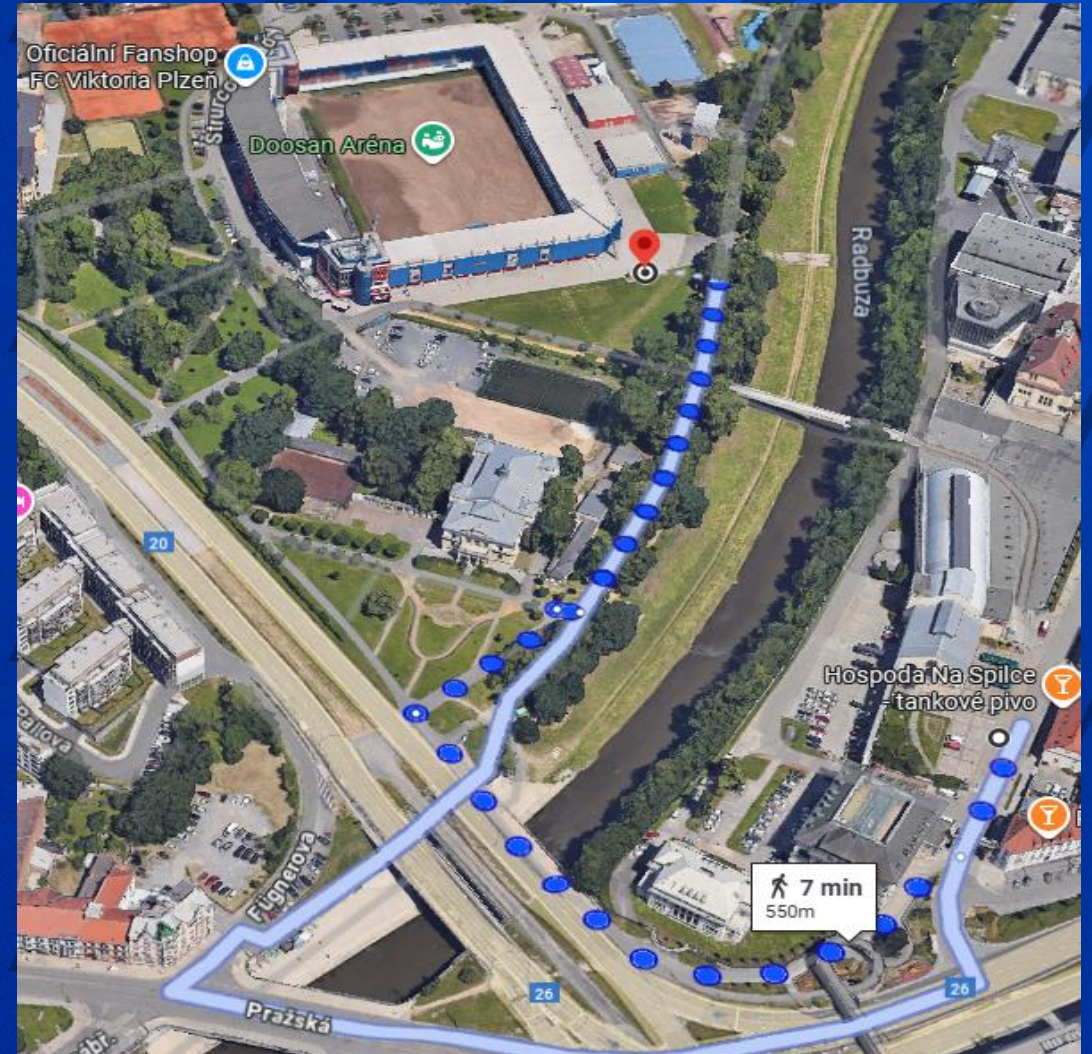
TICKETING

- There will be a full ticket collection for this fixture, with members of the Ticketing Team in attendance to facilitate it.
- The ticket collection point is a pod located directly outside the away section at the stadium and will be open from 12:30pm (local time).
- We encourage supporters to collect their tickets as early as possible to allow for a smoother entry process when turnstiles open.
- A valid form of photographic ID will be required to collect your ticket – a photocopy or picture of ID will not be accepted.
- Please note that you will only be able to collect your own ticket, and no other supporter can pick it up on your behalf.

RECOMMENDED SUPPORTER AREA

Supporters are recommended to gather at Pilsner Urquell Brewery Courtyard (pictured below), which is an approximate 7-minute walk from the away section, and the ticket collection pod.

It is advised to avoid The Square of the Republic on matchday from 3:00pm onwards as this is a prominent meeting point for home fans.

Our supporters will be positioned in sections U12 and U13, with 4 turnstiles available for entry.

ENTRY DETAILS

- Searches and ID checks will be carried out by police upon entry to the stadium.
- We have been advised that battery packs will be permitted, but they should not exceed the size of your phone.
- Large bags, backpacks, and any items exceeding A4 size will not be permitted for entry.
- There is limited storage available at the stadium, however we advise supporters to only travel with essential items.
- Both cash and card payments are accepted within the stadium.
- Beer will be served inside the stadium.
- Please note, our fans will not be allowed into the home fan sections, with ID checks being conducted in these areas.

USEFUL INFORMATION

Passport Requirements

- Czechia follows Schengen area entry rules. Your passport must have been issued less than 10 years before your arrival date and must be valid for at least 3 months after the day you plan to leave the Schengen area. If your passport was renewed before 1 October 2018, check carefully, as it may have a date of issue that is more than 10 years ago.

Travel

- Train is the most efficient mode of transport between Prague and Plzeň – please note the last train back to Prague is at 10:00pm (local time).
- For information, there is a FlixBus from Plzeň to Prague at 1:50am (local time).
- Uber is not used in Plzeň, Bolt is the more common option for taxis.

Crime

- There is a risk of pickpocketing on the metro and in crowded tourist places, particularly in Prague. Carry your valuables in different bags and pockets and keep a copy of your passport photo page somewhere safe.
- Every lamppost in Prague has a 6-digit number posted at eye level. These codes will help you tell the police where you are if you cannot give them an exact address.

Scams

- Beware of criminals pretending to be plainclothes policemen who ask to see your foreign currency and passport. Czechia police officers do not have the right to do this. Do not show them your money. Instead, offer to go with them to the nearest police station. You can also call 158 or 112 to check their identity.

EVERYONE ANYONE

That will mean thousands of fellow Rangers supporters will be deprived of the opportunity to attend a potentially key game, while the players on the pitch will lose a significant proportion of that amazing support you provide.

Discriminatory behaviour includes (but is not limited to) illicit singing, chanting or the displaying of banners.

Ahead of this match, and indeed the season, the club also reminds supporters the throwing of objects onto the pitch is unacceptable, illegal, and will lead to serious consequences for the club and the potential arrest of the individuals responsible.

We are at the beginning of a new era for our great club, and we must take every opportunity to show the very best of it to the watching world.
