SUPPORTER MESSAGE

Across the continent, the Rangers support are renowned for their incredible backing both in noise and in colour.

Supporters are, however, reminded the club remains under a suspended stand closure sanction. That means should there be any repeat of what UEFA deems as 'racist and/or discriminatory behaviour', it could lead to further sanctions and a full stand closure.

In addition, the club is under a suspended away section ban which will be triggered if pyrotechnics are used at future fixtures. Should this occur, it would result in Rangers supporters being locked out of a key away match, directly impacting those who travel in such numbers to follow the team.

Both sanctions mean thousands of fellow Rangers supporters could be deprived of the opportunity to attend important games, while the players on the pitch would lose a significant proportion of the amazing support you provide.

Discriminatory behaviour includes (but is not limited to) illicit singing, chanting, or the displaying of banners.

We call on all our travelling support to back the team in the right manner and prove once again what a force for good the Rangers support can be.



TICKETING

- There will be a partial ticket collection for this fixture, with Rangers Ticketing staff in attendance to facilitate it.
- Supporters selected to collect their ticket have been contacted with further details – photographic ID is required for collection.
- In accordance with Polish law, the passport number, full name, and date of birth of the ticket holder will be printed on the match ticket.
- Supporters who have not been selected to collect their ticket will be sent e-tickets which can be printed at home or scanned electronically on a mobile device.
- Please download your ticket in advance if you plan to scan it on your mobile.
- Supporters are reminded that the club's new sanctions policy applies to European away tickets that are purchased but not collected. The policy can be viewed [here](#).



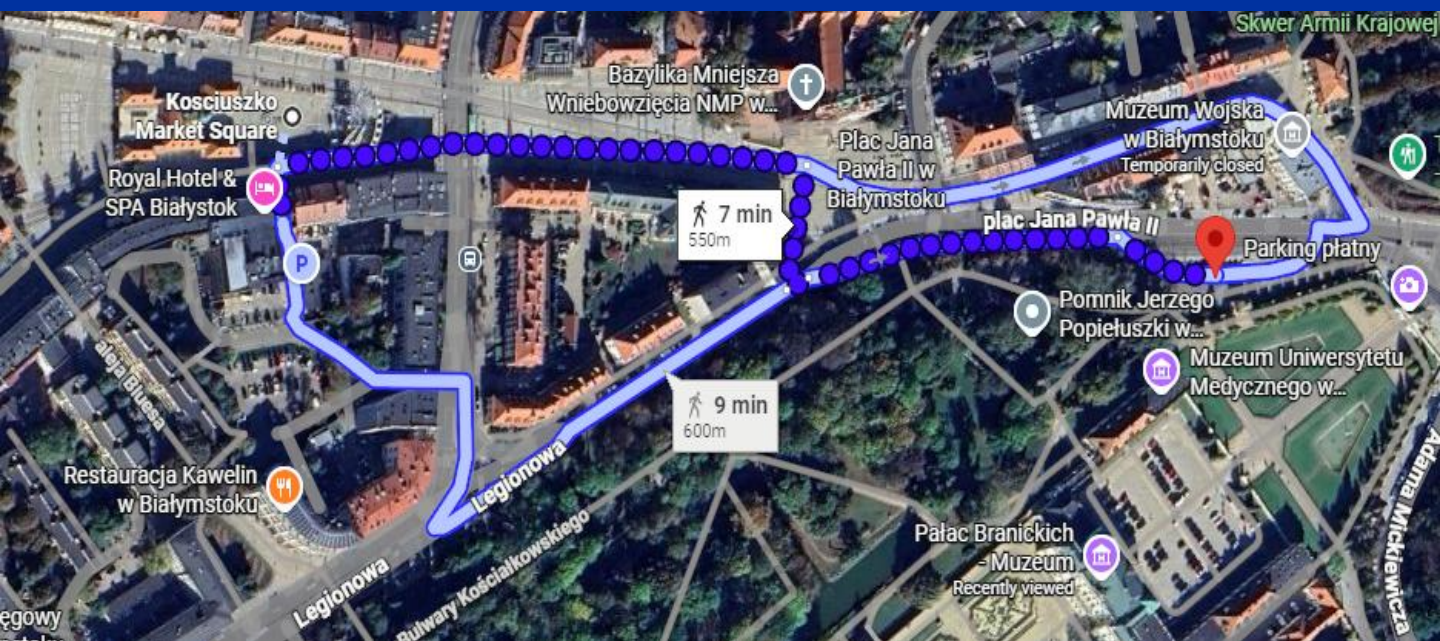
RECOMMENDED SUPPORTER AREA

- Supporters are recommended to gather at **Kościuszko Market Square** ahead of the match. Located in Białystok city centre, this area has a wide range of bars and restaurants.
- The square is located around 4km from the stadium and is an approximate 15-minute drive.
- Supporters are advised to remain in this central location where possible, stay in groups, and avoid quieter areas of the city.
- Local police have also advised supporters not to wear Rangers colours while moving around Białystok, particularly in the city centre and when visiting pubs, bars and restaurants.



HOW TO GET TO THE STADIUM

- The host club will provide shuttle buses to transport our supporters between the city centre and the stadium, both before and after the match. Supporters are strongly advised not to walk to or from the stadium.
- The buses are not mandatory; however, we have been advised this will be the safest and most efficient way for our supporters to travel between the city centre and the stadium.
- Shuttle buses will be in operation, starting from around 16:00 (local time). The journey to the stadium is expected to take approximately 15 minutes.
- The buses will depart from **Parking Płatny**, near Branicki Palace, approximately a seven-minute walk from the recommended supporter meeting point at **Kościuszko Market Square**.
- Limited parking is available next to the away entrance for supporters travelling by private car or supporter bus. Those who require access should contact slo@rangers.co.uk in advance.



STADIUM DETAILS

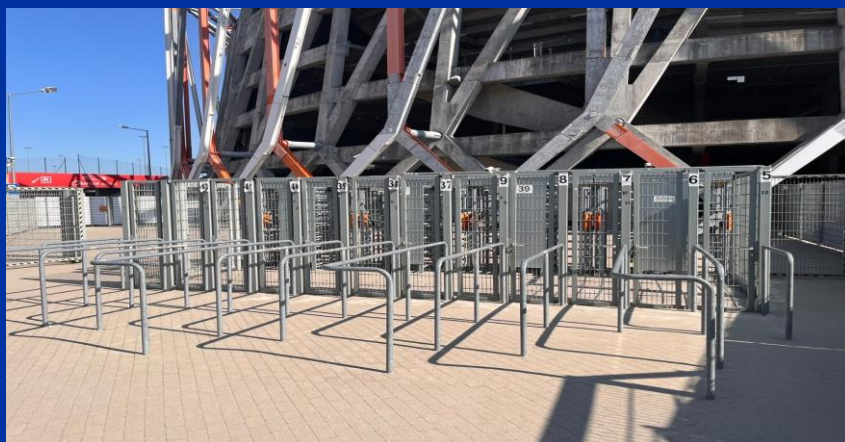

- The stadium will open two hours before kick-off.
- Our supporters will be situated in sections 39-42, with access via entrance K2.
- Supporters should proceed directly to the away entrance and avoid the surrounding areas of the stadium, which are expected to be busy with home supporters.
- No alcohol will be sold in the away end.



ENTRY DETAILS

- Supporters are asked to arrive as early as they can as the entry process may take some time.
- Fans should expect full and thorough searching upon entry to the stadium.
- Supporters should be prepared for a robust and highly visible policing operation, including the deployment of police dogs.
- Backpacks of up to 20 litres are permitted. Any bags larger than this will not be permitted and there are no storage facilities available at the stadium.
- ID checks will be carried out at the turnstiles and the details provided must match those printed on the match ticket.
 - Flags and banners are permitted but will be subject to inspection at the away entrance.
 - We have been advised that battery packs are permitted.
- There are around 60 stairs up to the away section - supporters who have any accessibility requirements should email disabilitymatters@rangers.co.uk as soon as possible.



LEAVING THE STADIUM

- A holdback will be in place for our supporters after the match and is expected to last up to 45 minutes.
- To make this period as comfortable as possible, supporters are asked to remain in their seats. Access to kiosks and toilets should remain available during the holdback, in line with UEFA requirements.
- Please only move to the concourse area if you require access to these facilities, to help prevent any overcrowding.
- Shuttle buses will operate after the match, with two journeys expected to be required to transport all supporters back to the city centre.
- Each round trip is expected to take approximately 30 minutes, meaning the second group may not depart until around 75 minutes after the final whistle.
- We appreciate that this may cause some inconvenience and thank supporters for their patience and co-operation.
- Supporters travelling by private car or supporter bus will also be subject to the holdback.



USEFUL INFORMATION

Passport and Entry Requirements

Poland follows Schengen area rules. Your passport must have a 'date of issue' less than 10 years before the date you arrive – if you renewed your passport before 1 October 2018, it might have a date of issue that is more than 10 years ago, making it invalid for entry to the Schengen area.

Passports must also have an 'expiry date' at least three months after the day you plan to leave the Schengen area (the expiry date does not need to be within 10 years of the date of issue).

Before travelling, check with your airline or other travel provider that your passport and any other travel documents meet the applicable requirements.

New Schengen Entry Requirements

The European Union's new Entry/Exit System (EES) is now being implemented across the Schengen area.

When travelling to the Schengen area for a short stay, you may be required to register biometric details, including your fingerprints and a photograph.

The process may result in longer waiting times, so supporters should allow additional time for border and immigration checks when entering and leaving the Schengen area.
