SUPPORTER MESSAGE

Across the continent, the Rangers support are renowned for their incredible backing both in noise and in colour.

Supporters are, however, reminded the club remains under a suspended stand closure sanction. That means should there be any repeat of what UEFA deems as 'racist and/or discriminatory behaviour', it could lead to further sanctions and a full stand closure.

In addition, the club is under a suspended away section ban which will be triggered if pyrotechnics are used at future fixtures. Should this occur, it would result in Rangers supporters being locked out of a key away match, impacting those who travel in such numbers to follow the team.

Both sanctions mean thousands of fellow Rangers supporters could be deprived of the opportunity to attend important games, while the players on the pitch would lose a significant proportion of the amazing support you provide.

Discriminatory behaviour includes (but is not limited to) illicit singing, chanting, or the displaying of banners.

We call on all our travelling support to back the team in the right manner and prove once again what a force for good the Rangers support can be.



TICKETING

- There will be a partial ticket collection for this fixture, with Rangers Ticketing staff in attendance to facilitate it.
 - Supporters selected to collect their ticket have been contacted with further details – photographic ID is required for collection.
- Supporters who have not been selected to collect their ticket have been sent e-tickets which can be printed at home or scanned electronically on a mobile device.
- Please download your ticket in advance if you plan to scan it on your mobile.
- Supporters are reminded that the club's new sanctions policy applies to European away tickets that are purchased but not collected. The policy can be viewed [here](#).



RECOMMENDED SUPPORTER AREA

- Supporters are recommended to gather at Mírové náměstí ahead of the match. Located beside the Town Hall in Jablonec city centre, the area has a number of bars and restaurants, with Central Jablonec shopping centre also a short walk away.
 - The square is around one mile from the stadium, an approximate 25-minute walk.
- Drinking alcohol in public spaces is prohibited and may result in fines or further action. Supporters are therefore advised to use licensed bars and restaurants.
 - The use of pyrotechnics in the city is also prohibited.
- Supporters are reminded that covering your face to prevent identification is prohibited under Czech law when travelling to, attending or leaving a football match. This also applies within the stadium.
- There are ongoing roadworks in streets around the square, so supporters should take extra care when walking in the area.



HOW TO GET TO THE STADIUM

- **On foot:** The recommended route to the stadium is on foot from the main supporter meeting point at Mírové náměstí.
- **Taxis:** Availability in Jablonec is very limited. Supporters should not rely on taxis as a primary travel option, particularly after the match.
- **Supporter coaches:** Supporters organising coaches should contact the club via slo@rangers.co.uk as soon as possible, if they have not already done so. This will allow us to assist with any drop-off and parking arrangements.
- **Private cars:** Free parking is available in the retail park next to the stadium on a first-come, first-served basis. Spaces are at a premium on matchdays and with a sell-out expected, supporters should arrive early to secure a space. It is also possible to park in the city centre; however, most parking requires payment.
- **From Liberec:** Both tram (Line 11) and train services are options for travelling to and from Jablonec. Stops are around a 15-minute walk from the stadium, with services operating after the match.
- **From Prague:** There is no direct train to Jablonec. Supporters should plan their journey and any required connections carefully in advance.

- Our supporters will be situated in the South Stand.
- Various refreshments, including alcoholic beer, will be available to purchase in the away section.
- Both cash and card payments will be accepted at the kiosk.
- Some views within the away section are obstructed by fencing.
- Facilities at the stadium are limited, and we kindly ask supporters for their co-operation and understanding throughout.



STADIUM ENTRY AND EXIT

- The entrance to the away end is located on Vrkoslavická (what3words - condiment.promises.landmark).
- Please arrive at the stadium as early as possible to assist with the entry process. The stadium will open 90 minutes before kick-off.
 - Searching will be carried out by private security.
- Only bags smaller than A4 will be permitted and there are no storage facilities at the stadium.
- Flags and banners are permitted but will be subject to inspection at the away entrance. These can be displayed at the front of the away section but should not cover advertising.
- Please be mindful of the view of other supporters when placing flags in the away section.
- We have been advised that battery packs will be permitted but should not exceed the size of your phone.

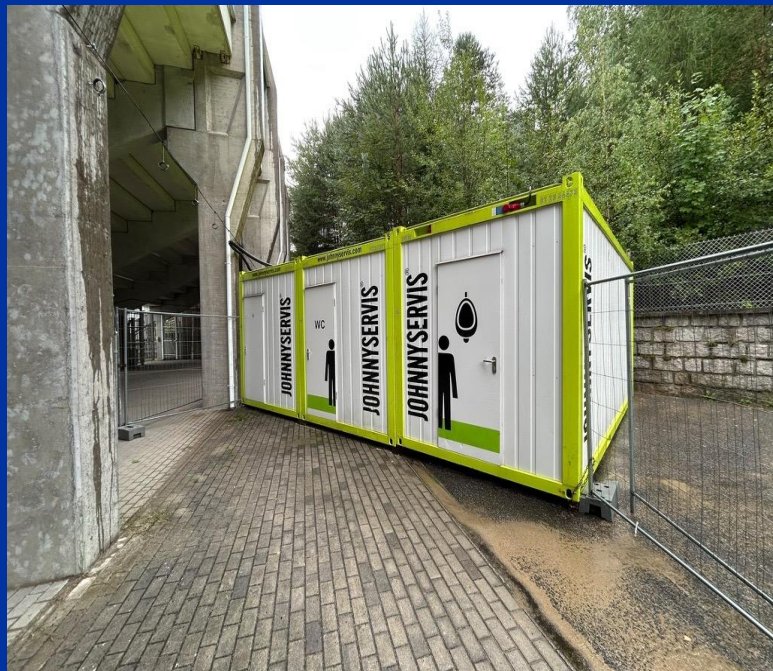
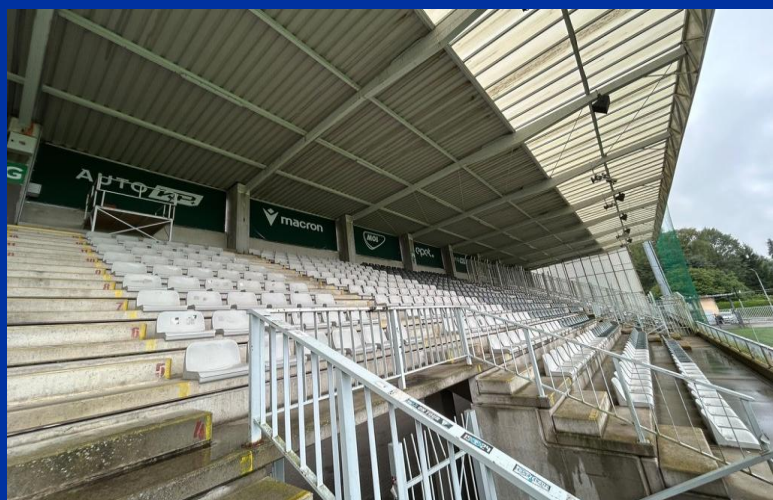
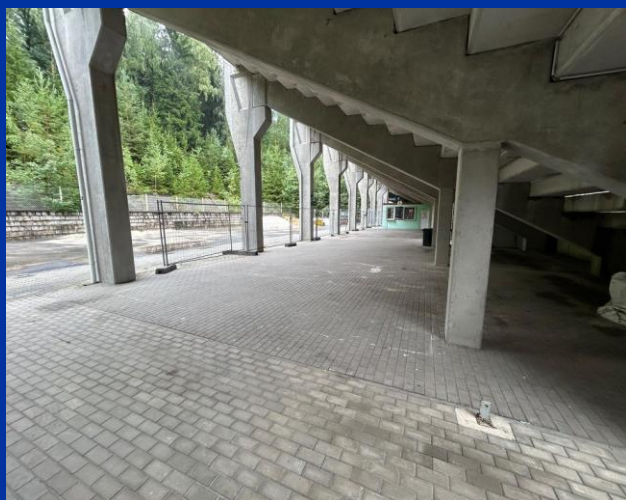


STADIUM ENTRY AND EXIT

- The entrance to the away section is at the top of a slight hill, with the uphill stretch around 130m long, rising by approximately 10m. This road will be closed to vehicles from around four hours before kick-off.
- Inside the stadium, there are around 10 steps from the concourse to the seating area.
- Supporters who have any concerns about any aspects of the access route should email disabilitymatters@rangers.co.uk as soon as possible.
- A holdback will be in place for our supporters after the match and is expected to last up to 30 minutes.
- To make this period as comfortable as possible, supporters are asked to remain in their seats. Access to kiosks and toilets should remain available during the holdback, in line with UEFA requirements.
- Please only move to the concourse if you require access to these facilities, to help prevent any overcrowding.

USEFUL INFORMATION

Passport and Entry Requirements

Czechia follows Schengen area rules. Your passport must have a 'date of issue' less than 10 years before the date you arrive – if you renewed your passport before 1 October 2018, it might have a date of issue that is more than 10 years ago, making it invalid for entry to the Schengen area.

Passports must also have an 'expiry date' at least three months after the day you plan to leave the Schengen area (the expiry date does not need to be within 10 years of the date of issue).

Before travelling, check with your airline or other travel provider that your passport and any other travel documents meet the applicable requirements.

New Schengen Entry Requirements

The European Union's new Entry/Exit System (EES) is now being implemented across the Schengen area.

When travelling to the Schengen area for a short stay, you may be required to register biometric details, including your fingerprints and a photograph.

The process may result in longer waiting times, so supporters should allow additional time for border and immigration checks when entering and leaving the Schengen area.
