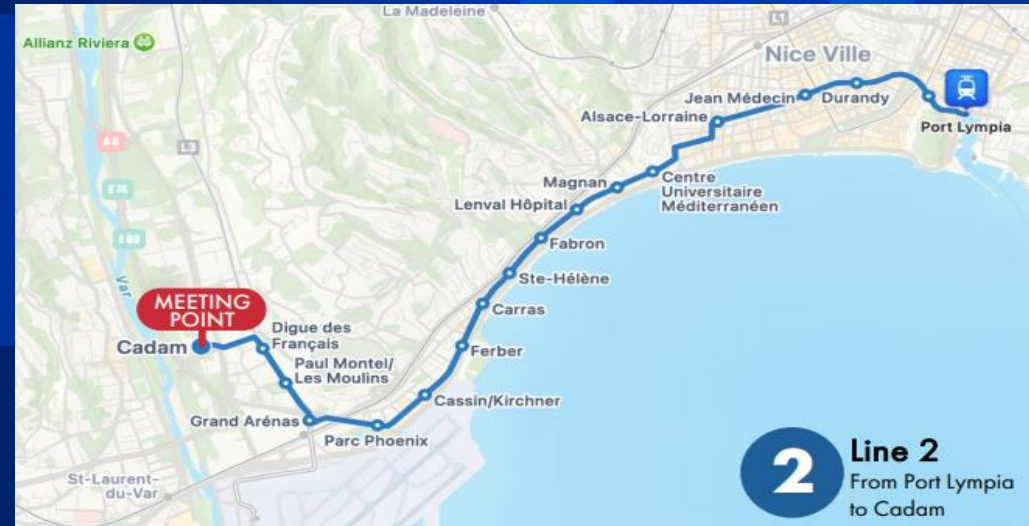

TICKETING

- All supporters who have purchased a ticket should be in possession of a voucher issued by Rangers. This process has been enforced by the local authorities in Nice.
- Please note, tickets will be distributed to all supporters who have a valid voucher.
- Reprints of the vouchers will not be issued to avoid duplication.
- This voucher will not grant you entry to the stadium and must be exchanged for a valid match ticket at the collection point, located adjacent to Palais Nikaïa (Parking Des Pins).

VOUCHER EXCHANGE AND MEETING POINT

- The ticket uplift area (Parking Des Pins), is located at Palais Nikaïa, and can be accessed using tram line 2, alighting at Cadam, which is an approximate 4-minute walk from the meeting point.
- The collection zone will open at 3:30pm and we encourage supporters to arrive as early as possible to allow for an efficient exchange process.
- Entry to the collection zone will only be permitted to supporters with a valid exchange voucher. Once you have entered, you will not be able to leave.
- Food and refreshments, including alcoholic drinks, will be available at the meeting point, with toilet facilities also provided.

HOW TO GET TO THE STADIUM

- All fans must use the mandatory coaches arranged for travel to and from the stadium. These will begin departing from the ticket collection point at Parking Des Pins from 6:30pm local time.
- After the match, our fans will be held back in the stadium, it has been indicated that this could be around 45 minutes.
- Fans will then be escorted back to the coaches for a safe return to the original meeting point. This process could take up to an hour.
- Upon arrival back at the original meeting point, there will be trams and taxis available to take supporters to the city and/or their accommodation.

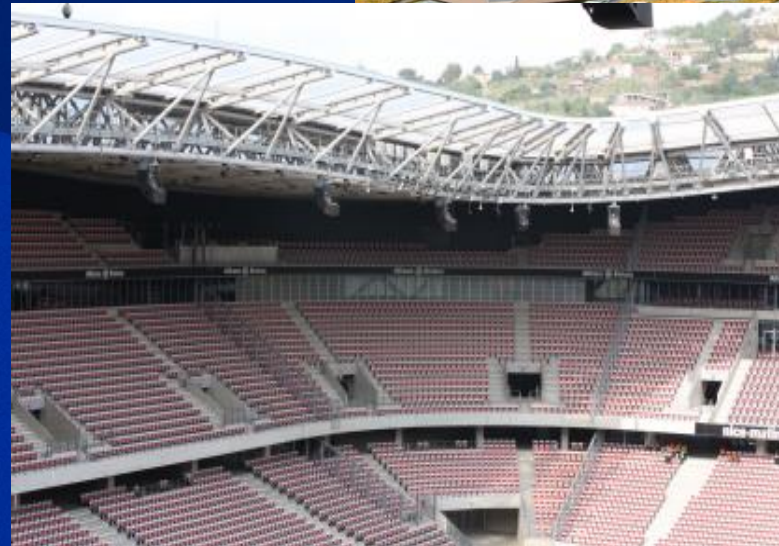

of the first shuttle bus.

Our supporters will be located in the
north-east corner of the stadium and
our section spread across 3 tiers. The
various levels are accessed by means
of dedicated lifts and stairways.



ENTRY DETAILS

- Supporters will exit the shuttle buses underneath the stadium, at which point searches will be carried out, before entering via the 2 allocated turnstiles for our section of the stadium.
- Flags and banners are permitted within the away supporters' section with no specific restriction on size, however if larger than 2m x 1m, a photo should be submitted in advance – please send this to slo@rangers.co.uk for access to be requested.
- Battery packs are permitted.
- Bags should not exceed A4 in size, larger bags will not be permitted for entry. There are very limited storage facilities available at the venue, so supporters are encouraged to bring only essential items in small bags or avoid bags altogether to avoid delays at entry.
- It is card payment only within the stadium.
- Alcohol will not be served inside the away section.




RECOMMENDED SUPPORTER AREA

- Ahead of travelling to the ticket exchange point, supporters are encouraged to enjoy the following areas; Port District, Avenue Jean Médecin, and Rue Massena.
- These areas are all popular with tourists, with plenty of bars and restaurants.
- It has been strongly advised by the local authorities, in the interest of safety, that supporters must avoid the Vieux Nice (Old Town) and Cours Saleya.

USEFUL INFORMATION

Protecting your belongings

- Pickpockets are rife in Nice, and theft of wallets, passports, mobile devices and bags is common, particularly in tourist areas and on public transport. Keep your valuables secure by using inside compartments, carrying bags across your body, keeping belongings close in public places, and avoiding distractions at ATMs and tourist sites.

Public offences

- Please avoid drinking alcohol in public places, as it is forbidden by the local Mayor.
- You must be able to prove your identity by providing documents when asked or within 4 hours at a police station. Accepted IDs are passport, photocard driving licence or any other documentation provided by a government body.
- Covering your face in public places in France is illegal. This includes balaclavas, full veils or any other garment or mask that is used to hide the face. You could get a fine of up to 150 euros if you do not comply.

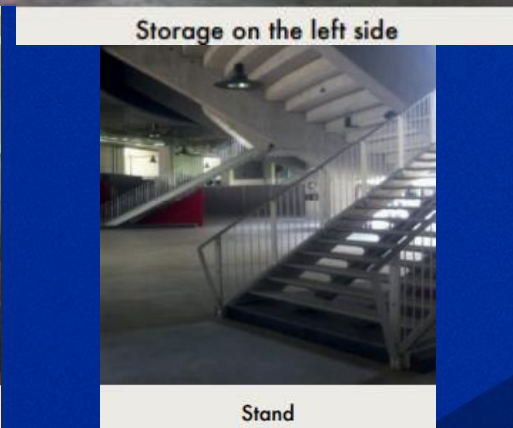
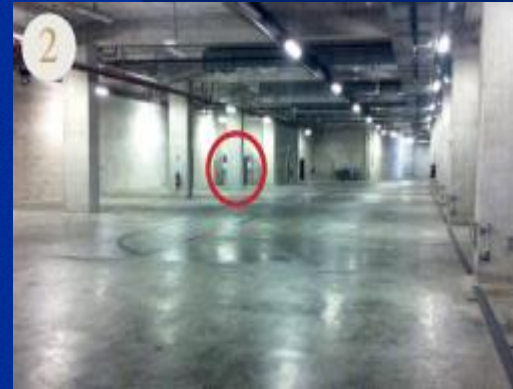
