## Getting to the Stadium

Rangers Supporters have been encouraged by Danish Police to make use of a dedicated train to take supporters to the away section. Danish Police have requested that supporters are to gather near the Old Irish Bar at approximately 15:30 (local time). Supporters will then be escorted to Copenhagen Central Station. Please note, the train is only for supporters who have purchased a ticket directly from the club for the away section and the Brøndby Police have strongly advised that only those with valid tickets will be permitted access.

The train arrives approximately 3.5km from the stadium at which point supporters will be escorted by Danish Police directly to the away section via a sterile walkway and should expect to see barriers similar to CBRN barriers used at some matches at Ibrox. This will be approximately a 40 minute walk.

After the match, there will be special trains back to Copenhagen. Police advise that supporters should not take cars or private buses to the Stadium, as there is very limited parking for away-fans.



## Accessing the Stadium



Access to the stadium will be slow as there only 2 turnstiles in operation for this fixture - there will be robust ticket checks and searches carried out by stewards and/or police on entry to the stadium and we encourage all supporters to arrive as early as possible. The gates will open 2 hours before kick-off. We are likely to be held back following the match.

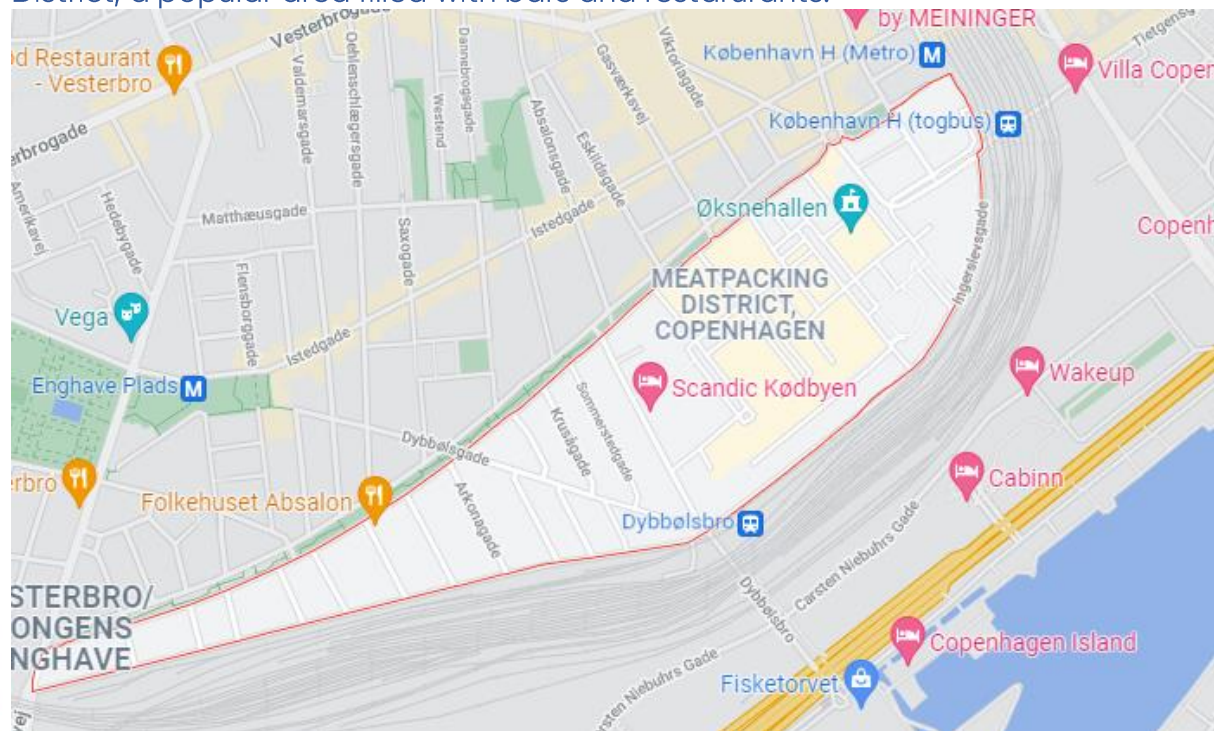
Please note that there are no available storage facilities for bags, and all flags and banners must have a fire retardancy certificate. Both cash and card will be able to be used in the stadium kiosks. The Brøndby Stadium rules have also been included at the end of this document.

### LOCAL LAWS

- As of 1 August 2018, it's illegal in Denmark to wear in a public place any clothing which conceals the face. There are exemptions allowed in Danish law, when concealing your face serves a 'worthy purpose', e.g. for health reasons. Failure to comply with this law is punishable by a fine of DKK1000 (around €135).
- Face masks at Danish airports
  - You must bring and wear a face mask on flights from Denmark.
  - You must wear a medical mask throughout terminals in Danish airports, when you enter the terminals, on board the plane, and until you exit your destination airport. The Danish health authorities recommend you change your mask every 3 to 4 hours. Children 6 and under are exempt.

# STADIUM RULES:



Stadium rules:

All visitors are obliged to present a ticket or other proof of entry at the entrance and, upon request, hand this over for further inspection. Identification may be required upon presentation upon request.

Brøndby Stadium's inspectors have the right to investigate whether guests pose a security risk due to alcohol or the influence of drugs, or whether they carry weapons or other dangerous and flammable objects. The examination can be performed as either a visitation, using technical aids or as a combination.

The following and similar items may not be brought to Brøndby Stadium:

- Narcotic substances of any kind.
- Weapons of all kinds.
- Items that can be used as weapons or projectiles.
- Spray cans with gas, corrosive or coloring substance.
- Strollers, bicycles and the like.
- Bottles, cups, mugs or cans made of materials which may break or shatter.
- Bags with a size above a normal backpack / school bag and the like. without prior agreement.
- Fireworks, rockets, Roman candles or other pyrotechnic objects.
- Confetti or other pressure pipes without prior permission.
- Mechanically driven noise instruments, such as compressor horns.
- Food and beverages, including alcoholic beverages of all kinds.
- Animals.
- Laser pen.
- Masking objects such as hats and the like. All objects that are believed to be able to be used as a mask will be assessed, and an immediate decision will be made as to whether it may be carried or not.

Documents, drawings, flags or symbols of an ideological or advertising nature and / or objects that serve commercial purposes and that can be seen by others, or have been brought for distribution among other visitors, without prior written permission from Brøndby IF.

Objects or effects, such as clothing, banners or the like, on which racist, political, criminal or other forms of insecurity are imprinted, written or otherwise visibly expressed.



It is also forbidden for guests to do the following or similar at Brøndby Stadium:

- To climb on or over buildings and facilities, including facades, fences, walls, fencing of playing fields, barriers, lighting systems, camera platforms, trees and masts of all kinds, and to enter areas where there is no access for visitors, such as the course territory.
  - To disguise themselves.
  - Throwing with objects.
  - To light fires and fire fireworks, light rockets or other pyrotechnic objects.
  - To sell goods or tickets, distribute printed matter or carry out collections without prior permission.
  - To write, paint, stick or hang something on buildings and billboards.
- To induce or openly carry signs or symbols of a racist or violent nature, or which relate to criminal circles.
- To urinate in areas other than the toilets. If this happens, one will be expelled and sentenced to a quarantine for taking up residence at the stadium for a given period.
  - To record live images or sound from any place at Brøndby Stadion or pass on information from the match regardless of procedure.
