COVID-19: In conjunction with local, state and federal recommendations and mandates, including those from the World Health Organization (WHO), Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and United States Equestrian, Lake Erie College has implemented the following guidelines and cleaning protocols, in addition to our regular stringent standards, to alleviate the potential impact of COVID-19 and to ensure that our horse shows are smooth, efficient and most importantly, safe for all involved. All employees, competitors, and visitors on property will be required to wear a mask at all times while onsite at LEC except when mounted on a horse. Please see our COVID-19 Action Plan and Notice to Competitors 2021for additional information.

ENTRIES: Entries will be accepted in the order in which they are completed online or postmarked and received. Entries will not be accepted by phone. Entries must be postmarked on the opening date or thereafter, up to, and including the closing date. Entries received after the closing date will be charged a \$25 post entry fee. Payment to Lake Erie College is due with entries. Cash, check, and credit cards accepted (credit card payments must be done online only at https://www.lec.edu/school-of-equine-studies-events/). Entries without payment will not be accepted. Stalls will be assigned first come-first served. Day stalls or single overnight stalls will be assigned only if available. Stabling may be limited. Show Committee reserves the right to limit entries, limit the classes per horse, to add, divide, or cancel classes, or make necessary changes as required by circumstances of the competition. Each entry must be signed by the rider or an adult if the rider is a minor.

STABLING: (Bedding NOT provided - shavings available for purchase). Permanent box stalls and vinyl temporary stalls with doors (minimum 10 x 10), both under roof, are \$100.00 for the weekend or \$35.00 for a day stall (no overnight), if available. Stallions, horses over 17 hands, and entries showing for the entire weekend will be given preference for permanent stalls. **Please pre-order shavings on entry form** (\$9.00 per bag if ordered with entry and \$10.00 per bag if ordered later). Horses may arrive on Thursday April 15, 2021 at 9 am. Stalls that are changed will not be cleaned between occupants. COGGINS: Certificate of negative Coggins listing horse's recorded show name (within 12 months of show date) required. Show numbers and stabling will not be issued without current Coggins.


REFUNDS: NO REFUNDS ON STABLING FEES OR OFFICE FEES. Prior to the closing date, class entry fees will be refunded. After the closing date, entry fees will only be refunded with a certificate of illness or injury prepared by an accredited veterinarian presented to the secretary before the start of the show. Entry fees are not refundable for any other reason after the show begins including in the event of cancellation of classes due to severe weather.

FORCE MAJEURE: In the event of a force majeure, this competition may be subject to cancellation. "Force Majeure" shall mean fire, earthquake, flood, snow, ice, lightning, act of God, the presence of contagious or infectious disease among humans (for example but not limited to Covid-19) or animals (for example but not limited to EHV 1/4 or strangles), work stoppages or other labor disturbances, riots or civil commotions, litigation, war or other act of foreign nation, power of government, or governmental agency or authority, or any other cause like or unlike any cause above mentioned which is beyond the control of the show management. In the event of cancellation before the show begins due to force majeure, all fees paid by competitors will be refunded.



HUNTER / EQUITATION CLASS DESCRIPTIONS

Hunter Over Fences: To be shown over approximately eight fences at the required height. To be judged on performance over the jumps and way of going.

Hunter Under Saddle: To be shown at a walk, trot and canter. Light contact with the horse's mouth is required. Martingales are not permitted.

Blue Ribbon/Red Ribbon Schooling Hunter: Horse and ponies will be judged and given a numeric score. Scores of 77-100 will earn a blue ribbon. Scores of 70-76 will earn a red ribbon. Blue/Red classes will remain open all day in front of hunter classes. There is no limit on the number of times a rider/horse combination can enter this class, time permitting. Fence heights will be set according to what is showing at the time.

HUNTER CLASS DESCRIPTIONS

Baby Green Hunter: Open to horses with limited experience that have not shown in classes where the fences exceed 3'. Fence Height 2'3'

Very Green Hunter: Open to horses and ponies in their first year of showing over fences at 2' 6''. Horses and ponies may not cross enter into any class with fences higher than 3' at the same show and may only receive points in this section for one year. Fence Height 2'6''

Green Hunter: A Green Hunter is a horse of any age in its first or second year of showing over 3' to 3'3" fences. Fences not to exceed 3'3". Horses may only compete in one height section at a show but may alternate from one show to another. Once a horse has shown 3'6", he is not eligible to compete in the Green division, regardless of age. Fence Height 3' (Section 1), 3'3" (Section 2)

Open Hunter: Open to all horses and ponies regardless of age and status. To be judged on performance and soundness. Fence Height 3'3"

Low Adult Hunter: Open to amateur riders. Cross entry between the Low Adult section and the Amateur Owner section is prohibited. Fences $2' \quad 6''$.

Low Adult Flat Equitation: Open to all riders eligible for the Low Adult Hunter section.

Adult Amateur Hunter: Horses to be ridden by amateurs. Riders may not compete in any other classes at the same competition where fences exceed 3′5″ (Equitation, Jumper classes 1.20 m and lower, Amateur Owner Hunter, Amateur Owner Jumper classes). Any rider showing in the Amateur Owner Hunter or Amateur Owner Jumper division may compete with 1 different horse in the Adult Amateur Hunter division and must own or have a USEF lease of said horse. Fences 2'9" to 3′, spreads not to exceed fence heights. Ponies may be shown by Adults, suitability to count.

Adult Amateur Flat Equitation: Open to all riders eligible for the Adult Amateur Hunter section.

Children's Hunter: To be ridden by a junior exhibitor. Riders may not cross enter into any class in which fences exceed 3′ 5″ at the same show, (Exception: Equitation classes up to 3'9", Jumper classes 1.20 m and lower, Junior Hunter sections). Fences 2'9" to 3', spreads not to exceed fence height.

Children's Flat Equitation: Open to all riders eligible for the Children's Hunter section.

Junior/Amateur Owner Hunter: Horses to be ridden by a Junior rider or an Amateur Owner, per OPHA/ WPaPHA rules. Fences 3'3".

Junior/Amateur Owner Flat Equitation: Open to all riders eligible for Junior/Amateur Owner Hunter section.

Low Children's Hunter: To be ridden by a junior exhibitor. Riders may not cross enter into any class on the same horse in which fences exceed 2'6" or in any class where fences exceed 3'3. Fence Height 2'6"

Low Children's Flat Equitation: Open to all riders eligible for the Low Children's Hunter section.

Fox Smith/NAHRA Medal – Open to Junior and Amateur riders. To be shown over a minimum of eight fences 2' 9" to 3' in height, spreads not to exceed fence height. The course may be either a hunter or jumper type and must include at least two changes of direction and a combination. Water obstacles are not permitted. A numerical score must be announced at the completion of the first round. Top four riders are required to return for further testing. There is no minimum requirement to fill the class.

Hopeful Hunter: Open to horses in their first and second year of showing with limited experience. Fence Height 18"

Low Hunter: Open to any horse rider combination. All classes will be judged on performance & soundness. Fence Height 2'9" to 3'

Short Stirrup: Open to riders 12 years of age and under. Riders may not cross enter into any other OPHA recognized section at the same show except age appropriate under saddle classes. Fences 2', oxers and in & outs not permitted.

Short Stirrup Flat Equitation: Open to all riders eligible for the Short Stirrup Hunter section.

Limit Rider: Fence Height 1'6" to 2' (oxers not permitted)

Limit Rider Flat Equitation: Open to all riders eligible for the Limit Rider Hunter section.

W/T/C Cross Rails: Open to all ages. Flower boxes and brush boxes not permitted as ground lines. Fence Height 18" cross rails

W/T/C Cross Rails Flat Equitation: Open to all riders eligible for the Limit Rider W/T/C Cross Rails Hunter section.

W/T Cross Rails: Open to all ages. Flower boxes and brush boxes not permitted as ground lines. Fence Height 18" cross rails

W/T Cross Rails Flat Equitation: Open to all riders eligible for the Limit Rider W/T Cross Rails Hunter section.

Walk Trot Canter Flat and Equitation: Open to all riders that are not competing in any jumping section.

Walk Trot Flat and Equitation: Open to all riders that are not competing in any jumping section. May not compete in any other classes.

JUMPER CLASS DESCRIPTIONS

All Jumper Classes will be held in accordance with USEF, OPHA, and Zone 5 Specifications.

Ties: All ties for first place will be called back to compete in a jump off. Ties for other than first place will be broken by the time taken in the first round.

Schooling Jumper Blue Ribbon Classes: if a rider is clear over the course, the competitor will receive a Blue Ribbon.

2'3"-2'6" Schooling Jumper: Fence Height 2'3"-2'6" 2'9"-3' Schooling Jumper: Fence Height 2'9"-3'

Beginner Jumper: Fence Height 2'3"-2'6"

Training Jumper: Fence Height 3'-3'3"

Medium Jumper: Fence Height 3'6"

Intermediate Children's / Adult Jumper: Open to junior/amateur riders. The horse/rider combination may not cross enter into any class at the same show with fences higher that 3' 3". Horse/rider combination must stay the same within a competition. Fence Height: 2'9" - 3'.

Low Children's / Adult Jumper: Open to junior or amateur riders. Fence Height 3'-3'3".

Children's / **Adult Jumper:** Open to horses and ponies. To be ridden by a Junior or Amateur exhibitor. Fence Height 3'6"

CLASS DESCRIPTIONS for the **Prix de Villes of North America**

Class 60: The Chagrin Saddlery Junior Amateur Hunter Derby: Saturday afternoon— not to start before 12:00pm



Entry Fee: \$60.00

To be ridden by Junior/Amateur riders. Open to ponies and horses. Riders will ride a traditional hunter type course which may include: banks, ditches, in and out, and bending lines. Each rider will compete at their designated height (2'3", 2'6", and 2'9") and the entire class will be pinned as one. Round 1 will be similar to a hunter classic type course. The top 10 placed in round 1 will come back to be judged in round 2. Round 2 will be a Handy Hunter type course. Ribbons will be given through 6th place. 50% of the total entry money will be divided as prize money through four places (40%, 30%, 20%, 10%).

Class 61: The Schneider Saddlery Open Performance Hunter Derby: Saturday afternoon— not to start before 1:00pm



Entry Fee: \$60.00

Riders will ride a traditional hunter type course which may include: banks, ditches, in and out, and bending lines. Each rider will compete at their designated height (3', 3'3", 3'6") and the entire class will be pinned as one. Round 1 will be similar to a hunter classic type course. The top 10 placed in round 1 will come back to be judged in round 2. Round 2 will be a Handy Hunter type course. Ribbons will be given through 6th place. 50% of the total entry money will be divided as prize money through four places (40%, 30%, 20%, 10%).

Please note: Horses cannot be entered in both Hunter Derby Classes. Riders may cross-enter on different horses.

Draw for Order of Go will be held during the Parade of Teams on Sunday at 9:00 AM.

- Class 91: Emerging Team: 2'3, 2'6 for Jump off
- Class 92: Low Team: 2'9, 3' for Jump off
- Class 93: High Team: 3'3", 3'6" for Jump off
- Open to Junior and Amateur riders.
- Each team may include only one professional rider.
- Open to any horse.
- Amateurs must present current USEF Amateur card.
- A team consists of four riders and four horses with the three best scores to count.
- A fifth horse may be used as an alternate in case of injury to a horse during the first round; alternate horse must be listed for the team prior to Saturday competition.
- In case of an injury to a rider, team goes with three riders and three horses.
- A rider may ride on more than one team; however, rider must ride a different horse.
- A horse may be ridden on one team only.
- A limited number of individual entries will be accepted. From these entries, teams of four will be formed during the draw. Odd entries may compete individually. Entries may be limited.

In Memory of Chuck Kinney

"The Charles E. Kinney, Jr. Jumper Style Award" Sponsored by Lake Erie College

The Charles E. Kinney Jumper Style Award is to be decided by the jumper judge based on the following criteria: To be presented to the jumper rider who exhibits the best classical jumper style of riding throughout the jumper classes. This award will not necessarily be given to the rider accumulating the most points in the Jumper division. Rider Sash and Heritage Trophy sponsored by Lake Erie College.

HUNTER DERBY - HAND WALKING AND SCHOOLING

Schooling in the warm up ring only for the Hunter Derby. After the course set for Hunter Derby, 15 minutes will be offered for hand walking and course walking only. Management may limit the number of schooling horses permitted in the warmup ring at one time.

ORDER OF GO

Coaches must show order of go for their teams on the entry blank. **Teams will go as drawn by representatives or a show official. Drawing will be held during the Parade of Teams.** For the first round the first rider from each team will go first, etc. The order of go for the final round will be determined by the total team faults accumulated during the first round and the team with the greatest number of faults will go first. For the second round, the number of teams may be limited to 8 teams per division, except where ties need to be broken.

AWARDS PRESENTATION

A Formal Awards ceremony will be held on Sunday afternoon following the last ride. The top 3 teams in each division are requested to participate on foot in show attire. The Charles E. Kinney Jumper Style Award will be presented during this time.

PARADE OF TEAMS

The Parade of Teams will take place prior to the start of the Prix de Villes Team Jumper competition. All teams are asked to be present on foot in full show attire. Photographs will be taken.

SCORING FOR TEAMS

USEF Table 2.2(a). Best three performances out of four to count for each team. Scores from both rounds will be totaled and the team with fewest faults will win.

TIES FOR TEAMS

In case of equality of faults for first, second, or third place, one Junior or Amateur from each team in the tie (to be chosen by coach) will compete in the jump off. If there is an equality of faults in the jump off, the rider with the best time will win. Riders for all teams in the jump off must be chosen before the first rider in the jump off begins.

INDIVIDUAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

The individual champion will be a Junior or Amateur rider who has accumulated the least number of faults in the two rounds of team competition. In case of ties for first, second, or third place, there will be a jump-off over a shortened course. In the event of equality of faults, time will be the deciding factor. If there is a rider competing for individual championship that is also chosen as the rider to break the tie for the team, the rider will only jump off once. That jump-off score will count as the individual and team score.



NOTE: Prize money will be mailed within 30 days to the person indicated on the entry form. All W-9 forms must be completed and turned into the show secretary at the show for distribution of prize money. No prize money will be paid without a W-9 form.

GENERAL SCHOOLING

Outdoor: The lighted outdoor arena will be open for lunging and flat schooling during show hours, weather permitting. The hunt field will be closed at all times.

Warm-up: Schooling in the warm up ring will be open on Thursday from 12:00pm-4:30pm with limited jumps available and in the competition ring from 7:00 – 8:00 pm after the course is set.

Competition Ring: Friday schooling in the competition ring will be from 9am-11:30am. Schooling will also be available Saturday from 6am-7:30am and Sunday from 7am-8:30am.

LUNGING

Lunging permitted in the warm-up arena during schooling and in the outdoor arena during show hours. Lunging Saturday morning will be permitted in the warm-up arena until 7:30am. Lunging Sunday morning will be permitted in the warm-up arena from 6:00am-7:00am.

ARENA AND FOOTING

Sand in both indoor warm-up (70' x 120") and main show arena (100' x 250') with separate 80' X 250' indoor warm-up arena with sand footing.

Footing preparation and consulting at Lake Erie College provided by Field Specialties, David Frey.

ARRIVING AT SHOW GROUNDS

Trucks and trailers must use the Pinecrest Road entrance. Stalls will be available on Thursday April 15, 2021 at 9 am. Before unloading your horses, please check in at the reception desk in the lobby of the Learning Center to get checked in and your temperature taken. Please wear a mask. Proof of a current negative Coggins is required for all horses arriving on the property. Daily haul in fee applies to all horses on the property without a stall.

SADDLERY AND EQUIPMENT:

According to USEF rules.

ATTIRE

Riders are required to be uniformly dressed in conservative attire of dark blue, dark green, dark gray, black, or scarlet coats (if entitled). ASTM-SEI approved helmets required for all riders.

CREDENTIALS

All exhibitors in any Amateur section must present their Amateur cards at the office before numbers will be released. No numbers will be released until proper credentials and all signatures are in order. Please make sure that your entry form is properly completed.

FOOD CONCESSION Provided by Metz Food Service

Open according to the requirements for a Level 2 show and conforming to COVID restrictions including 6 foot social distancing and wearing a mask whenever not immediately eating or drinking. Hours will be posted in the show office.

OTHER:

Management reserves the right to raise or lower fences, and to cancel or combine classes as competition warrants. In some classes the area of the courtesy circle may be restricted by a mandatory line. This line will be indicated on the course diagram, and a corresponding barrier will be erected in the ring. All under saddle classes are to be shown at the walk, trot, and canter both ways of the ring. Light contact with the horse's mouth is required.

- ASTM/SEI approved headgear required for all riders and must be worn while mounted
- Lake Erie College and its employees will not be held responsible for loss or damage to persons, property, or horse
- Smoking in designated areas only. No Smoking in any buildings or stables
- All dogs must be leashed. Dogs are not allowed in the Learning Center, with the exception of credentialed service animals. (Dog not on leash will be fined \$50)
- Competition management may fine any individuals including trainers, owners, exhibitors, or their agents up to \$100 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments
- Sharps disposal containers are available in the following locations:
 wash rack in the boarder barn, temp stall area by south door
 (door facing arena), in the middle isle of the school barn outside wash racks.

NOTICE TO COMPETITORS 2021



Lake Erie College is committed to providing a safe and fun experience for our horse show competitors. Please be sure to read our complete **COVID19 ACTION PLAN**. In addition to items mentioned in the **COVID19 ACTION PLAN**, be aware of the following:

All employees, competitors, and visitors on property will be required to wear a mask, properly covering your nose and mouth, at all times while on the show grounds except when mounted on a horse. NO EXCEPTIONS.

Each exhibitor is permitted to bring one groom or assistant per entry. Youth exhibitors may have two grooms or assistants. Additional spectators or helpers are not permitted.

General spectators are not permitted on the show grounds.

No eating or drinking is permitted in the lobbies, schooling areas or arenas. Masks must be worn at all times.

Exhibitors are welcome on the show grounds during their schooling and show times. Exhibitors are asked to wait in their cars when not needed in the barns or show rings. During adverse weather conditions, exhibitors should leave the show grounds or shelter in their cars. Waiting or loitering in the Learning Center, arenas or schooling areas is not permitted.

Only one exhibitor at a time will be allowed to approach the Show Office in the Learning Center. Please observe careful 6 foot minimum distancing. Ribbons and awards will be made available in the Learning Center or Show Office. Ribbons and awards will not be mailed out after the show.

Management may employ additional safety measures or change show rules without notice. Your cooperation is expected and appreciated.

PLAN OVERVIEW

USEF has developed a comprehensive approach to returning to competition with appropriate COVID-19 protocols. We have used these guidelines as the basis for our plan. In addition, we have utilized the WHO Risk Aassessment to measure the effectiveness of our planning efforts. Personal Protective Equipment

All employees, competitors, and visitors on property will be <u>required to wear a</u> <u>mask at all times</u> while onsite at LEC except when mounted on a horse.

In accordance with CDC recommendations, it is strongly recommended that a mask be worn anytime a person is outside their home. In accordance with the Ohio Department of Health guidelines, face shields are not permissible. Face masks are required and considered more effective in preventing the spread of viruses.

SCREENING & MONITORING

A temperature check is mandatory for everyone prior to admission to the show and temperatures are taken at the main entrance.

A wristband will be given to each person following the temperature check to show that their temperature has been taken. No one will be allowed to work if any symptoms or fevers exist.

If you are not feeling well or have any symptoms of illness, please stay home!

Entry Process

As practically as possible, we are creating a touchless process for operations that will become our "new normal" as it best protects you. To reduce the risk of COVID-19, we will rely on paperless entry forms, releases, and methods of payment. Forms must be submitted prior to arrival on the showgrounds. Once all forms are received and processed, you will be assigned a competitor number that can be used to enter the event.

All stabling registration must be done digitally through the stabling request at www.horseshowoffice.com. Horses must have confirmed stabling prior to arrival. all ship-ins must have pre-entered to show or be on the showgrounds.

Horse Show Office

Although the show office will be staffed and extra social distancing will allow for in- person communication without personal contact, there should be little need to enter the office.

Masks are required to enter the building.

Arenas

Only 5 horses and 10 people will be permitted in the main warmup ring at one time. Only 8 horses and 16 people will be permitted in the Inspiration Arena at one time. All people must practice social distancing.

Additional hand sanitizer stations will be placed around in-gates and in the barns.

All spectator areas will either be closed or set up to comply with social distancing requirements.

The judge's booth(s) will be set up to comply with social distancing requirements.

All arenas will have monitors to enforce the guidelines with the authority to eliminate schooling privileges for those who do not follow the rules on Lake Erie College showgrounds and property.



Stabling

Social distancing will be enforced in the stabling area. Stabling areas will be strictly limited to essential personnel during limited operations. Only competitors and essential staff will be allowed in born areas. Hand senitating stations will be placed at each barn. We ask that competitors regularly sanitize all hard surfaces and equipment including: tack, grooming, feeding, stall cleaning materials, etc.

Masks are mandatory in all barn areas.

BATHROOMS & PUBLIC SPACES

Commonly-touched surfaces like door handles are sanitized frequently during hours of operation. Hand sanitizing stations have been placed throughout the property. All medical personnel at the facility will wear protective gear as required by federal, state and local regulations. Signage with safety guidelines is posted throughout the property as reminders for practicing social distancing and hand sanitizing.

RESPONSE TO POTENTIAL EXPOSURE

If a participant displays symptoms or otherwise indicates high risk for possible infection, he/she will not be allowed to access the facility and participate in the show. Once identified, we will engage local medical/public health staff to perform contact tracing and enhance evaluation of confirmed contact, per CDC guidelines, so we can quickly mitigate any concerns of spread.
