DAY 1 | DUBLIN TO BALLINTOY

We head north to explore **Belfast** and its political murals on a Black Cab Tour. Then on to '**The Dark Hedges**' seen in **Game of Thrones** as the Kingsroad. We'll spend the night in Ballintoy, where you have the chance to cross the Atlantic over the Carrick-a-Rede Rope Bridge.

DAY 2 | BALLINTOY TO DERRY

Follow in the footsteps of giants on the eighth natural wonder of the world, the **Giant's Causeway**. Created by giant or geology, you decide! We overnight in the **medieval city of Derry** where you get face-to-face with its troubled history, both past and present on an award-winning walking tour. (B)

DAY 3 | DERRY TO GALWAY

We cross back into the Republic to explore **the wild and rugged mountains of Connemara** before stopping for lunch in the charming town of **Westport**. Vibrant **Galway, Ireland's cultural capital** with its many pubs and live music is our home for the night. (B)

DAY 4 | INIS MÓR

Travel back in time as **we cross the Atlantic to Inis Mór**, the biggest of the Aran Islands. Hire a bike or a horse and cart and spend the day exploring this ancient, Gaelic-speaking island. A truly unique experience! (B)

DAY 5 | GALWAY TO ENNIS

We make our way through the **lunar landscape of the Burren** and on to the **Cliffs of Moher**, rising hundreds of feet over the Atlantic Ocean. We stay overnight in Ennis, where the pubs are filled with locals playing Irish music. (B)

DAY 6 | ENNIS TO KILLARNEY

We take the **stunning Sleah Head** drive down to the **dramatic Dingle Peninsula**, full of breathtaking scenery and fresh Irish air. Hear about the adventures of warriors and heroes before we make our way to the **party town of Killarney**. (B)

DAY 7 | KILLARNEY TO DUBLIN

We enter the rebel County of Cork and head to Blarney Castle. It's time to get the 'gift of the gab' and kiss the famous stone! Take in the ancient seat of Kings of Munster, the **Rock of Cashel** before we arrive back to Dublin. (B)
