About Number Partners

Number Partners is a national volunteering programme designed to support young people in primary schools across the country with their number and financial literacy skills. Volunteers visit primary schools to play number games with students, making maths fun, improving their skills with numbers and boosting their confidence.

Volunteer Role

Volunteers are responsible for supporting two students each week over the period of a term. The volunteer visits the school at lunchtime to play specially designed numeracy board games with children needing support with their maths. Volunteers are not expected to perform a supervisory role within the classroom.

Experience and Skills

An enthusiasm to support young people. Number Partners is an opportunity to develop your own communication and interpersonal skills including influencing and patience.



Time Commitment

Half an hour once per week or once per fortnight during term time.

Training

There are two parts to the Number Partners training:

1. An introductory workshops to working in schools (approximately 2 hours, delivered by STEM)
2. A self guided e-training module on the specifics of Number Partners (approximately 1 hour at your desk)

DBS Requirements

A DBS (Disclosure and Barring Service) check will be carried out as part of the STEM registration and training.
