

CRITERIA FOR INDUCTION INTO THE VICTORIAN GOLF INDUSTRY HALL OF FAME

1. The primary requirement for selection as a Member is high level achievement from personal effort or initiative, in a field of endeavour that contributes to the performances of professional or amateur players, the development of facilities and clubs or to the development and status of the golf industry in Victoria.
2. Nominees should have made a major contribution, either past or present at the international, national or Club level to the game of golf generally.
3. Nominees should have made a major contribution to the Victorian golf industry in one of the following categories.
 - Golf administration /Club management
 - Golf coaching / training
 - Golf course development / maintenance
 - Golf media / history
 - Volunteer
 - Tournament play/promotion

Nominees may be involved in other areas, but their achievements must satisfy the criterion detailed in 1 above.

4. Mere long term service or involvement within the golf industry by a Nominee without having satisfied the paramount requirement in clause 1 or demonstrated outstanding achievement arising from personal initiative or innovation is not sufficient justification for selection.
5. Only in exceptional circumstances will there be more than one person annually inducted as a Member. In the initial year the Industry may decide to appoint more than one inductee to Member of the Hall of Fame.
6. Nominations are to be submitted annually. Any nomination which has been previously submitted, but not selected may be reconsidered by the Committee.
7. Nominations for consideration by the Selection Committee may be made by any person or organisation.

The Selection Committee will comprise one (1) representative of Board/Committee and the Executive Officer of each participating organisation.

8. The Selection Committee reserves the right to seek endorsement of any nomination by the appropriate peak organisation(s) in Australia, responsible for the sport or field of endeavour in which achievements have been attributed to the Nominee.
9. The endorsement of any nomination by the appropriate peak organisation is highly desirable, but its absence will not necessarily debar the Nominee from selection.
10. The Selection Committee will be the arbiter in respect to the selection or otherwise of any Nominee, subject always to final ratification of each Board/Committee.
