President's Report

The One Golf management model operated in Victoria for its first complete year in 2019.

Most of Golf Victoria's staff transferred their employment to Golf Australia in October 2018 and from that time, and throughout 2019, Golf Australia has been delivering the services Golf Victoria's members previously received from Golf Victoria's former staff.

When Golf Victoria joined One Golf, Golf Australia promised Golf Victoria that its members would receive services to the standard and extent they had enjoyed before that time, and the Golf Victoria board's focus during the year was to ensure the fulfillment of that promise.

Many challenges have arisen during the One Golf transition, and some still remain, due in large part to the unexpected and significant operating loss reported by Golf Australia last November which could well have a negative impact on Golf Australia's operating plans and flexibilities over the next few years unless steps are taken to restructure Golf Australia's operating structure to achieve more efficiencies and there is more prudent financial management. Golf Australia has assured all of the State golfing associations including Golf Victoria that the necessary steps have been taken to improve its financial management and that it will provide regular and effective communication in relation to its future operating performance.

These challenges, however, have not affected the provision of required services to Victorian golf clubs and districts, the delivery of competitions and events for the enjoyment of Victorian golfers (within Victoria's busy golfing schedule) or the continuing pursuit of important participation programmes for growing the game.

The Review of Operations contained in this year's Annual Report provides details of all of the key events and important activities conducted successfully in Victoria in the 2019 calendar year.

For the achievement of these noteworthy outcomes in 2019, I thank Victorian clubs for their generosity during the year in hosting and supporting our golfing events, our volunteers who worked tirelessly, and with great passion, to further the interests of the game in Victoria, and the staff of Golf Australia, and in particular the Victorian team so ably led by Therese Magdulski, who have carried out their responsibilities to support Victorian golf

clubs and golfers with great commitment and dedication.

Golf Victoria's congratulations are extended to all winners of our State individual and team events during the year, including the outstanding achievements of Grace Kim (Avondale Golf Club) and Andre Lautee (Kingston Heath Golf Club) in taking out in 2019 the Victorian Women's Amateur Championship and Victorian Men's Amateur Championship, respectively.

In reporting on the 2019 calendar year, it is very appropriate to record that the necessary approvals and funding commitments for the Australian Golf Centre Project at Sandringham Golf Links were able to be progressed to enable the project's implementation.

This project, because it will provide, amongst other important features, a state-of-the-art building to house Golf Australia, PGA of Australia and Golf Victoria within the heart of the Sandbelt, has the capacity to change the face of Australian golf as this shared home should drive greater collaboration and improved operating performance and efficiencies for their respective operations.

The three golfing bodies (Golf Victoria, Golf Australia and PGA of Australia) have been developing this concept since 2010, and with the unwavering and generous support

of the Victorian Government, which has committed \$15.3 million of the \$18.8 million required for the project's completion, the golfing bodies' concept is shortly to become a reality.

Each of the golfing bodies has agreed to contribute \$837,000 (plus GST) towards meeting the costs of the project.

It is important to note the role also being played by Sandringham Golf Links Pty Ltd (SGL) in the delivery of the project. SGL is a wholly-owned subsidiary of The Royal Melbourne Golf Club (RMGC).

SGL has been leasing Sandringham Golf Links from the Bayside Council for several years and, on the terms of the lease, operates the golf course.

SGL is committing \$500,000 (plus GST) towards the project's costs, and because of its relationship with RMGC, the RMGC course staff (led by its Director of Courses) have been available to undertake the course works mentioned below and, once the project is completed, they will also maintain the golf course and all related practice facilities.

The features of the Australian Golf Centre Project are:

(a) the development and construction of a new two-storey building comprising:

(i) offices (for Golf Australia, PGA of Australia, Golf Victoria and Sandringham Golf Links Management Pty Ltd), lecture theatre, meeting rooms, education spaces and storage facilities;

(ii) a golf service centre (to be operated by PGA of Australia);

(iii) a new public café (to be operated by Sandringham Golf Links Management Pty Ltd);

(iv) display areas for exhibiting and displaying photographs and books, historical and heritage items and memorabilia; and

(v) indoor training, exercise and rehabilitation facilities.

(b) the improvement, upgrading and modernising of the Sandringham golf course;

(c) the development and construction of driving range facilities and short game practice areas for private and public use;

(d) the design, construction and installation of water storage and irrigation and pumping facilities for the golf course; and

(e) the upgrading and enlargement of the golf course car parking facilities.

To provide long term tenure, SGL (with Bayside Council consent) will be sub-leasing the Australian Golf Centre building and other project areas to Golf Victoria which is the recipient of the State's funding commitment and the principal under the main project contracts.

In addition to the critical benefit of housing our National and State golfing bodies in the one place, it is apparent from the features referred to above that, once completed, the project will provide:

(1) practice facilities of excellence for all players to develop their skills, as well as for skilled players to have access to indoor and outdoor high performance training facilities; and

(2) outstanding facilities for growing participation in the sport and usage of the golf course by players of diverse age, skill, background and physical ability.

All of this is a very exciting development for our sport both locally and nationally.

In concluding my report, may I express my gratitude to each of my fellow Golf Victoria directors for their support during the year and, more importantly, for all they do to further the interests of Victorian golf clubs and golfers.

REVIEW OF OPERATIONS

Vic Open

The 2019 ISPS Handa Vic Open returned to the Greater Geelong region from February 7 – 10, with 13th Beach Golf Links hosting the biggest staging of the tournament in its storied history.

The ISPS Handa Vic Open is the first professional tournament of its kind in the world in which men and women tee it up on the same courses at the same time for equal prize money.

Following ongoing and increased support from the Victorian Government, the City of Greater Geelong, the Transport Accident Commission and new naming rights sponsor ISPS Handa, the combined prize pool ballooned to an incredible \$3 million, increasing ten-fold since the tournament moved to its home in Barwon Heads in 2013.

Barwon Heads welcomed the European Tour (men) and LPGA Tour (women) for



the first time in 2019 as co-sanctioning partners.

They joined Australia's top talent from the ISPS Handa PGA Tour of Australasia and ALPG, ensuring the strongest men's and women's fields in the tournament's history.

The event was broadcast live on the ABC and simulcast on Fox Sports throughout the week, with 16 hours of play showcased across Australia and around the world.

The women's championship was won by France's Celine Boutier, securing her first win on the LPGA Tour with an eight-under-par total of 281. The former world No.1 amateur finished two shots clear of Australian duo Sarah Kemp and Su Oh and England's Charlotte Thomas, all tied on 283.

The men's championship was won by Scotland's David Law, who eagled the final hole for a four-round total of 270 (18-under par), by one shot from Australians Brad Kennedy and Wade Ormsby.

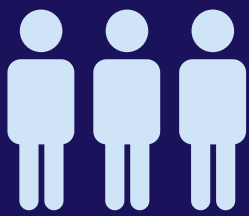

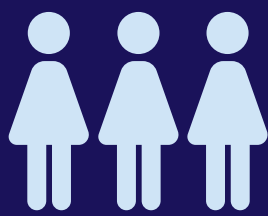
Membership

84,041

Total membership numbers for men for 2018 were 84,799, therefore 2019 saw a decrease of 758 over the previous year.



21,733
WOMEN

Total membership numbers for women for 2018 were 22,436, therefore 2019 saw a decrease of 703 over the previous year.

A significant proportion of the reduction in membership arose because of the decision of Rich River Golf Club to affiliate with Golf NSW.

District Associations & Affiliated Clubs



AFFILIATED GOLF CLUBS WITHIN VIC

As of 2019, there were 412 affiliated golf clubs within Victoria including 266 country clubs. Baker, Goose Gully and Quambatook Golf Clubs all went into recess in 2019, while (as noted above) Rich River Golf Club decided to affiliate with Golf NSW. Club Mandalay and Gunnamatta both changed their membership category from the Victorian Golf League to Member Clubs and Affiliate Clubs respectively.

All 15 men's and women's District Golf Associations were amalgamated by the end of 2019.

In Memoriam

Sadly 2019 saw the passing of four significant contributors to Victorian golf.

COLIN PHILLIPS OAM

Victorian Hall of Fame member Colin Phillips OAM passed away in July 2019. He will be most remembered for his great work as head of the Australian Golf Union from 1979 to 2005. The AGU, along with Women's Golf Australia, was the forerunner of what is now Golf Australia. Colin's role as head of the AGU was performed with distinction and in serving Australian golf he was able all the while to build Australia's international reputation with his work for the R&A and the fledgling Asia Pacific Golf Confederation.

JOHN SCRIVENER

Long serving Victorian Golf Association Council Member John Scrivener passed away in May 2019. John was elected to

the VGA Council in 1989 and served for 20 years. He made a significant contribution to Victorian golf during his period of VGA service, particularly in the events program of the VGA; senior golf events; junior golf events and development activities including the Victorian Open. While at the VGA, John sat on various committees including finance; rules of golf; handicaps and assessment of courses including the role of the Chairman of Regulations from 2005 to 2009.

KATE NOLAN

In September 2019, we lost Kate Nolan (nee McIntosh). As an amateur, Kate was part of Australia's 1996 and 1998 World Cup teams. The latter year was arguably her strongest season, during which she won both the Australian and Victorian 72-hole Stroke Play Championships.

KEN DOUGLAS

In September 2019 Ken Douglas passed away. Ken was a VGA Council Member from 1985-1988 and during that period he served on the VGA's Rules, Handicapping & Course Rating, Planning & Development and Magazine Sub-Committees. He was also a past President of Rosanna Golf Club.

Golf Victoria Magazine

The June/July 2019 edition of the Golf Victoria Magazine was the final print version of the magazine after nearly 60 - years of the publication.

The magazine had a wonderful history of telling the story behind the story. However, with One Golf's introduction and the need for both a national and local focus across the country 2019 was an appropriate time to improve the value for clubs with respect to the magazine's reach, efficiencies and modernising our delivery methods taking the opportunity to review and plan our best to communicate with clubs and golfers so that high-quality content synonymous with the magazine can be provided in the future. Victorian Golf Industry Awards

The Arts Centre Melbourne hosted 295 people from the Victorian Golf Industry in August where all organisations involved in golf in Victoria (Golf Victoria, Golf Australia, Golf Management Victoria and the PGA of Australia) came together to celebrate the achievements of the people and clubs within the Victorian Golf Industry.

The Inclusion Award was won by Ballarat Golf Club for its role in facilitating the conduct of golf clinics for amputees and for hosting the Aboriginal and Torres Strait

Islander National Championships.

Trentham Golf Club took out the Golf Club of the Year Award for its efforts in implementing several environmental and sustainability programmes to maintain great course conditions all year round.

The Volunteer of the Year Award was won by Annie Beveridge, captain of the Goulburn Murray Golf Association. Annie was on the working party that led the negotiations to amalgamate the Goulburn Valley Ladies and Men's Districts to form the Goulburn Murray Golf Association. She also pushed for the introduction of a weekend women's pennant competition in the district in 2018/19 and successfully ran a winter and summer programme that allowed working women to participate in weekend Pennant for the first time in the district's history. She was also instrumental

in implementing the online tournament system - GolfBox - for district events.

The Female Amateur Player of the Year Award went to Stephanie Bunque from Victoria Golf Club for the second year in a row, while Zach Murray, from Commonwealth Golf Club took out the Male Amateur Player of the Year Award following stellar results that included captaining the State Team to victory at the Interstate Series and then winning the WA Open on the ISPS HANDA PGA Tour of Australasia.

Three new Members were inducted into the Victorian Golf Industry Hall of Fame - Paul Rak OAM, Michael Wolveridge and John Stamp.

Damian Willcox was recognised for his service to the game for 25 years as a Rules Referee.

Championships & Events

Victoria continued in 2019 to conduct an array of events for golfers of all ages, abilities and in geographic locations, with Andre Lautee (Kingston Heath) and Grace Kim (Avondale, NSW) taking out the coveted 2019 Victorian Men's and Women's Amateur Championships.

A significant change to the Victorian events schedule saw the Men's and Women's Victorian Senior Amateur Championships played concurrently on the same course at the same time. The event attracted a full field of 200 players and provided an opportunity to showcase our game, nurture an inclusive environment for all and promote event participation for more women. Jacqui Morgan (Monash, NSW) took out the women's title, while Barry Tippet (Barwon Heads) won the men's.

In Victoria's premier junior events, Matthew Lever (The National) and Min A Yoon (Korea) won the Victorian Junior Masters. The Junior Vic Open titles both headed to Queensland, with the girl's title won by Cassie Porter, and the boy's by Lincoln Morgan. The National's Nathan Page and Concord's (NSW) Sophie Yip won the Boys' and Girls' Championships of Victoria respectively.

In our premier teams competitions, Huntingdale Golf Club won the Victorian Women's Division 1 Pennant Competition, while The Royal Melbourne Golf Club took home the Victorian Men's Division 1 Pennant Flag. In the Country Teams Matches, Murray Darling and Golf Peninsula Vic won the men's and women's Division 1 titles respectively.

The traditional Club President's and Captain's Golf Day was combined with the Women's Committee Golf Day, with over 140 club officials participating in the revised structure.

In further event changes to showcase our game, women were also involved in two Victorian representative teams – the annual Victoria versus Australian Defence Forces Match; and the Victoria versus South Australia Country Teams Match.

Overall, in 2019 Golf Australia was involved in the conduct of just under 200 Victorian events, across nearly 300 days of competition.

REVIEW OF OPERATIONS Development

Technical Services

2019 saw the introduction of the new Rules of golf. Numerous two-day Level 2 rules accreditation courses targeting key golf club personnel including golf operations staff, club captains, PGA members and match committee members were conducted.

The courses covered various topics including the Rules of golf, course set up and competition conditions.

Individual club rules nights were replaced by encouraging clubs to direct individuals to the Rules resources on the Golf Australia website to allow them to learn the Rules of golf in their own time and in the comfort of their own home.

The Tournament Officials program was initiated in 2019. The programme involves the selection of particular individuals to act as referees for specified events who will assist Golf Australia staff with the future conduct of the relevant events.

REVIEW OF OPERATIONS High Performance

There were a number of changes to the High Performance landscape in Victoria in 2019, as well as some excellent results from teams and individuals

Dean Kinney took up the role of Head Coach with the Victorian Institute of Sport working with athletes involved in the High Performance pathway in Victoria, predominantly the professional and amateur VIS scholarship holders.

On the interstate teams competitions front, Victoria again tasted success nationally with our girls' team winning the Australian Girls' Interstate Teams Matches title and our men winning the Australian Men's Interstate Teams Matches. This was a great outcome for all players involved in these Victorian teams.

Individually Andre Lautee defended his Victorian Amateur title, this time at his home course of Kingston Heath. David Micheluzzi reached #2 on the World Amateur Golf Rankings with the highlight being reaching the semi-finals of the Amateur Championship in the United Kingdom. Stephanie Bunque and Kono Matsumoto had success in South Australia – Bunque winning the Rene Erichsen

Salver and Matsumoto the SA Amateur Championship.

By far the greatest achievements of Victorian golfers in 2019 were by Gabi Ruffels and Lukas Michel, who both won premier USGA titles. Gabi won the 2019 US Women's Amateur – arguably the biggest prize in women's amateur golf and in doing so became the first Australian to achieve this feat. In a year of firsts, Lukas Michel became the first Australian to win the US Mid-Amateur Championship (players aged under 25), with both titles offering tournament starts in professional majors in 2020.

A number of players turned professional at the end of 2019, with Blake Collyer, Kyle Michel, David Micheluzzi and Matias Sanchez some of the more decorated amateurs from Victoria in recent years making the decision to test themselves at the professional level. Golf Victoria is very thankful for the sponsors of High Performance golf in Victoria, particularly the Victorian Institute of Sport and Titleist/Footjoy.

Game Development

In 2019 the Victorian Development Staff and the Regional Development Officers combined their activities becoming one team, the Victorian Development Team. This step provided improved cohesion between the “administration” and the “delivery” of development programmes such as MyGolf, Get into Golf, Sporting Schools, Primary and Secondary School Championships and the Community Instructor Programmes.

The Victorian MyGolf Programme continues to grow with 139 MyGolf centres operating in 2019 which saw 6,786 girls and boys attend programmes.

Development

Club Support

While a significant part of the role of the Victorian Development Team is to recruit and encourage new participants to the sport via the current participation programmes, a large part of the team's focus is to assist Victorian clubs, districts and facilities.

A snapshot of the Victorian Development Team's deliverables to Victorian clubs, districts and facilities includes providing club support services such as: strategic planning, constitution reform, funding opportunities and grants, financial templates, risk management evaluation, building club operational policies and procedures, providing roles and responsibility templates for key staff, committee positions and volunteers, insurance, club health checks, and facility audits.

Vision 2025

A priority in 2019 was to develop a structured programme to increase the number of women and girls in the game through the Vision 2025 “Even Par” programme, and to provide assistance to clubs in understanding and meeting the requirements of State and Commonwealth equal opportunity legislation.

There were in 2019, 20 Victorian Vision 2025 roadshows with 161 clubs or districts represented by 447 attendees, in addition to 12 pilot Even Par workshops.

Examples of how Victorian clubs engaged with the Vision 2025 strategies in 2019 are highlighted by steps taken at Kew Golf Club and Strathmerton Golf Club, respectively.

Following the lead of other Victorian golf clubs in the conduct of their championships, Kew Golf Club ran its first multi-day club championship (A, B and C grade) in October 2019. The format comprised two weeks of qualifying rounds where women could participate on a weekday or weekend, followed by match play finals conducted over two weekends. The finals for all three grades were played in conjunction with the men's club championship final round. The club was extremely excited to make the final day a totally inclusive club event and engage with all playing groups (men, women and juniors).

In 2018, Strathmerton Golf Club operated separate men's and women's clubs. They soon however, became aware of the benefits of amalgamating their committees. The amalgamation of the two committees was somewhat of a natural progression with the men struggling to attract a secretary, so one of the women stepped in and from there it was common sense to amalgamate and share resources. The benefits have included: shared responsibilities and resources, learning from each other, a louder club voice which has already been successful in obtaining grants, stronger competitions as they are open to both men and women, and a greater capacity to concentrate on new initiatives such as attracting more juniors and beginners to the game to further grow the club.

Development

Inclusion

In addition to Golf Australia's expanding All Abilities programme, 2019 saw the games reach expand into diverse, newly arrived and disadvantaged communities around Victoria.

Sabrin Nyawela started as an Inclusion Officer in February 2019 leading Victoria's 'Growing Participation in Sport' Freestyle Golf project funded by VicHealth. Partnerships have been formed with non-profit organisations such as Reclink Australia who provide opportunities for social engagement through sport and recreation for people experiencing disadvantage. Freestyle Golf has since engaged with 9 local councils and reached over 500 participants.

Research carried out by Sport Business Partners (SBP) showed that large communities want to get involved with golf but do not particularly know where to start.

1. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial report preparation requirement of the Corporations Act 2001. The directors have determined that the company is not a reporting entity. The financial report is for entity Golf Victoria as an individual entity. Golf Victoria is a company limited by guarantee, incorporated and domiciled in Australia.

The financial report has been prepared in accordance with requirements of the Corporations Act 2001, and the following applicable Accounting Standards:

Framework for the Preparation and Presentation of Financial Statements

AASB 107: Cash Flow Statement

AASB 110: Events after the Balance Sheet Date

AASB 116: Property, Plant and Equipment

AASB 1058: Income of Not-for-Profit Entities

AASB 1031: Materiality

No other applicable Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Interpretations or other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board have been applied.

The report is also prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following specific accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this report:

a) Property, Plant and Equipment: Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair value less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation. Plant and Equipment - Plant and equipment are measured on the cost basis. Depreciation - All assets, excluding freehold land and buildings, are depreciated on a straight line basis over their useful lives to the company.

b) Investments: Non-current investments are measured on the cost basis. The carrying amount of investments is reviewed annually by the directors to ensure it is not in excess of the recoverable amount of these investments. The recoverable amount is assessed from the quoted market value for shares in listed companies or the underlying net assets for other non-listed corporations. The expected net cash flows from investments have not been discounted to their present value in determining the recoverable amounts.

c) Cash: For the purposes of the Statement of Cash Flows, cash includes cash on hand and at call deposits with banks or financial

institutions, investments in money market instruments maturing within less than two months and net bank overdrafts.

d) Revenue: Interest revenue is recognised on a proportional basis taking into account the interest rates applicable to the financial assets. All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

e) Goods and Services Tax (GST): Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office. In these circumstances the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the assets or as part of an item of expense. Receivables and payables in the Statement of Financial Position are shown inclusive of GST.

f) Financial Instruments: Financial assets and liabilities are recognised when Golf Victoria becomes a party to the contractual provisions of the instrument. For financial assets, this is equivalent to the date that Golf Victoria commits itself to either purchase or sell the assets. Financial instruments are initially measured at fair value plus transaction costs. Where the instrument is not classified “at fair value through profit and loss” transaction costs have been expensed immediately. Financial instruments are subsequently measured at either fair value, amortized using the effective interest rate method cost. Fair value represents the amount for which an asset could be exchanged or a liability settled, between knowledgeable, willing parties. Where available, quoted prices in an active market are used to determine fair value. In other circumstances other valuation techniques are adopted.

2 (a) AUSTRALIAN GOLF CENTRE PROJECT - GRANT REVENUE

Following the 2014 State Government Election commitment to provide \$10.0m to fund the construction of a National Home of Golf facility, Golf Victoria Ltd (GV), Golf Australia Ltd (GA), Sandringham Golf Links Management Pty Ltd (SGLM) and the Professional Golfers Association of Australia (PGA) developed a joint project proposal to

develop the Sandringham Golf Course as the Australian Golf Centre. As part of the process the parties entered a Heads of Agreement relating to the project which considers the commitments of all parties with regards to the project. GA, GV and the PGA have committed funding to the project and are integral to the successful completion of the project. As a result, a Letter of Intent was signed by both GA and PGA outlining their respective financial commitments to the project.

Funding agreements signed between the State Government and GV, will see GV receive total government grant funding of \$15,300,000. GV has already received \$5,703,334 over the last five years in grants from the State Government, with a further \$9,596,666 to be received over the next two years.

In accordance with AASB 1058, GV has recognised the grant revenue as it satisfies its obligations under the grant agreements, being incurred during the construction of the asset. In 2019, \$2,969,008 has been reported in grant revenue and in 2018, \$1,454,608. The balance of the grant revenue not yet spent in the development of the asset of \$1,279,718 is recognised in the Balance Sheet as a Deferred Income Liability and will be brought to account over the next two years - see Note 8a).

2 (b) AUSTRALIAN GOLF CENTRE PROJECT - INTEREST

In 2019, according to the requirements of the project funding agreement with the State Government, GV approved that interest earned on cash received in advance is to be spent on the construction of the asset. An adjustment from Interest Income of \$40,687 has been made to deferred income accordingly. For the period of the project to date \$77,153 of Interest has been received and accounts for the balance of the deferred income - see Note 8a).

1. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial report preparation requirements of the Trust Deed to prepare a financial report. The trustees have determined that the trust is not a reporting entity.

As the trustees have determined that the trust is not a reporting entity there is no requirement to apply applicable Accounting Standards or other authorising pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board in the preparation and presentation of these financial statements.

The financial report is also prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following specific accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been

adopted in the preparation of this financial report:

(a) Income Tax: No provision for income tax has been raised as the trust is exempt from income tax under Division 50 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

(b) Investments: Non-current investments are measured on the cost basis and re-valued according to market value at balance date.

(c) Cash: Cash includes cash on hand and at banks including at call deposits with banks.

(d) Trust liabilities and right of Indemnity: The company acts as trustee of a trust and liabilities have been incurred on behalf of that trust in the company's capacity as corporate trustee. Liabilities incurred on behalf of the trust are not recognised in the financial statements when it is not probable that the company will have to meet any of those trust liabilities from its own resources. When it is probable that the company will have to meet some trust liabilities a liability for the Deficiency in Trust Right of Indemnity is brought to account. Details of the trust liabilities, the offsetting right of indemnity, and any deficiency in the right of indemnity are disclosed by way of note to the financial statements.

(e) Goods and Services Tax (GST): Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office. In these circumstances the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the assets or as part of an item of expense. Receivables and payables in the Statement of Financial Position are shown inclusive of GST.

3. VICTORIAN GOLF FOUNDATION (ESTABLISHMENT AND PURPOSE)

The Victorian Golf Foundation (VGF) was established in 1987. Following an initial period of capital building, the trustees in 1995 commenced making annual allocations and grants to support golf development programs and projects conducted by the Victorian Golf Association, one of the predecessor organisations of Golf Victoria, District Golf Associations, affiliated golf clubs and allied organisations. The process of annual allocations and grants is ongoing and opportunity is provided each year for interested clubs and organisations to apply for funding support. Since 1995 a total of approximately \$5.5 million has been expended by the VGF to benefit Victorian golf.

A VGF benefactor program was launched in 1997. Under this program the opportunity exists for any person or group interested in golf to make single or ongoing donations to assist

in further building the foundation's capital fund. Donations are tax deductible as a result of the foundation being registered as an approved project of the Australian Sports Foundation.

During 2019 funds were provided to assist the following: Golf club memberships; school club linkage programs for juniors; community come and try clinics; District Association junior clinics and tournaments; MyGolf promotions in schools; golf in primary and secondary school; golf promotion resource materials; and support for regional sports academies.

A considerable difference in the Profit & Loss statement from 2018 and 2019 was due to 2018 being the final year of the VGF subsidy of \$350,000 to support the Victorian Regional and Metro Development Managers (an important program to support regional Victorian golf). In accordance with the One Golf Services Agreement, from 2019 onwards, this subsidy is to be absorbed by Golf Australia Ltd.
