



## SOUTHERN CROSS INVITATIONAL

### AUSTRALIAN REPRESENTATIVES AND RECORDS

The Southern Cross Invitational is the amalgamation of the Southern Cross Cup and Four Nations Cup (see below for honour rolls). With Australia and New Zealand competing in both events, it was initially tabled that South Africa, Argentina, Canada and Japan join Australia and New Zealand to create team's event with 6 countries to avoid Trans-Tasman duplication.

The invite was extended to more countries and in 2015 included France, Ireland, Chile and Portugal. Women will be added to the event from 2017.

The event in 2015 was played as a 4-man team over 72 holes stroke-play with all scores counting toward the team score.
