The 2023 ISPS HANDA Australian Open will move to Sydney with The Australian and The Lakes golf clubs set to host the prestigious tournament from November 30 - December 3.

Off the back of last year's world-first joint format, and with a sustained focus on inclusiveness, the Men's Australian Open, Women's Australian Open and Australian All Abilities Championship (AAAC) will again take to the course together to deliver four days of elite golfing action.

The men's open returns to The Australian for the first time since 2019, while the women's open homecoming to Sydney is 15 years in the making since 2007. Both fields will again compete for a minimum \$3.4 million total prize pool, with the men's event co-sanctioned by the ISPS HANDA PGA Tour of Australasia and DP World Tour and women's sanctioning with the WPGA Tour of Australasia.

The Australian Golf Club will be the primary host venue across all four days with The Lakes Golf Club selected to co-host for the first two days of play.

A wide range of exceptional golf experiences are on offer. There's something for everyone – from premium hospitality suites at the 18th green, to the all-new Champions Club with a bird's eye view of the challenging 16th green. Or simply hang out in the fun fan precinct with live music and big-screen TVs streaming all the action live as it happens. You'll be spoilt for choice.

THE AUSTRALIAN GOLF CLUB & THE LAKES GOLF CLUB

Neighbours in Sydney's inner south-eastern suburbs, The Australian Golf Club and The Lakes Golf Club, will play host as the ISPS HANDA Australian Open's new mixed-gender format is unveiled in New South Wales for the first time, after a successful debut in Melbourne in 2022.

The Australian Golf Club and The Lakes Golf Club are regarded as two of the finest golf courses in the country with each venue enjoying a rich history of staging prominent events on the Australian golfing calendar. The Australian Golf Club hosted the very first men's Australian Open in 1904 and, in total, 29 Australian Opens have been played across the two venues.

MEN'S AUSTRALIAN OPEN - Stonehaven Cup

The Men's Australian Open is one of the oldest golf tournaments in the world, dating back to 1904.

The Stonehaven Cup has been won by golf immortals such as Jack Nicklaus, Arnold Palmer, Gary Player, Peter Thomson, Greg Norman, Tom Watson, along with modern superstars Rory McIlroy, Jordan Spieth and Adam Scott.

WOMEN'S AUSTRALIAN OPEN - Patricia Bridges Bowl

The Women's Australian Open was first played in 1974 and has established itself as a world-class event held in Adelaide in recent years.

The event attracts world class players with three different world No. 1 players, Jin Young Ko, Nelly Korda & Inbee Park, adding their names to a star studded listing which includes 5-time champion Karrie Webb, Dame Laura Davies, Lydia Ko, Annika Sorenstam and Jan Stephenson.

AUSTRALIAN ALL ABILITIES CHAMPIONSHIP – All Abilities Trophy

Introduced in 2018, the ground-breaking Australian All Abilities Championship has been the pinnacle event on the World Ranking for Golfers with Disability calendar. Since the inception of the official ranking system, the number of ranked players has increased from 300 to over 3000.

The event assembles the top 12 ranked players from across the world and was the first of its kind at the time, played alongside the Men's Australian Open. Johan Kammerstad of Sweden took out back-toback titles in 2018 and 2019.




