What is a hackathon?

A hackathon is a 36-hour development marathon for undergraduates, ending with teams pitching innovative ideas to a panel of sponsors and judges. The experience provides students with valuable technical skills that they will need in their future careers. Students meet like-minded peers, interact with professionals, and network with recruiters.

What is Hoya Hacks?

Hoya Hacks, Georgetown University's annual hackathon, is part of a larger technological revolution that seeks to infuse innovation into the University's core culture.

At our last event, we had 20 sponsors—including Google, Verizon, and the Craig Newmark Foundation—in the trenches with our hackers, who themselves hailed from 53 campuses scattered across the US. Of the 250 incredible participants, around 20% were Georgetown students.
