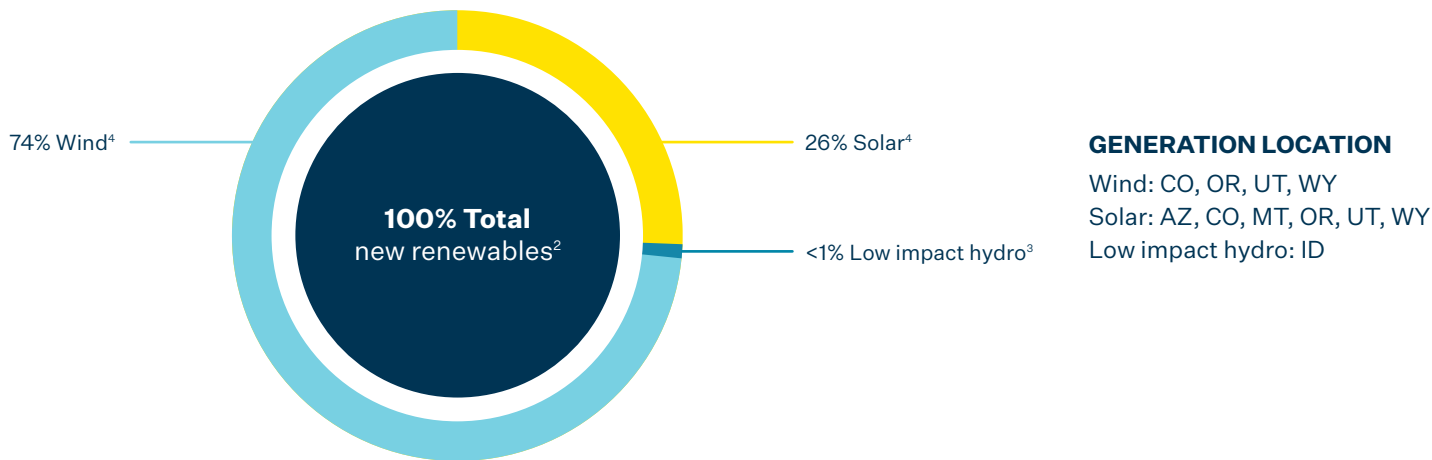

Green Future Choice and Green Future Block

Green Future Choice matches 73% of your monthly electricity use. Green Future Block is sold in 200 kilowatt-hour (kWh) blocks. These are Renewable Energy Certificate (REC) products and do not contain electricity, which is billed separately. A REC represents the environmental benefits of 1 megawatt-hour (MWh) of renewable energy.



Here's how that compares to the average mix in the 2025 PGE Basic Service Mix:⁵

40% Natural gas	28% Hydro ⁶	13% Wind
8% Other and Unspecified ⁷	6% Coal	5% Solar

2. New renewables come from generation facilities that first began commercial operation within the past 15 years. These percentages are averaged annually.
3. For 2025, hydroelectric facilities include facilities certified by the Low Impact Hydropower Institute (LIHI) (lowimpacthydro.org) or EcoLogo (ecologo.org) and facilities comprised of a turbine in a pipeline or a turbine in an irrigation canal.
4. The Wheatridge Renewable Energy Facility, owned in part by PGE, supplied a portion of the wind and solar RECs through Green Future Choice and Green Future Block in 2025. See portlandgeneral.com/wheatridge for info about this facility.
5. These figures are based on generated and purchased energy associated with serving retail customers within the state of Oregon, as required by ODEQ. Some or all of the renewable energy attributes associated with PGE's Basic Service Mix may be sold, claimed, or not acquired.
6. Hydro includes power purchased from Bonneville Power Administration (BPA).
7. Per ODEQ rules, unspecified purchases represent purchased power for which a specific generating resource is not known and could be any of the generation types (e.g. wind, hydro, gas). Other purchases may include biomass, biomass gases, landfill gas or other fuel types.

Green Future Choice is approved by ODEQ to generate incremental Clean Fuels Program credits as set forth in OAR 340-253-0470. Residential Green Future Choice participants who charge an electric vehicle at home also support transportation electrification programs that benefit residential utility customers.

All percentages are approximate and may not add up to exactly 100% due to rounding.
