Community Based Renewable Energy (CBRE)

Request for Offer (RFO)



Renewable Energy

Small-scale (<20 MW in aggregate), interconnected to transmission or distribution system



Dispatchable Capacity

Paired with a dispatchable capacity product (either colocated or virtually paired).



Community Benefit

Provides a direct benefit to a particular community through a community-benefits agreement or direct ownership.





- This includes submitting an interconnection application

Find Appendix D: Offer Details


- Compile info requested in "Essential Information"
- Organize and attach items included in "Supplemental Material"





Anticipated CBRE RFO Evaluation Schedule






- Rounds 2 & 3 dates and deadlines subject to change. Any updates will be posted on CBRE website.
- Bidders may enter bidding at any time but if they miss submission by the due date for specific rounds, they will move to the next review round cycle.
- Bidders may update a submission for consideration in any round but will only be considered within the bounds of a review cycle. Bids submitted after round 2 due date will only be eligible for a single round of review during the 3rd round cycle and subject to remaining RFO opportunity.
- Successful bids will move forward to contracting. We may meet IRP target before round 3.




Increasing networks
