Green Future Enterprise is a Green-e[®] Energy certified Renewable Energy Certificate (REC) product. Renewable Energy Certificates (RECs) do not contain electricity. A REC represents the environmental benefits of 1 megawatt-hour (MWh) of renewable energy that can be paired with electricity. You can purchase RECs up to 100% of your PGE served electricity load, subject to availability, with a minimum purchase of 1,000 kWh per month. PGE is supplying your electricity. Green-e[®] Energy has only certified the RECs, which may be sourced from outside of your local electricity distribution area. For more information, see green-e.org/rec.

What is my contract length?	Your Green Future Enterprise contract is month-to-month unless otherwise specified in your agreement.
How much will Green Future Enterprise cost?	\$5.90 per MWh (1,000 kWh).
Will my rates change over time?	The price of Green Future Enterprise may change with evolving REC market conditions and program demand. You will be notified of any price change in advance.
What other fees might I be charged?	You must also pay all applicable federal, state or local taxes.
How will I be billed?	Your Green Future Enterprise charge will be listed as a separate line item on your monthly PGE bill. In either case, this charge is in addition to your regular electricity bill.
Can I cancel my participation?	You can cancel at any time with no fee. There is no minimum contract length.

1. These figures reflect the renewables that we have contracted to provide. Actual figures may vary from those filed with Oregon Department of Environmental Quality (ODEQ) according to resource availability. We will annually report to you before August 1 of next year in the form of a Historic Product Content Label the actual resource mix of the electricity you purchased.
2. New renewables come from generation facilities that first began commercial operation within the past 15 years.
3. These figures are based on generated and purchased energy associated with serving retail customers within the state of Oregon, as required by the ODEQ. Some or all of the renewable energy attributes associated with PGE's Basic Service Mix may be sold, claimed, or not acquired.
4. Hydro includes power purchased from Bonneville Power Administration (BPA).
5. Per ODEQ rules, unspecified purchases represent purchased power for which a specific generating resource is not known and could be any of the generation types (e.g. wind, hydro, gas). Other purchases may include biomass, biomass gases, landfill gas or other fuel types.
