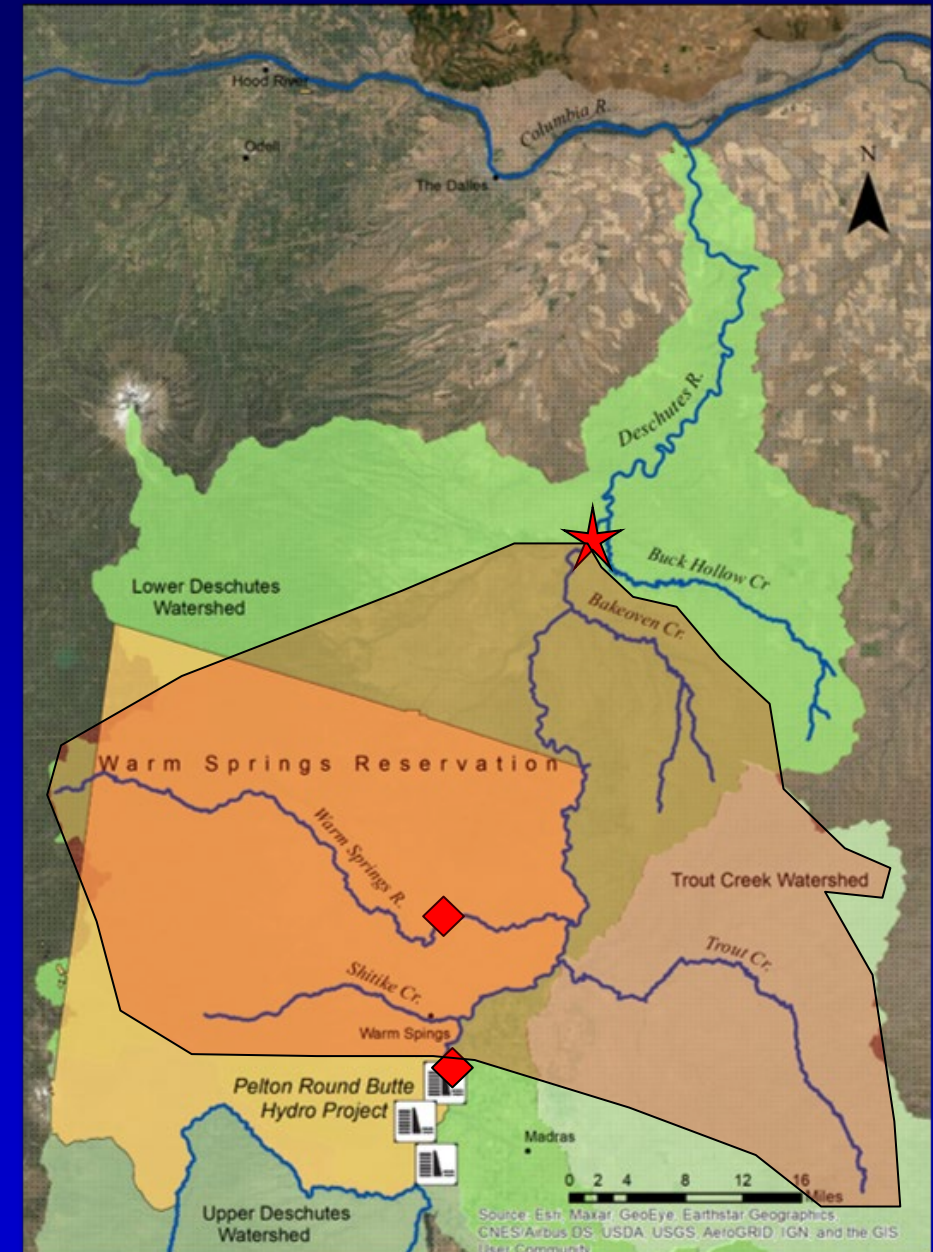

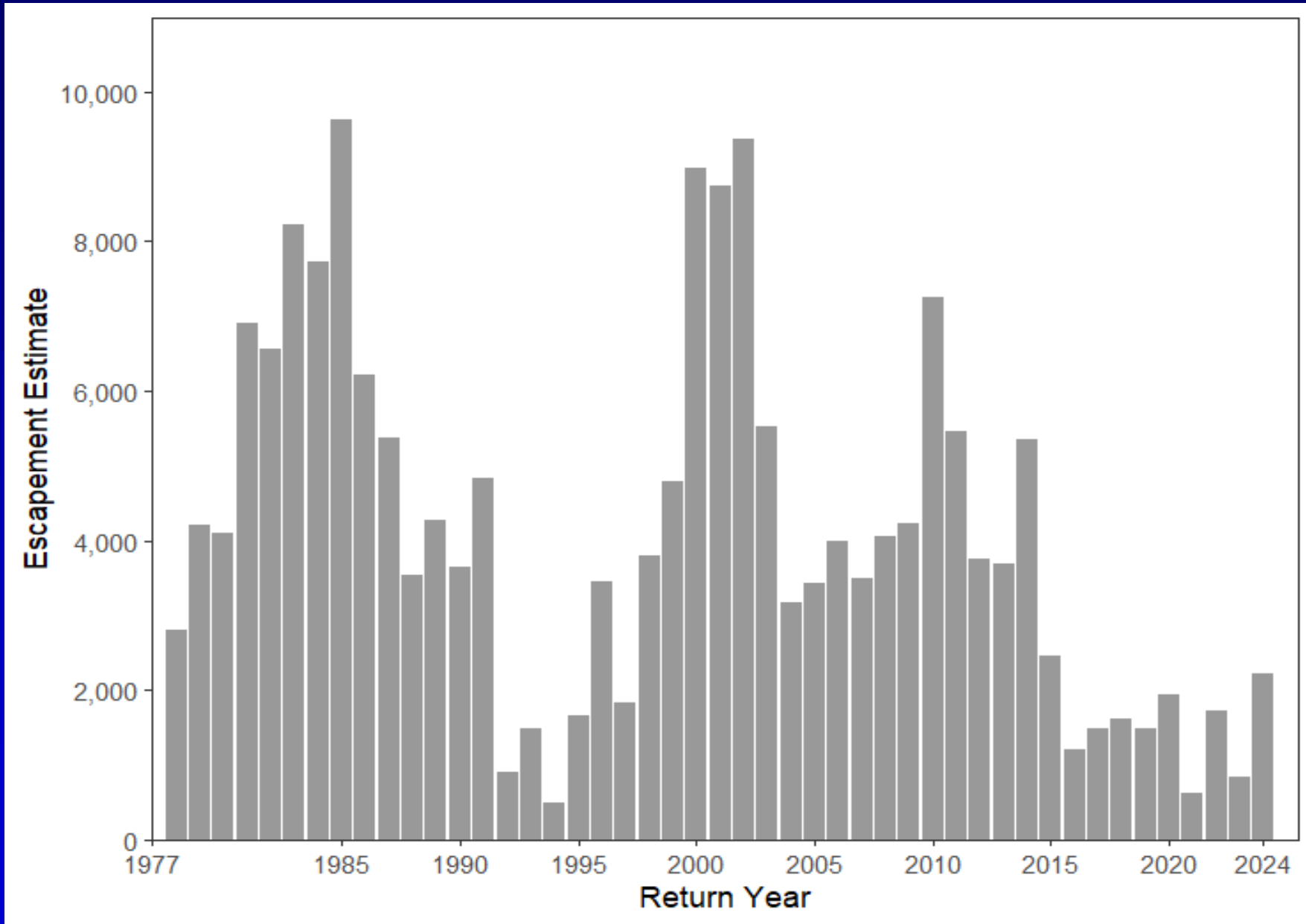

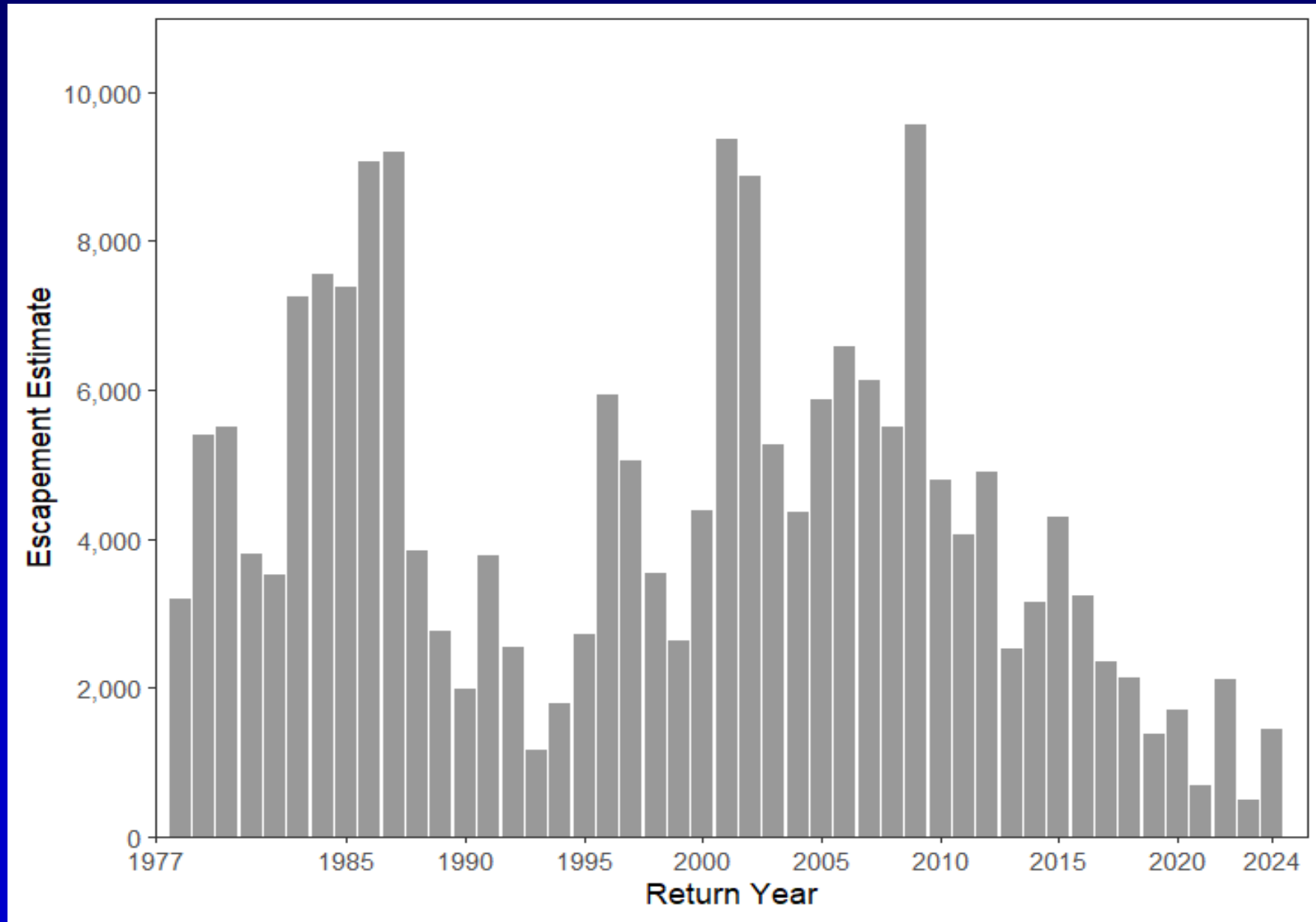

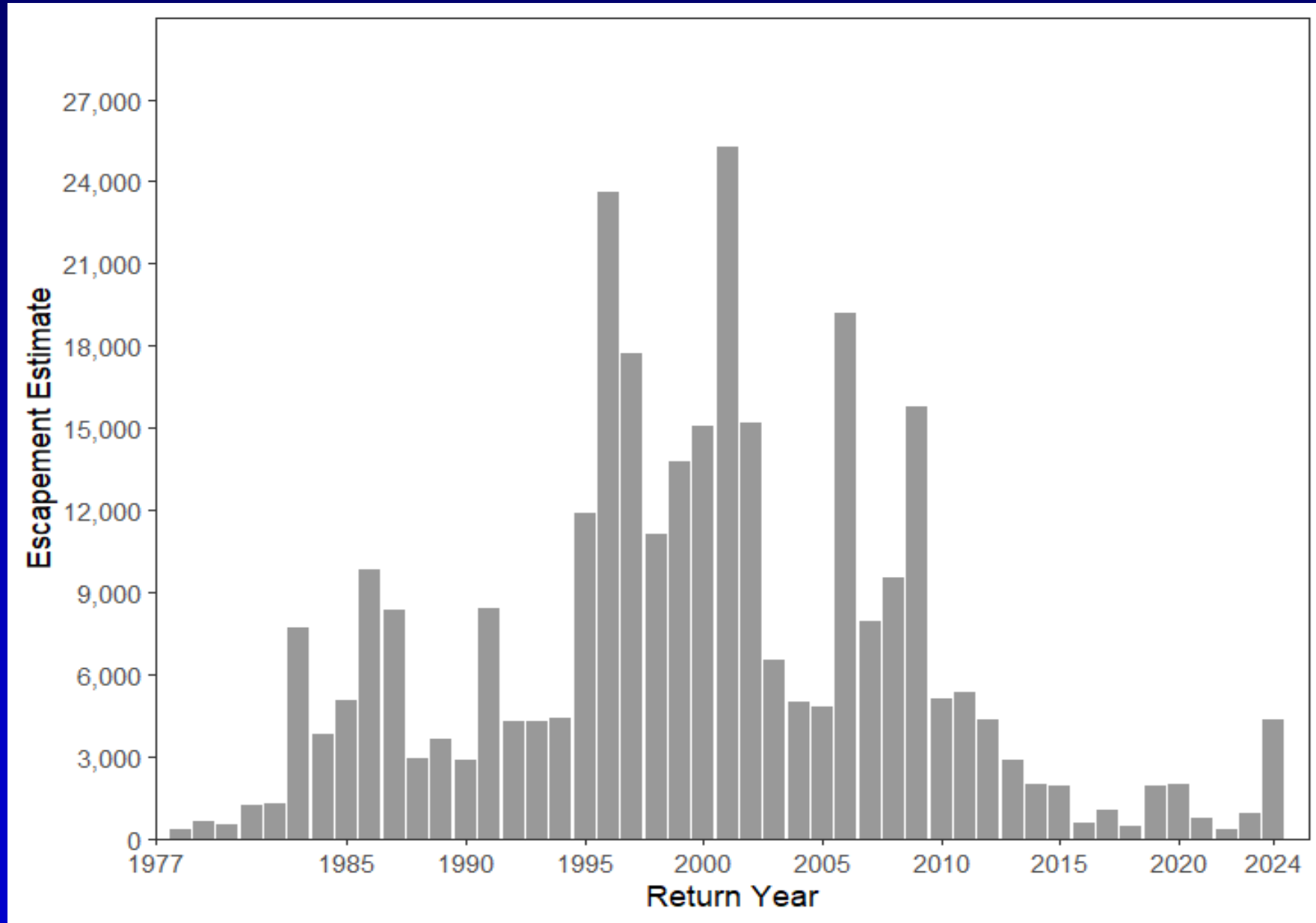

Status Summary – Steelhead Fishery

Steelhead angling and retention currently open under permanent rule

- Per Deschutes Steelhead Fishery Framework:
 - 9,900 Wild Summer Steelhead Over Bonneville between July 1 – July 31
 - 23,100 Wild Summer Steelhead Over Bonneville between July 1 – August 31
- Total forecast for Wild Summer Steelhead over Bonneville:
 - 20,100

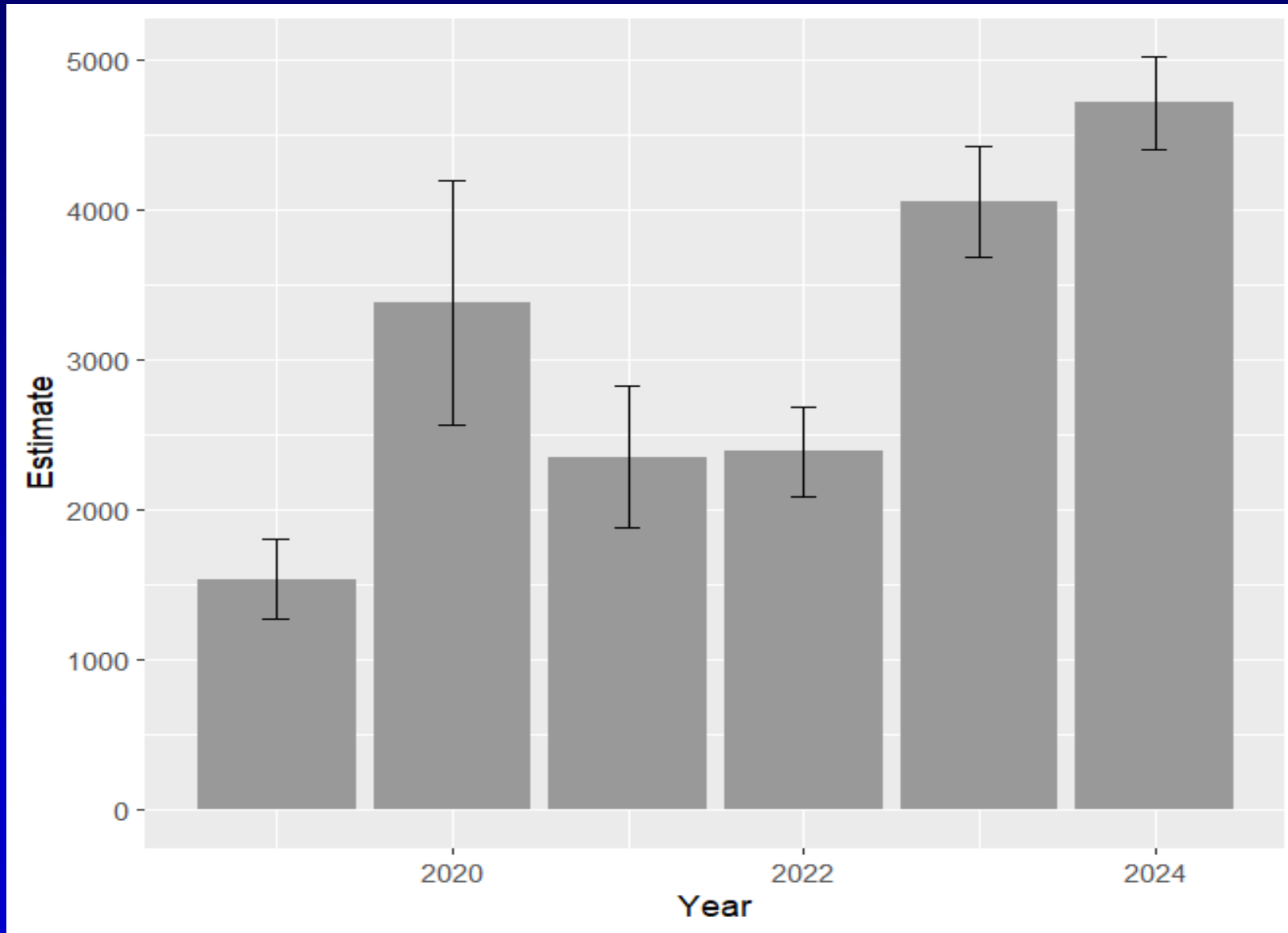

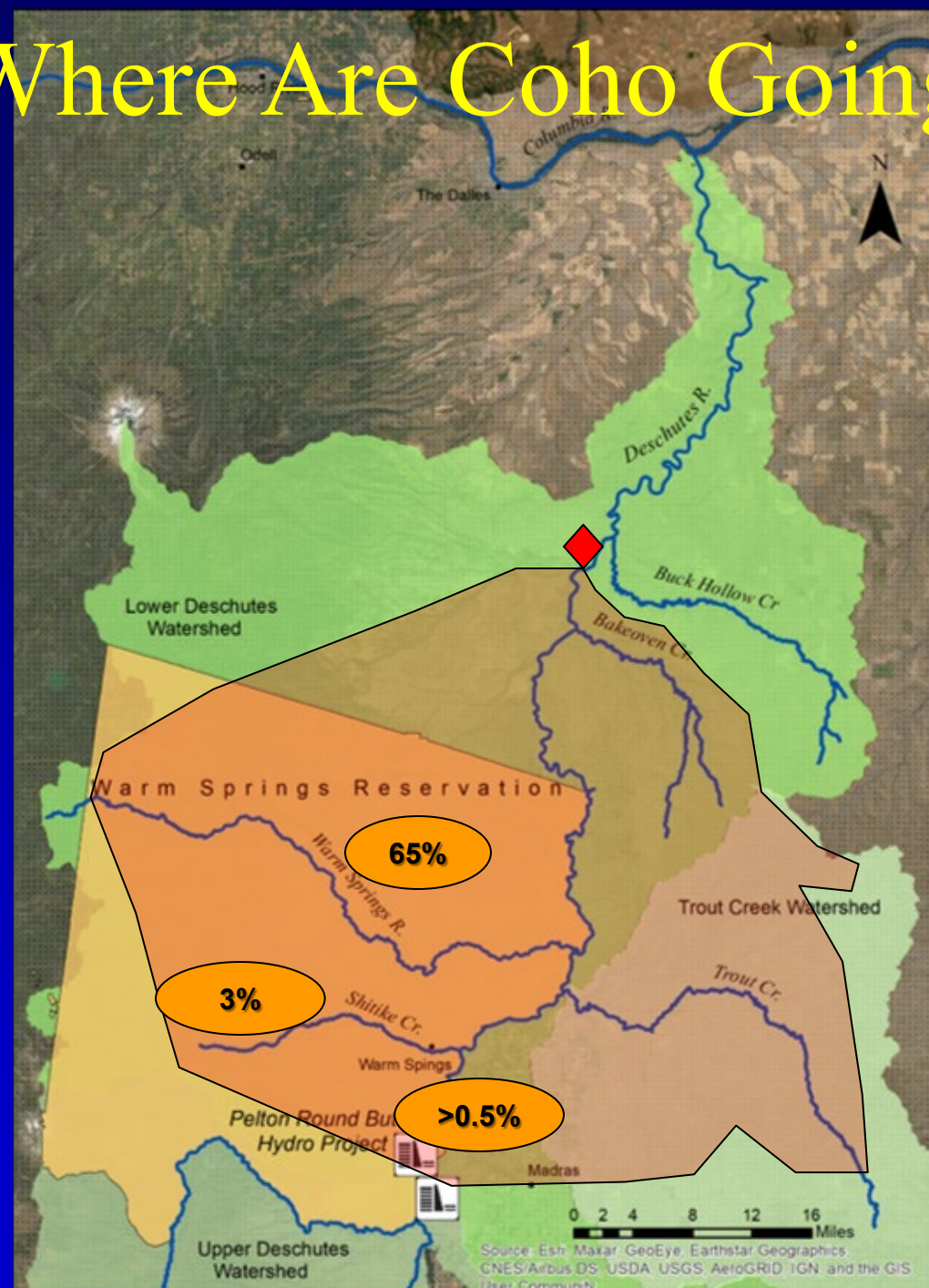


Run estimates for Above Sherars Falls

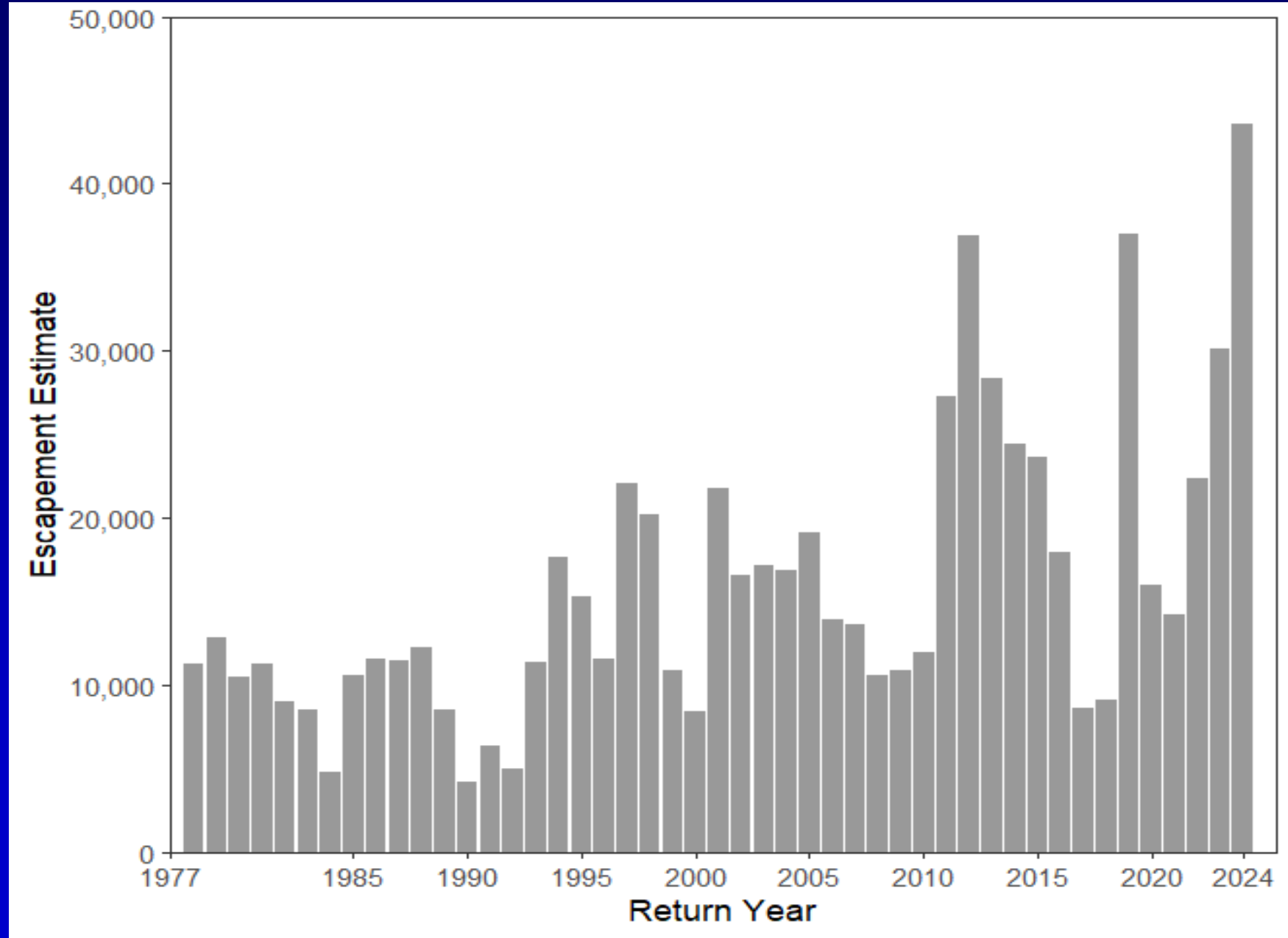

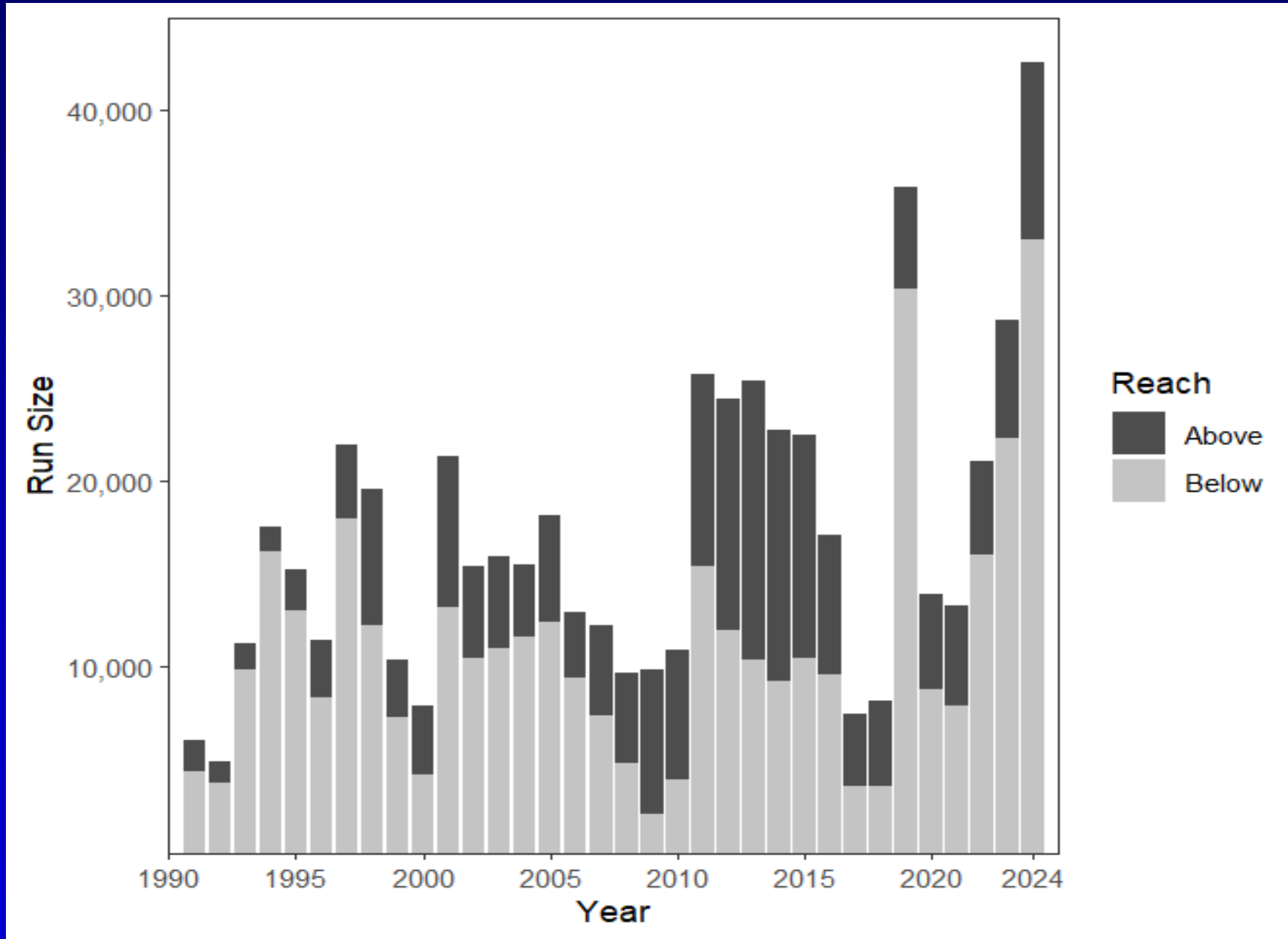

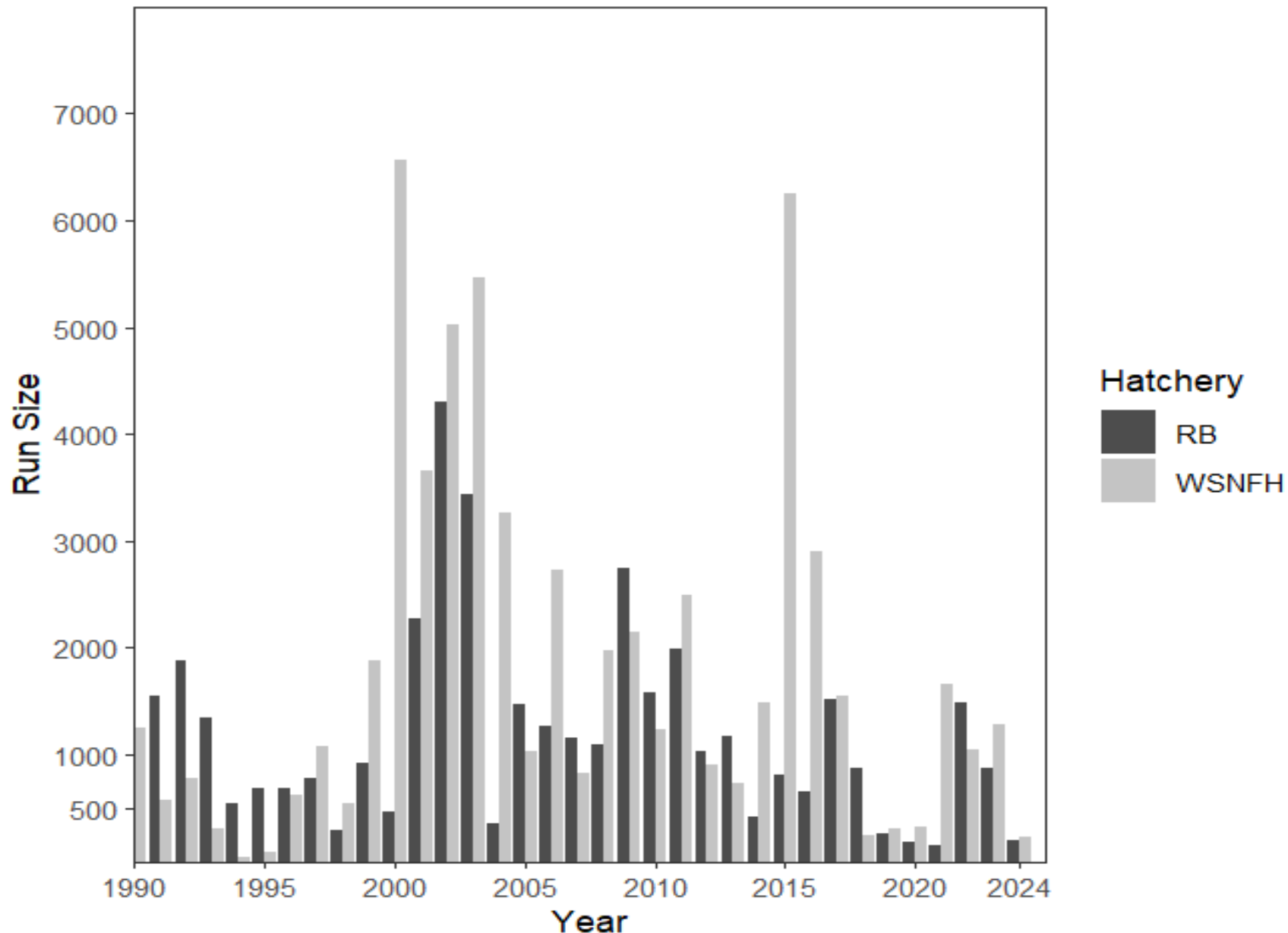


Spring Chinook Run Estimates

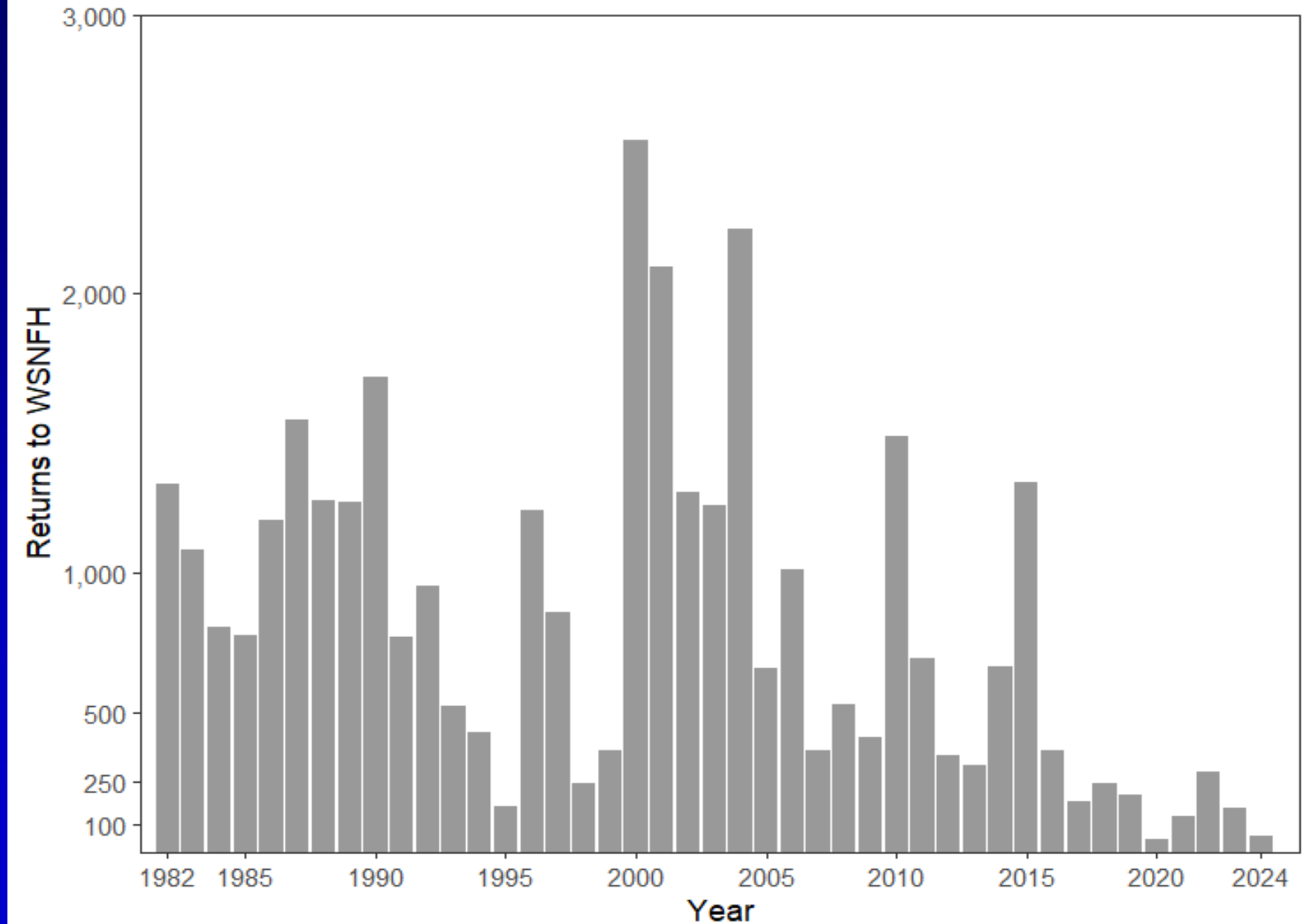
- Not associated with Sherars Trap

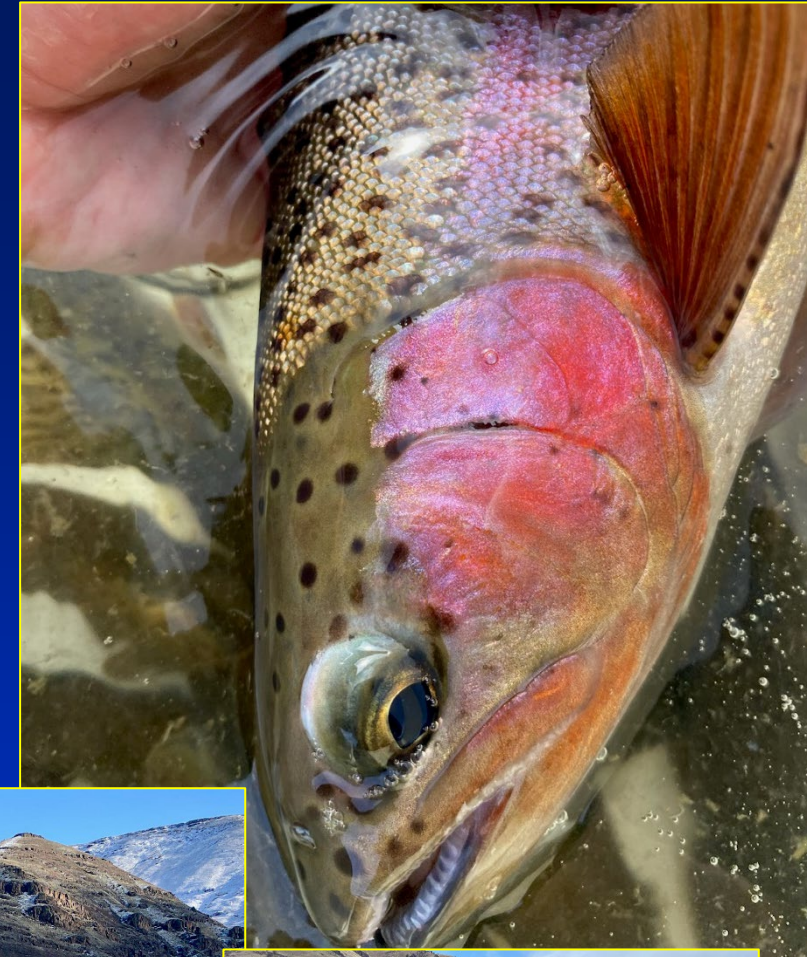

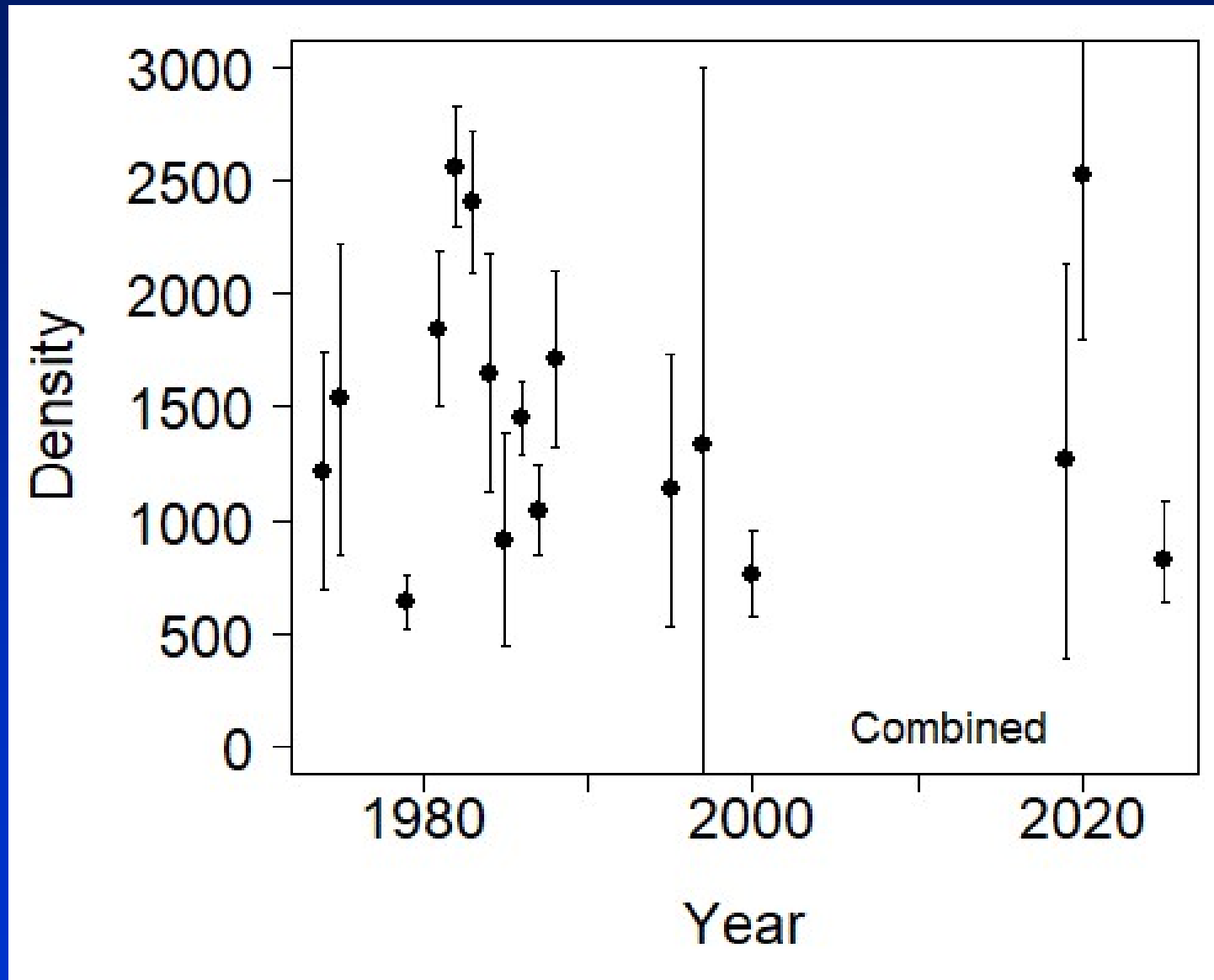

Nena Creek Section Fish Per Mile

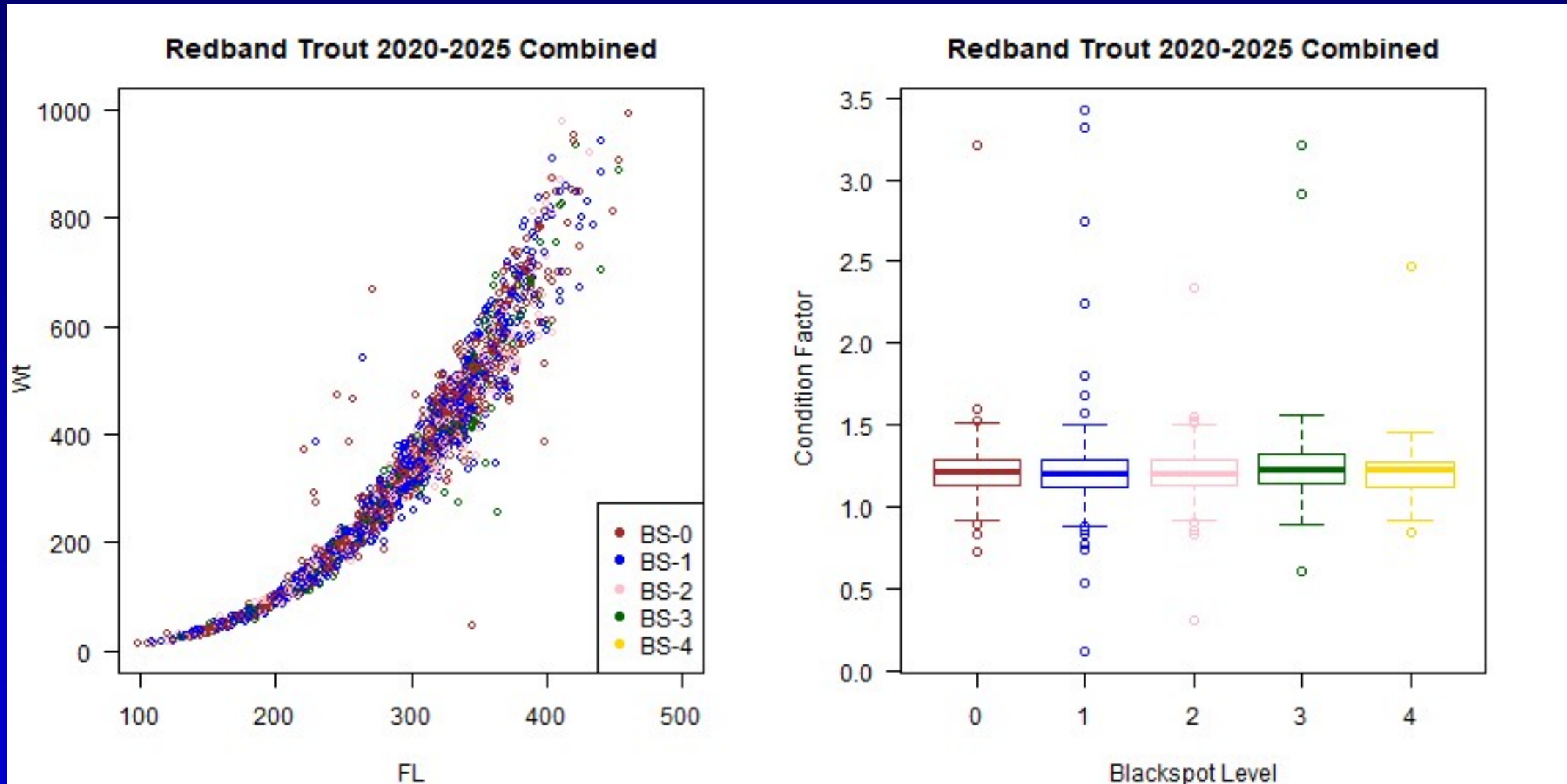

Smallmouth Bass



Findings

- Distributed from RM 26 (Ferry Canyon) to mouth, heavily concentrated below RM 12 (Harris)
- PIT tagged individual displaying long migration patterns
- Leaving the Deschutes in September
- Re-entering the Deschutes April-June
- No evidence of Natural Reproduction



Status Summary – All Species

- Steelhead Returns Low
- Wild spring Chinook Returns are Critical
- Fall Chinook Returns are Robust
- Redband Trout Densities are Good
- Smallmouth Bass continue to seasonally occupy lower 12 miles (summer months)
