

PGE Residential EV Smart Charging Program

Determine if you are eligible to receive income-qualifying rebates

If you're a PGE customer earning up to 120% median income for your household size, you can qualify for higher rebates through the PGE Residential EV Smart Charging Program. Complete the **Qualified Income Validation** form to provide verification of your household income when applying for the rebate.

Do you qualify? Let's find out!

Enrollment is available to qualifying residential PGE customers. Eligibility is based on your household size and the average annual gross income for all members of your household 18 years and older combined. Gross income means your income before taxes.

What is considered income?

Income

- Alimony

- Reverse mortgage
