- Provide a culture where all employees are able to lead safety improvement efforts, mitigate risks and voice safety concerns.
- Communicate and train employees on laws, rules, regulations, and work practices to perform their jobs in a safe, healthy, and responsible manner, including PGE's Safety Rules to Live By.
- Enforce all safety and health rules, where applicable.
- Analyze and learn from incidents and near misses.
- Recognize and celebrate safety and health successes; communicate regularly to ensure employees are informed.
- Support employees in making healthy lifestyle decisions.
- Actively benchmark, review, and improve our safety and health performance.

PGE provides a variety of resources to support employees in achieving an injury-free workplace, including but not limited to the following:

• Executive Safety Council: Accountable for driving a safety culture within PGE and providing direction and oversight of the company's efforts to create a safe workplace.
