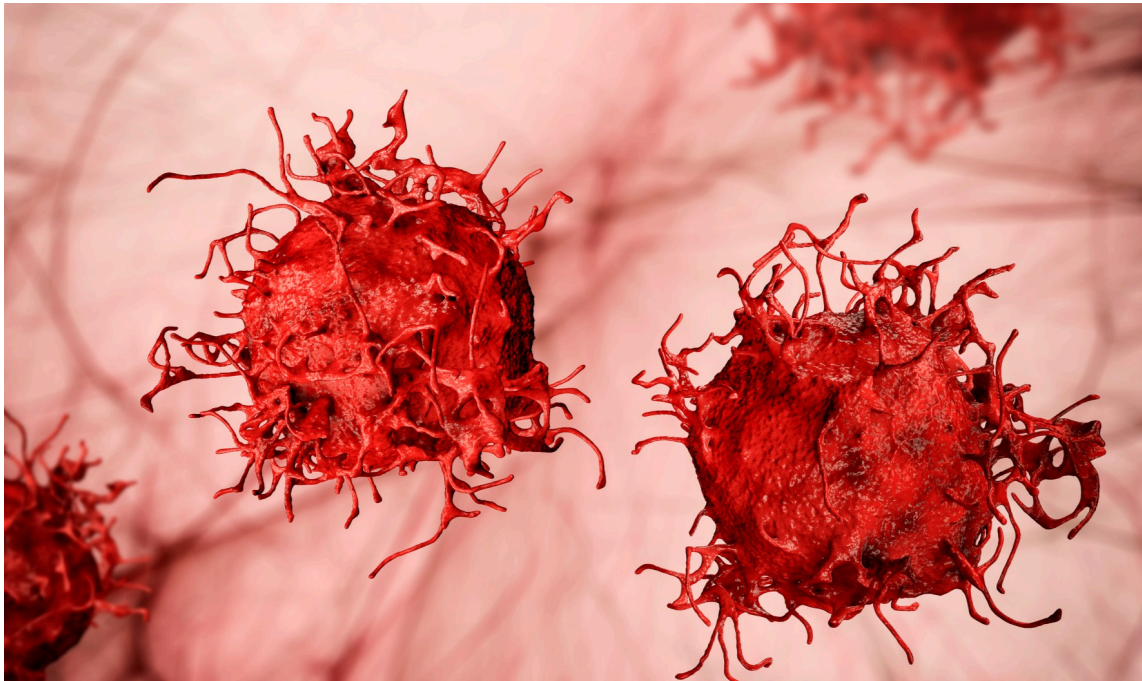

May, the Month of Dermatological Awareness

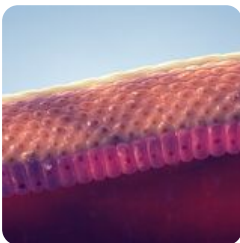
May is a key month for dermatological awareness, bringing attention to two important global initiatives!

Skin Cancer Awareness Month highlights the critical importance of prevention and early detection in reducing the burden of skin cancer worldwide. Throughout the month, dermatology professionals and health organizations encourage sun-safe behaviors, regular skin self-examinations, and awareness of early warning signs. Simple daily habits, such as consistent sunscreen use and limiting UV exposure, can make a life-saving difference.

On **May 25**, attention turns to **International Skin Pigmentation Day**, dedicated to increasing understanding of pigmentary disorders and promoting more inclusive, evidence-based dermatological care. Conditions such as melasma, post-inflammatory hyperpigmentation, and vitiligo are brought into focus, with an emphasis on early diagnosis, patient education, and access to effective treatments.
