



The latest JCR Journal Impact Factors (JIF) were recently released.

The 2023 JIF for IJPH is 2.6 and it is ranked 145/403 by JIF (Q2; percentile 64.1) in the "Public, Environmental and Occupational Health" subject category The 2023 JIF for PHR is 3.5. It is ranked 84/403 (Q1; percentile 79.3) in the same category.

There has been a widespread JIF decline this year following the COVID-19 pandemic. Please read our explanatory letter about this.



Relationship Between Alcohol Consumption and Risky Sexual Behaviors Among Adolescents and Young Adults: A Meta-Analysis


This review explores the literature of and conducts a meta-analysis on 50 studies focusing on the association between alcohol consumption and RSBs in adolescents and young adults.
