Report of the Chief Parliamentary Counsel on the Review of Subpart 3 of Part 2 of the Legislation Act 2012

Portfolio Attorney-General

On 11 March 2021, the Cabinet Legislation Committee:

- noted that under section 36 of the Legislation Act 2012, the Attorney-General must, as soon as practicable after the six years ending on 30 June 2020, require the Chief Parliamentary Counsel to prepare a report on the review of subpart 3 (Revision Bills) of Part 2 of the Legislation Act 2012;
- 2 **noted** that subpart 3 introduced the requirement for the government to put in place threeyearly programmes of revision bills for each new Parliament, and contains the revision powers and process requirements;
- noted the Chief Parliamentary Counsel's report on the operation and effectiveness of subpart 3 over the last six years and her recommendations, attached to the submission under LEG-21-SUB-0019;
- 4 **noted** that, as required under section 36 of the Legislation Act 2012, the Attorney-General intends to present the Chief Parliamentary Counsel's report to the House of Representatives.
