

COMPETITION RULES

“Win a Dinner in the Air or a First Track Experience”

Article 1 – Organising company

Méribel Alpina, a simplified joint-stock company (société par actions simplifiée) with share capital of €3,287,169.01, whose registered office is located at 350 route de Mottaret, 73550 Méribel, registered with the Chambéry Trade and Companies Register under number 075 520 064, hereinafter referred to as the “Organiser”, is organising a free competition with no purchase necessary entitled “Win a Dinner in the Air or a First Track Experience”, hereinafter referred to as the “Competition”.

Article 2 – Competition period

The Competition is open from September 7, 2026 at 5:00 p.m. to October 4, 2026 at 11:59 p.m., Paris time.

Any entry submitted before the Competition opens or after it closes will not be taken into consideration.

Article 3 – Eligibility

The Competition is open to any individual:

- aged 18 or over on the date of entry;
- regardless of nationality or country of residence, provided that participation in the Competition is permitted under the regulations applicable in their country of residence;
- with a valid and accessible email address throughout the Competition period.

Employees of the Organiser, persons who have directly or indirectly participated in the design or production of the Competition, and members of their household are excluded from participating.

Only one entry per person and per email address is permitted throughout the Competition period.

Participation is strictly personal. The Organiser may cancel any incomplete, inaccurate or fraudulent entry, or any entry made in breach of these rules.

Article 4 – How to enter

To enter, participants must, during the Competition period:

2. complete the mandatory fields in the entry form;
3. read and accept these rules by ticking the relevant box;
4. validate their entry by clicking the “I want to enter” button.

No purchase, payment or subscription to commercial communications is required to enter.

Any subscription to the Méribel Alpina newsletter or commercial communications is subject to a separate, optional consent, which may be withdrawn at any time. Refusing to receive these communications has no impact on participation or the chances of winning.

Article 5 – Selection of winners

A single prize draw will be held on October 5, 2026, among all valid entries received during the Competition period.

- The first winner drawn will win the “Dinner in the Air” prize.
- The next five winners drawn will each win a “First Track” prize for two people.

A participant may win only one prize.

Three reserve winners will also be drawn, in a single order of priority, to replace a winner who is unable to accept their prize, if necessary.

Article 6 – Prizes

The Competition offers the following six prizes, with a total indicative retail value of €1,270 including VAT.

6.1. Dinner in the Air

A gourmet dinner created by a Michelin-starred chef, aboard a private cabin of the Saulire Express gondola, reserved for the winner and up to three accompanying guests, with an indicative retail value of €780 including VAT.

The experience includes the Michelin-starred gourmet menu created by a Michelin-starred chef and served as part of the event, as well as the drinks provided by the organiser of the Dinner in the Air.

The prize may be used exclusively on one of the following dates: March 8, 2027 or March 15, 2027, subject to the availability communicated to the winner.

The “Dinner in the Air” event is organised by Méribel Tourisme, with Méribel Alpina acting solely as a service provider. The use of the prize is subject to the general terms and conditions of sale applicable to the Dinner in the Air, available at the following address:

The winner must report, as soon as they accept the prize, any allergy, food intolerance or medical condition affecting the participants. Any request to adapt the menu will be subject to prior approval by the Chef and the catering provider; no adaptation can be guaranteed until written confirmation has been received.

Alcoholic beverages will only be served to adults.

The following are notably not included in the prize:

- transport to Méribel;

- accommodation;
- personal expenses;
- any service not expressly mentioned, as well as any costs and formalities required for the winners and accompanying guests residing abroad to travel to France.

6.2. First Track Experiences

Five First Track prizes for two people each – the winner and one accompanying guest – with an indicative retail value of €98 including VAT per prize, i.e. €490 including VAT in total.

Each prize includes, for the winner and their accompanying guest, the first runs accompanied by the Organiser, as well as breakfast at the Chaudanne Lounge.

The ski pass, ski equipment, transport, any insurance, accommodation and personal expenses of the winner and their accompanying guest are not included. Participation in the Competition remains free and with no purchase necessary, but use of a First Track prize requires each person to have a valid ski pass.

To take part in the experience, the winner and their accompanying guest must, in particular:

- have at least the level required to ski independently on a red run;
- have a valid Méribel Valley or 3 Vallées ski pass on the day of the experience;
- have suitable equipment;
- arrive punctually at the meeting place and time communicated;
- comply with the instructions given by the ski patrol and operating staff.

Each prize must be used during one of the sessions offered between December 23, 2026 and April 3, 2027, by reservation and subject to availability.

The experience is subject to weather, snow conditions, safety, opening and operating conditions of the ski area. The use of each prize is subject to the general terms and conditions of sale applicable to the First Track experience, available on our [website](#).

Article 7 – Notification of winners and awarding of prizes

The winners will be contacted by email at the address provided when entering, no later than October 7, 2026.

They must confirm acceptance of their prize and provide the information required for it to be awarded within 30 days of the email being sent.

If no response is received within this period, in the event of incorrect information, if the winner's eligibility cannot be verified, or if the winner is unavailable on the specified dates, the winner will be deemed to have forfeited their prize. The prize may then be offered to the first reserve winner drawn.

Each participant is responsible for regularly checking their email inbox, including their spam folder.

The prizes are personal, non-transferable and non-refundable. They cannot be exchanged for financial compensation or resold. Any transfer to a third party may only take place with the Organiser's prior written consent.

Article 8 – Modification or unavailability of the experiences

For reasons including safety, weather conditions, the condition of the ski area or operational constraints, Méribel Alpina and/or the organiser of the relevant experience may change the date, time or certain practical arrangements, postpone or cancel the experience. A change or postponement will not entitle the winner or their accompanying guests to reimbursement of transport, accommodation or other personal expenses incurred.

Participants and winners will be informed as soon as possible of any substantial change.

Article 9 – Liability

The Organiser shall not be held liable for malfunctions of the internet network or participants' equipment that prevent an entry from being registered, except in the event of fault directly attributable to the Organiser.

The Organiser shall likewise not be held liable for inaccurate information provided by a participant or for the inability to contact a winner due to an incorrect or inaccessible email address.

Winners and their accompanying guests undertake to comply with safety rules, access conditions for the facilities and instructions communicated by the Organiser and its teams.

Article 10 – Fraud

Any attempt at fraud, multiple registration, identity theft, use of an automated process or circumvention of the rules may result in the cancellation of the relevant entry, without prejudice to any other remedies available to the Organiser.

Article 11 – Personal Data Protection

As part of this competition, the Organiser collects and processes participants' personal data in accordance with Regulation (EU) 2016/679 of April 27, 2016 (GDPR) and the French Data Protection Act (Loi Informatique et Libertés).

Purposes of processing:

Data retention period:

Competition-related data is retained for as long as necessary to manage the Competition, award the prizes and handle any disputes.

Data subjects' rights:

In accordance with the GDPR, participants have the right to access, rectify, erase and restrict the processing of their personal data and, where applicable, the right to object to the processing of their personal data.

Entering the Competition implies full and unconditional acceptance of these rules.

Article 13 – Applicable law and complaints

The Competition and these rules are governed by French law.
