*Rethinking Art, Culture, and Public Life*

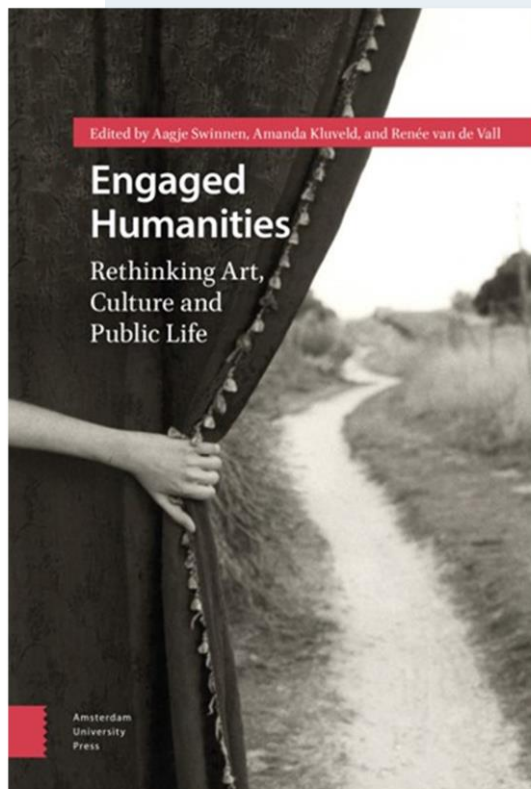
What is the role of the humanities at the start of 21st century?
