Amsterdam University Press is looking for a proactive and knowledgeable Platform Manager to support and evolve our digital publication platforms for academic journals and databases. Our organization champions Open Access and specializes in the humanities and social sciences. In this role, you will ensure our platforms are robust, interoperable, and responsive to the needs of authors, editors, and readers.

This is not a programming position, but it does require someone with a keen understanding of publishing technology, metadata workflows, and persistent identifiers. As a **small and mission-driven team**, we value flexibility and a hands-on attitude—everyone pitches in where needed.

Key Responsibilities

Platform Oversight & Development

- Serve as the primary owner of the publication platforms we use for journals and databases.
- Collaborate with internal colleagues and external technology partners to ensure platform functionality, performance, and scalability.
- Lead or support the rollout of new features, platform improvements, and integrations.

Metadata & Interoperability

- Maintain high-quality metadata workflows in line with standards such as JATS XML, Dublin Core, and ONIX.
- Oversee the management and integration of **persistent identifiers** (e.g., **DOI**, **ORCID**, **ROR**) in content and metadata
- Ensure alignment with discovery and indexing services (e.g., Crossref, DOAJ, OAI-PMH, library catalogues).

Open Access Infrastructure

- Advocate for and support Open Access workflows and compliance with OA mandates and funder requirements.
- Collaborate with external partners and networks in the open publishing ecosystem.

Team Collaboration & Support

- Work closely with editorial, production, and communications teams to align platform capabilities with publishing goals.
- Participate in hands-on troubleshooting and user support as needed—whether it's a metadata correction, production glitch, or helping an editor with platform tools.





Qualifications

- Experience in scholarly publishing, library systems, or digital platform management especially in the humanities and social sciences.
- Understanding of digital publishing infrastructures, persistent identifiers (DOI, ORCID, ROR), and metadata standards.
- Familiarity with platforms such as OJS (Open Journal Systems) or other academic content management systems.
- Strong organizational and communication skills; able to document processes clearly and support nontechnical colleagues.
- Comfortable in a small-team environment with a strong collaborative ethic and willingness to "roll up your sleeves."
- An excellent command of English and Dutch.
