All types of variation are covered, including but not restricted to geographical, social, ethnic, stylistic and diachronic variation. Articles may deal with all aspects of human language. The journal welcomes both empirical work as studies linking language variation to developments in theoretical linguistics. Articles are subjected to a double-blind peer review process.

Taal & Tongval publishes two issues each year and welcomes contributions in Dutch, English, and German. In certain cases, we also consider articles in other languages, including Frisian, Afrikaans, and French.

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
