Notice of Race

NB: The notation '[DP]' in a rule in the Sailing Instructions means that the penalty for a breach of that rule may, at the discretion of the protest committee, be less than disqualification.

1 RULES

- 1.1** The regatta will be governed by the 'rules' as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing 2017-2020*.
- 1.2** Yachting New Zealand Prescriptions 2017-2020 shall apply.
- 1.3** The Yachting New Zealand Safety Regulations Part 1, shall apply.
- 1.4** For the Jollyboat Class the Jollyboat Class Rules and Restrictions effective 1 August 2018 will apply
For the 3.7 Class the Rules of the 3.7 Owners Association will apply.
- 1.5** Immediately after finishing, a boat intending to protest shall, in addition to the requirements of rule 61.1(a), inform the race committee on the finish boat of her intention to protest and the identity of

the boat(s) protested against. The protesting boat must receive an acknowledgement from the race committee. This changes Rule 61.

1.6 RRS Appendix P, *Special Procedures for Rule 42*, will apply as amended by the Sailing Instructions.

1.7 RRS Appendix T will apply.

1.8 For the Jollyboat Class rules Jollyboats may be sailed single-handed, double-handed or multiple handed. However, no Jollyboat shall change crew members during the regatta except in exceptional circumstances such as an injury to a crew member. Any changes in crew members must be referred to the Race Committee for approval.

1.9 RRS Appendix S, and Supplementary Sailing Instructions will apply

2 ADVERTISING

2.1 Boats may be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the organising authority in accordance with World Sailing Reg 20, Advertising code.

3 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

3.1 The regatta is open to all boats of the Jollyboat Class and 3.7 Class which meet the various class requirements for measurement certificates and or WOF.

3.2 Entries will be accepted up to 10h00 on Friday 8th March 2019

3.3 Entries should be made using the attached entry form or downloading the form from <https://www.maraetaisailingclub.org.nz/events/2019-j-14-3-7s-and-finn/>

3.4 To be eligible to compete in this event each competitor, and crew, where applicable, shall be a financial member of a club recognised by the competitor's national authority. Proof of membership may be required at registration.

3.5 Each competitor, entrant and crew members shall be current members of the respective New Zealand Class Association.

5 FEES

5.1 Required fees are as follows: \$125 per boat

6 FORMAT

6.1 The championships will consist of fleet racing. Classes will race in separate fleets.

7 SCHEDULE

Racing: 9 Races are scheduled for the regatta

- 7.2** On the last scheduled day of racing no warning signal will be made after 15h30.
- 7.3** An additional race may be sailed each day but no more than 4 races will be sailed on any one day.
- 7.4** Prize giving will be as soon as possible after the completion of racing on the last day of the regatta.
- 7.5** At the discretion of the Race Committee any days schedule of racing may be altered to suit changes in circumstances.
- 7.6** The Jollyboat Class Association AGM is scheduled for Friday 8th March after all boats are ashore and protests heard but may be rescheduled for a later time during the regatta if unable to be held as scheduled.
- 7.7** The 3.7 Class Owners Association AGM is scheduled for Saturday 9th March 2019 at 5pm or after Racing on that day of the NZ National Championship. Any postponement will be displayed on the regatta noticeboard.

8 MEASUREMENT

- 8.1** Each boat shall be in possession of a valid measurement certificate.
- 8.2** For the Jollyboat Class each boat shall produce a valid Jollyboat WOF and in addition shall display a 2018-2019 WOF sticker on the transom. In addition, the following equipment may be inspected or measured: Sails, spars and foils as per the Class Rules. Measurement/WOF checks are available prior to close of registration on Friday 8th March but must have been pre-booked with the Class Measurer.
- 8.3** For the 3.7 Class, only certified sails shall be used. There shall be no provision for uncertified sails to be measured at the event. Boats will be weighed at the discretion of the Class Measurer.
- 8.4** Spot checks may be carried out after Registration & Measurement during the regatta at the discretion of the respective Class Measurers. Any boat select shall be presented and must pass the measurement check or risk disqualification [DP].

9 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The sailing instructions will be available on the regatta website www.maraetaisailingclub.org by 4th March 2019. Sailing instructions will be displayed on the regatta notice board situated on the lower deck but will not be distributed at the regatta.

10 VENUE

The regatta will be based at the Maraetai Sailing Club, Maraetai Beach Rd, Maraetai. The race course area will be in the waters of the Tamaki Strait off Maraetai Beach.

11 THE COURSES

For the Jollyboat and 3.7 Classes the intended courses to be sailed will be Windward/ Leeward Triangle.

At the discretion of the Race Committee the course for any days racing may be altered to suit changes in circumstances.

12 PENALTY SYSTEM

12.1 RRS Appendix P, *Special Procedures for Rule 42*, will apply as amended by the Sailing Instructions.

12.2 For all classes RRS 44.1 is changed so that the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by a One-Turn Penalty.

13 SCORING

13.1 5- Races are required to be completed to constitute a series.

13.2 a) When 5 or fewer races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.

b) When 6 or more races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.

14 SUPPORT BOATS

Support boats will be allowed but must stay at least 100m (250m if wind is under 5knts) from boats racing with the exception of those giving assistance to the Race Committee.

15 RADIO COMMUNICATION

Except in an emergency, a boat that is racing shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats. This restriction also applies to mobile telephones. [DP]

16 PRIZES

Prizes will be given as follows:

16.1 For the Jollyboat Class:

1st Single Handed (trophy)

1st Double Handed (trophy)

1st Handicap (trophy)

Overall and National Champion (Salad Bowl); awarded to the crew with the lowest points

1st Club Team (Munted Mermaid); awarded to the team representing an official yacht club whose three (3) boats combined overall points total the lowest

Furthermost travelled crew

Oldest crew

Youngest crew

16.2 For the 3.7 Class:

1st Overall Bruce Farr Cup & Medal

2nd Overall Medal

3rd Overall Medal

1st Under 21 Gil Galley Cup & Medal

1st over 45: Veterans Cup & Medal

1st over 55: Grand Veteran Medal

1st over 65: Great Grand Veteran Medal

1st on Handicap Medal

1st in Silver Fleet John Kennett Cup

1st Lady Medal

Prize giving will be held as soon as possible after the completion of racing and protests on the last day of the regatta.

17 INSURANCE

17.1 For the Jollyboat Class:

Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of \$250,000 per incident or the equivalent.

18 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4, Decision to Race. The organising authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.

Attention is drawn to the Auckland Council Navigation by laws which requires a lifejacket be provided for every person on board a boat. The Lifejacket shall be worn at all times on vessels under 6m. On vessels over 6m lifejackets shall be worn unless the skipper decides there is no appreciable risk.

18 RISK STATEMENT

Sailing is, by its nature, an unpredictable sport and therefore inherently involves an element of risk. By taking part in the event, each competitor and the responsible adult agrees and acknowledges that:

- a) They are aware of the inherent element of risk involved in the sport and accept responsibility for the exposure of themselves and their boat to such inherent risk whilst taking part in the event;
- b) They are responsible for the safety of themselves, their boat and their other property whether afloat or ashore;
- c) They accept responsibility for any injury, damage or loss to the extent caused by their own actions or omission;
- d) Their boat is in good order, equipped to sail in the event and they are fit to participate;
- e) The provision of a race management team, patrol boats and other officials and volunteers by the event organizer does not relieve them of their own responsibilities;
- f) The provision of patrol boat cover is limited to such assistance, particularly in extreme weather conditions, as can be practically provided in the circumstances.
