

Going Home After Your Stay on the Neurology Unit

You were in the hospital for

After you go home, watch for these signs and symptoms:

- Increasing or severe headache
- Feeling sleepy all the time
- Trouble waking up
- Vomiting that won't go away or stop
- Trouble with walking or balance
- New arm, leg, or facial weakness
- Personality or behavior changes (quick mood changes, irritability)
- Confusion (frustration)
- Changes or loss of vision
- Change in speech, swallowing, or talking
- Numbness, tingling, or changes in sensation
- Feeling dizzy
- Having a hard time concentrating
- New bladder or bowel control issues or not able to go to the bathroom

Who to Call

Report any of these symptoms to Dr. _____at **(608) 263-5442** or call your local emergency room.

After hours or on the weekend, call UW Paging at **(608) 262-2122** and ask for the neurology resident on call. Leave your name and number with area code. The doctor will call you back.

Call 911 for signs of a stroke.

- **Sudden** numbness or weakness of the face, arm or leg
- Trouble seeing
- Confusion
- Trouble speaking clearly
- Trouble walking
- Severe headache
