What to Expect After Radiosurgery

For the next few days:

- You may feel a little tired for a day or two afterwards.
- No activity restrictions so you can be as active as you want.
- You can resume your diet as normal
- If you receive contrast for treatment, drink extra fluids to flush the contrast from your system.
- You may have swelling around the tumor site.

If the clinic is closed, your call will be transferred to the paging operator. Ask for radiotherapy (radiation oncology) on-call doctor. Give your name and phone number with area code and the doctor will call you back.

When to Call

Call your doctor if you have any questions or if you notice any of the symptoms below:

- Increasing or severe headaches that are not relieved by Tylenol[®]
- Headaches that occur several times a day even if relieved by Tylenol
- Headaches with nausea and vomiting
- Nausea and vomiting
- Numbness or tingling
- Change in balance such as clumsiness or trouble moving hands or legs
- Dizziness or trouble walking
- New onset of confusion
- New or worsening seizures
