## **Semen Collection Instructions for Generations Fertility Care Clinic**

Semen is the fluid that comes out of the penis during sexual activity. This fluid contains sperm. A semen sample may be studied in the lab for many reasons. The results depend on how you collect and handle the sample as well as other factors.

## If you do not follow these instructions, your sample may be rejected.

#### **Before the Semen Collection**

You must be a registered patient at Generations to have semen studied in our lab. If you are not a registered patient, call UW Health Registration at (608) 261-1600

Specimen drop-off is by appointment only. Walk-in's and same day appointments cannot be accommodated as specimens need to be processed in a timely manner. Please call (608) 824-6160 to schedule your visit at Generations Fertility Care Clinic. The clinic is located at 2365 Deming Way, Middleton, WI 53562.

#### **Best Way to Collect a Semen Sample**

- Semen should be collected by masturbation after 3 days of abstinence (no ejaculation). You must abstain to get accurate results.
- Use only the sterile container supplied by our clinic.
- Do not use condoms or lubricant gel
- The **entire** semen sample is put into sterile cup.

### To Collect the Sample at Home

Collection kits are available at the clinic. A collection kit can be mailed to you if you ask. Home collection samples should be dropped off within one hour but can wait up to two. A government issued ID card is required. Follow the steps below to collect your sample.

- 1. Use only the sterile cup given to you.
- 2. Write your first and last name and date of birth on the cup.
- 3. Wash your hands well.
- 4. Masturbate.
- 5. Collect the entire amount of semen into the cup. **Do not** use condoms or gel.
- 6. Place the labeled cup into the plastic specimen bag, seal it and place it in the paper bag.
- 7. Keep the cup warm by putting it under your shirt next to your skin. Avoid extreme cold or heat.
- 8. Fill out the patient section on the chain of custody form.
- 9. Bring the sample and photo ID to our Generations reception desk.
- 10. Check in at the front desk.

# To Collect the Sample in Our Clinic Bring a government issued ID card to the clinic.

- Check in at the front desk. You will be shown where to collect your sample.
- 2. Follow the instructions provided in the collection room.
