REGULATIONS

I. TIME AND PLACE

From May 16th to May 17th, 2025. Olympic training Center Vierumäki, Heinola. Address Pihkalantie 3, 19120 Vierumäki.

II. PARTICIPANTS

Each University team can register up to 6 participants in Men's category and up to 6 participants in the Women's category.

The first three winners in the Men's, Women's and Teams categories will be awarded; All competing participants must meet the requirements of the General Regulations of SELL Student Games 2025..

III. PROGRAM

Individual Swiss system, 7 - 9 rounds, FIDE rules. Time control: 3'+2''(3 minutes + 2 seconds) increment per move, starting from move 1). Team members can play with each other.

The exact tournament system, draw and timetable will be published after registration.

If two or more players score the same points, the tie is broken by the following criteria, in order of priority:

1) Buchholz Cut 1;

- b) Buchholz;
- c) Average rating of Opponents;
- 4) Arranz system;
- 5) Sonneborn-Berger.

The default time in case of late arrival (no appearance) is 3 minutes.

The latest version of the Swiss Manager software will be used for pairings and results determination.

The University team's results are determined by adding up the sum of the points obtained by the best two results of the University representatives in the Men's category and the best results by the University representative in the Women's category.

The Chief Arbiter has the right to make necessary changes to the tournament regulations on the registration day in case it does not violate the interests of the participants.

Rapid tournament

Individual Swiss system, 9 rounds, FIDE rules.

The exact tournament system, draw and timetable will be published after registration.

The in total 3 sets of medals - Men's category, Women's category and Teams category will be awarded;

Time control: 10'+5"(10 minutes + 5 seconds increment per move, starting from move 1);

The latest version of the Swiss Manager software will be used for pairings and results determination. Team members can play with each other.

If two or more players score the same points, the tie is broken by the following criteria, in order of priority:

Buchholz Cut 1;
Buchholz;
Average rating of Opponents;
Arranz system;
Sonneborn-Berger.
The default time in case of late arrival (no appearance) is 3 minutes.

The University team's results are determined by adding up the sum of the points obtained by the best two results of the University representatives in the Men's category and the best results by the University representative in the Women's category.

The Chief Arbiter has the right to make necessary changes to the tournament regulations on the registration day in case it does not violate the interests of the participants.

IV. MEDICAL SERVICE
