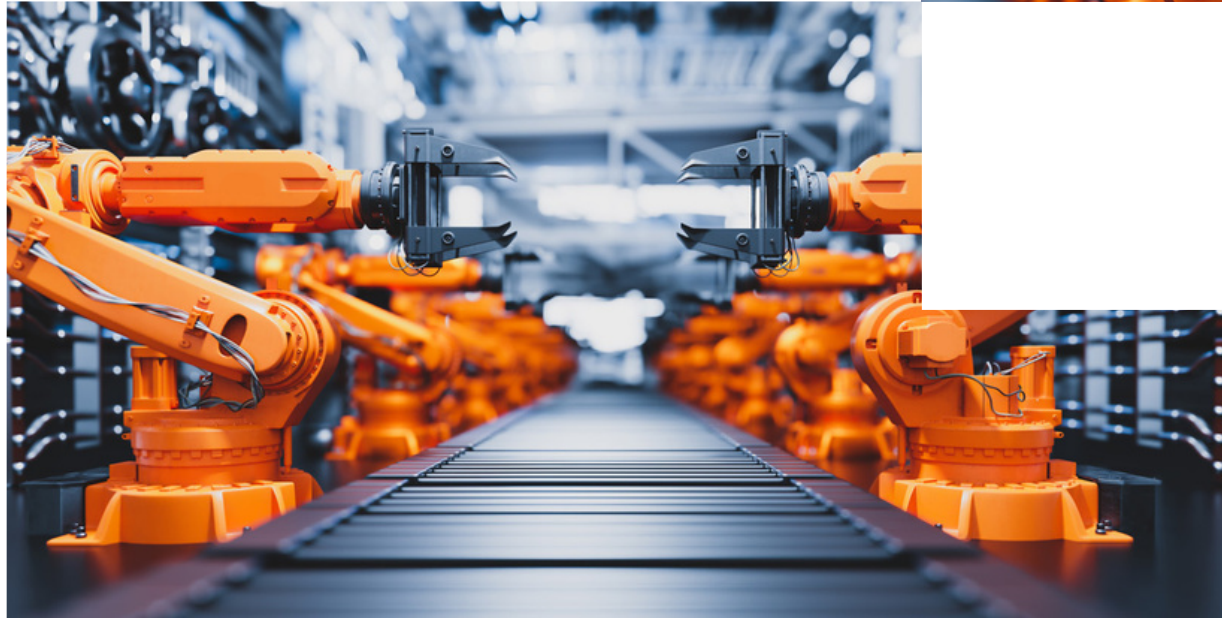

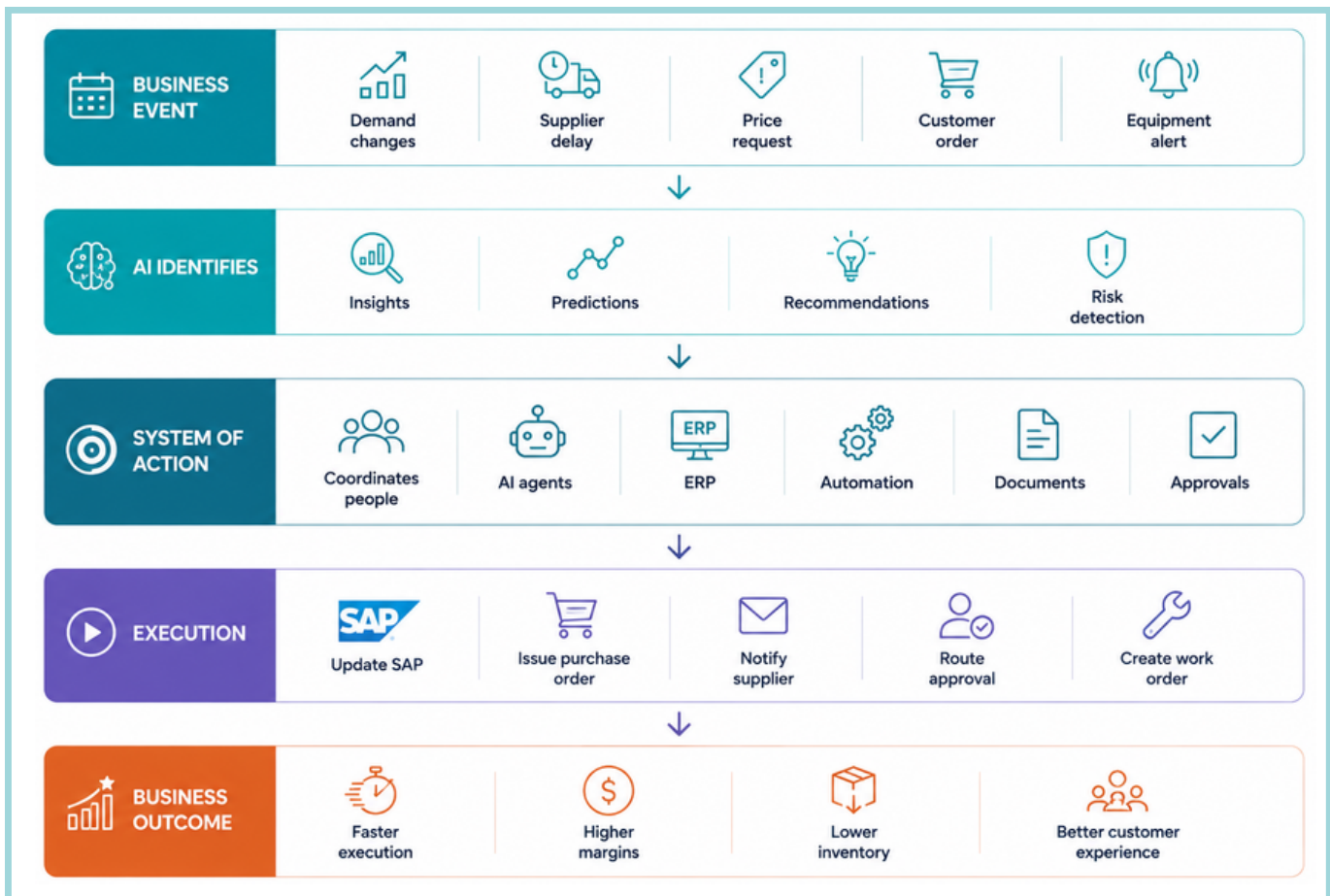

The Same Execution Layer Powers Every Manufacturing Workflow.

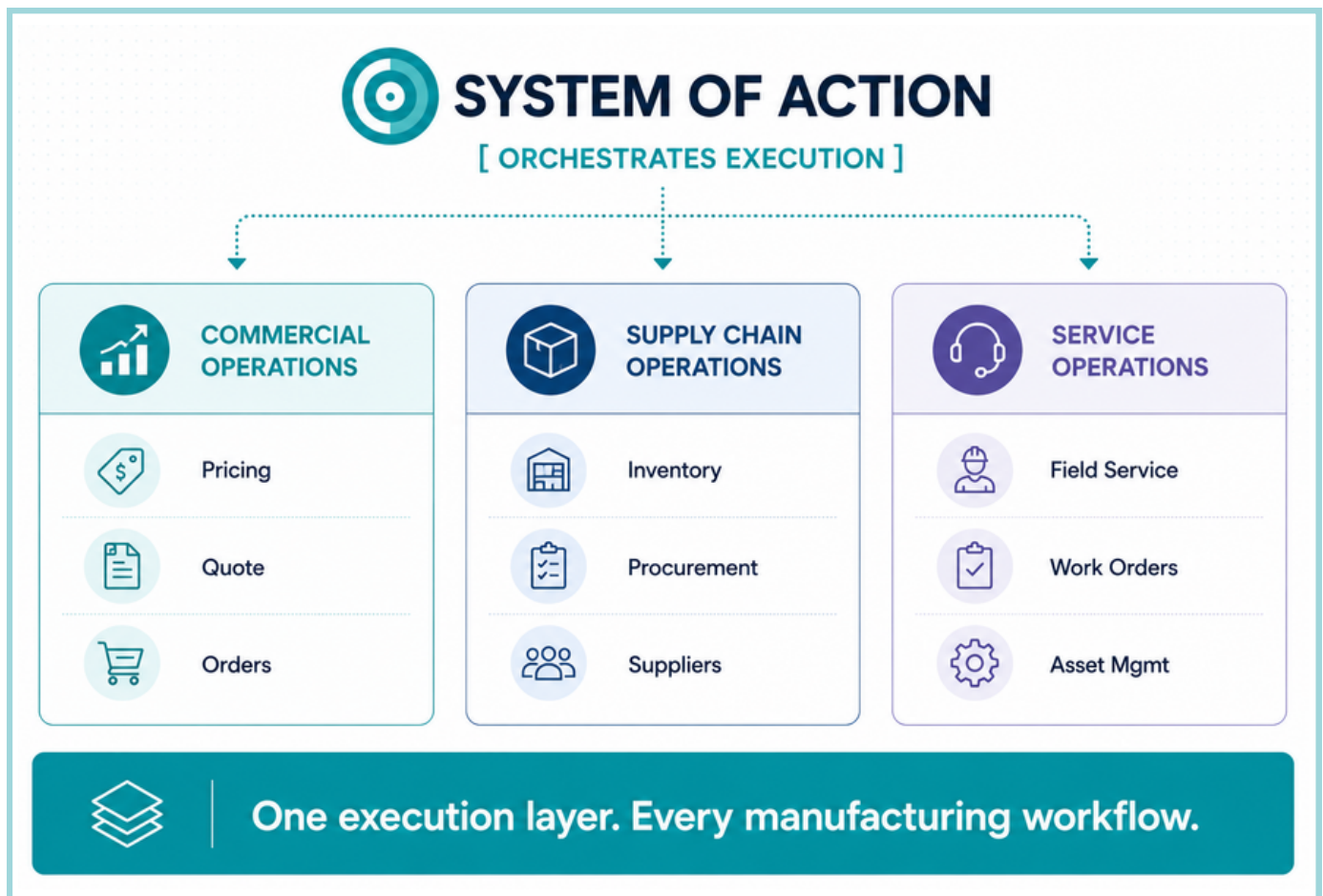
Rather than building separate automation for every department, manufacturers use one System of Action to orchestrate work across the enterprise.
