

Rector's Decree No. 135 of 19 July 2023

SUBJECT: Establishment of the 39th PhD cycle, appointment of course coordinators and call for applications.

THE RECTOR

- CONSIDERED** the Statutes of Universitas Mercatorum;
- CONSIDERED** Law no. 240 of 30 December 2010 on "*Rules on the organization of universities, academic staff and recruitment, as well as delegating to the Government to promote the quality and efficiency of the university system*";
- CONSIDERED** Law n. 232 of 11/12/2016, cd. Law of Stability 2017, in particular paragraph 262 which reads verbatim: "*Students of PhD programmes who are not scholarship recipients are exempt from paying fees or contributions to the University*";
- CONSIDERED** D.M. 14 December 2021, n. 226 "*Regulations on the accreditation of doctoral establishments and courses and criteria for the establishment of doctoral courses by accredited bodies*";
- CONSIDERED** the Regulations of the Universitas Mercatorum in the field of PhD approved by the Academic Senate at its meeting on 14 March 2022 and by the Board of Directors at its meeting on 23 March 2022;
- CONSIDERED** Decree M.U.R. No. 247 of 23/02/2022 by which the annual amount of the scholarship was restated, with effect from 1 July 2022, to € 16,243.00 gross of the social security costs to be borne by the applicant in addition to the costs borne by the Institution;
- CONSIDERED** the Guidelines for the accreditation of PhD students issued with D.M. n. 301 of 22/03/2022 - pursuant to art. 4, paragraph 3, of D.M. 226/2021 (hereinafter "LG - DM226");
- CONSIDERED** Note No. 3992 of 02 March 2023 of the MUR concerning "*Computerized procedure for the accreditation of doctoral courses - XXXIX cycle. Opening note*";
- CONSIDERED** the D.M. 117 of 02/03/2023 with which they have been attributed, for the year 2023/2024, to the PNRR, Mission 4 "Education and research", Component 2 "From Research to Enterprise" - Investment 3.3 "Introduction of innovative doctorates that respond to the needs of innovation of enterprises and promote the recruitment of researchers from enterprises", of n. 13,292 (13,000 to one hundred and ninety-two) doctoral scholarships of three years for the frequency of paths for innovative doctorates (hereafter, also courses) accredited ex DM 45/2013 XXXVII cycle - Academic Year 2021/2022 and to be accredited ex DM 226/2021 XXXIX cycle - Academic Year 2023/2024;
- CONSIDERED** Table A of the above mentioned D.M. 117/2023 which assigns, among other things, to Universitas Mercatorum, an actual PNRR budget of € 1,800,000.00 and/or a co-financing of 50% with enterprises of € 1,800,000,00, for the allocation of a total of n. 60 scholarships from the PNRR;
- CONSIDERED** the Ministerial Decree of 2 March 2023, n. 118 with which they have been assigned, for the year 2023/2024, for the year 2023/2024, to apply to the PNRR, Mission 4, component 1 "Strengthening the offer of education services: from kindergartens to the University" - Investment 3.4 "Teaching and advanced university skills" and Investment 4.1 "Extension of the number of innovative doctorates and doctorates for public administration and cultural heritage of n. 5,478 doctoral grants of three years for the attendance of doctoral courses accredited ex D.M. n. 45/2013 and ex D.M. n. 226/2021 and by accredit ex D.M. n. 226/2021 for doctorates in programs dedicated

	to digital and environmental transitions, for research doctorates PNRR, for doctorates for public administration and for doctorates for cultural heritage;
CONSIDERED	Table A of D.M. 118/2023 which assigns, among other things, to Universitas Mercatorum, a financial endowment of € 1,500,000.00 for the allocation of a total of n. 25 scholarships on the PNRR, of which n. 2 scholarships on the PNRR, M4C1 - Inv. 3.4 "Digital and environmental transitions", n. 11 on PNRR, M4C1 - Inv. 4.1 "PNRR Search", n. 10 on PNRR, M4C1 - Inv. 4.1 "Public administration" and No. 2 on the PNRR, M4C1- Inv. 4.1 "Cultural heritage";
CONSIDERED	the resolutions of the Colleges of Teachers approving proposals for confirmation of accreditation for the 39-year cycle of their PhD Courses, with administrative headquarters at Universitas Mercatorum, prepared by the relevant Coordinators in accordance with the requirements of the MUR and indicated in the CINECA tab;
CONSIDERED	the Convention for the activation and operation of the PhD course in <i>Big Data and Artificial Intelligence</i> with the San Raffaele Telematic University, from the 39th cycle;
CONSIDERED	the Convention for the activation and operation of the PhD course in <i>Business Finance Management and Crisis Prevention</i> with the Pegasus Telematic University, as of the 38th cycle;
CONSIDERED	the expressions of interest and the agreements concluded for the activation and the financing, with the enterprises interested in co-financing scholarships of doctorate as foreseen by the aforementioned D.M. 117/2023;
CONSIDERED	the resolutions of the Academic Senate and the Board of Directors of 23 and 27 June 2023 respectively on the establishment of the 39-person PhD courses with administrative headquarters at Universitas Mercatorum;
CONSIDERED	that the decrees for the accreditation of doctoral courses of the Universitas Mercatorum are being issued;
DEEMED	the need to open the selection procedure for the award of these doctoral grants;
RESERVED	the results of the checks by the MUR and ANVUR pursuant to art. 7 of DM 117/2023, paragraphs 10 and 11, and pursuant to art. 11 of DM 118/2023, paragraphs 6 and 7;
RESERVED	any changes and additions;

DECREE

For the reasons set out in the preamble:

ART. 1

The institution, for the academic year 2023/2024, the 39th cycle of the PhD Course with administrative headquarters at the Telematic University *Universitas Mercatorum*, subject to accreditation or verification of the maintenance of accreditation requirements by the Ministry of Universities and Research.

ART. 2

For each PhD Course activated for the 39th cycle, the professor indicated in the attached Description Sheet of the Course is appointed as Coordinator of the Course (Annexes B.1, B.2, B.3), an integral part of this call. The appointed Coordinator shall remain in office for the period corresponding to the legal duration of the Doctoral Course activated for the 39th cycle, that is for the academic period 2023/24 - 2025/26.



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ART. 3

The competition, by titles and exams, for admission to the PhD Courses - 39 years - of three year duration, the details are given in the attached notice that is an integral part of this decree.
The deadline for applications is **28 August 2023 at 12:00 (Italian time)**.

CALL FOR APPLICATIONS, BASED ON QUALIFICATIONS AND EXAMS, FOR ADMISSION TO THE PHD COURSES - 39TH CYCLE

ADMINISTRATIVE HEADQUARTERS AT THE TELEMATIC UNIVERSITY "UNIVERSITAS MERCATORUM"

ART. 1

Establishment and call for competition

1. The 39th cycle of PhD Courses with administrative headquarters at the Telematic University *Universitas Mercatorum* is hereby instituted, of three years, subject to accreditation and verification of the maintenance of accreditation requirements by the Ministry of Universities and Research.
2. Pending the above-mentioned accreditation procedure for the 39th cycle, a call for applications, based on qualifications and exams, is hereby issued for admission to the following three-year PhD courses with administrative headquarters at the Telematic University *Universitas Mercatorum*:
 1. PhD Course in associated form in "*Big data and artificial intelligence*";
 2. PhD Course in associated form in "*Financial Business Management and Crisis Prevention*";
 3. PhD Course in non-associated form in "*Sustainability and ESG agenda*".
3. The PhD Courses will start from 1 December 2023 and will end on 30 November of the third year of the course, unless indicated by the MUR and ANVUR.
4. For each PhD Course referred to in paragraph 2 above, a specific Descriptive Sheet (Annexes B.1, B.2, B.3) is attached to the present call, which is an integral part of it and which contains:
 - Coordinator and administrative headquarters of the PhD Course;
 - the *curricula*, if any;
 - the total number of positions offered in the call for applications and their type;
 - the number of scholarships and their type (including the indication of scholarships with a restricted topic);
 - the admission requirements;
 - the methods of selection;
 - the University web page dedicated to the Doctorate referred to in paragraph 2 above, where any useful information can be found with reference to the training course, the competition calendar and any notification useful for candidates.
5. The number of places and scholarships indicated in the descriptive sheets attached to this call may be increased following any additional financial resources of the University, regional and/or national and/or European and/or international and/or other external subjects; of each grant will be given appropriate publicity on the University's website at the following link: <https://www.unimercatorum.it/iscrivarsi-a-un-dottorato>.
6. Any additional positions or scholarships, subject to the acquisition of the necessary funding

by external subjects and the signing of the relevant agreement, will be made known by a subsequent rectoral decree published on the University institutional website.

7. The Administration reserves the right to revoke this notice of competition, to suspend or postpone the competitive tests or to suspend or not proceed with the admission of the winners or to suspend or not to award all the scholarships provided for in the competition notice itself, due to needs currently not assessable or foreseeable. In particular, the Administration reserves the right not to award scholarships or to suspend the disbursement following the occurrence of unforeseen or foreseeable causes that will lead to the disappearance of both public and private external financing.
8. This call, drawn up in Italian and translated into English, is published electronically on the institutional website of the Telematic University *Universitas Mercatorum* following link: <https://www.unimercatorum.it/isciversi-a-un-dottorato>; this notice is an official notification to interested parties for all the information contained in it, **therefore candidates will not receive further communications.**

The notice of this call will also be published on the European website *Euraxesse* and on the Ministry of Universities and Research website.

Any corrections will be made known, exclusively, with publication on the aforementioned institutional website of the University.

ART. 2

Admission requirements

1. Applicants for admission to the PhD courses indicated in Art. 1, paragraph 2, of this call are entitled to apply, regardless of age or nationality, if they possess one of the following qualifications:
 - a Postgraduate or Master's Degree achieved pursuant to Italian Ministerial Decree number 270/2004 (replacing 509/1999);
 - a University Degree with a minimum duration of four years, achieved in compliance with the previous regulations;
 - an academic qualification equivalent to an Italian degree with at least four years duration achieved at international universities.
2. Those who will obtain the qualification required for admission **by the deadline of 31 October 2023** may also submit the application. In this case, the admission to the selection will be arranged "with reservation" and the candidate will be required to submit to the PhD Office by e-mail to the address dottorati@unimercatorum.it, under penalty of forfeiture, a replacement declaration of certification by the same undersigned, pursuant to art. 46 of the DPR 28.12.2000, n. 445 within 5 days of obtaining the title.
For these candidates for the purpose of participation in the competition will be evaluated the weighted average of the marks of the exams taken and the writing of the thesis being filed.
3. **Any additional requirements required for admission to the selection, subject to exclusion, are indicated in the Descriptive Sheets attached to this notice. The Commission is responsible for verifying that these requirements exist.**
4. All candidates are admitted to the selection procedure subject to verification of the self-certified declarations in compliance with Italian Presidential Decree number 445/2000 and its subsequent amendments. The University is entitled, at any time during the proceedings, even after the start of the Doctoral Courses, to perform inspections on the authenticity of the



declarations submitted and to request the presentation of the original documents. The Administration is entitled to order, at any time, with justified provisions, the exclusion of candidates from the competitive procedure or the forfeiture of admission to the Doctoral Course, for breach of the requirements prescribed by this call, without prejudice to the criminal liability resulting from false declarations. This measure is notified to the interested party with a registered letter with acknowledgement of receipt.

ART. 3

Academic qualification obtained abroad

1. Applicants holding a foreign academic qualification [equivalent to a *laurea specialistica / magistrale / vecchio ordinamento (degree obtained under the previous degree regulations)*] may submit an application for admission, attaching the qualifications obtained accompanied by an Italian or English translation by the competent diplomatic or consular representations or by an official translator. Such applicants are admitted to take part in the competition subject "to reservation" and will be excluded from the competition or, if they are successful, from the PhD programme in which they are enrolled, if it is found, following verification, that their qualifications do not meet the requirements hereunder and therefore do not permit enrolment in the PhD programme.
2. For applicants holding a foreign qualification that has not already been declared equivalent, it will be necessary to send:
 - Bachelor's degree and Master's Degree which gives access to the PhD in the country of origin, issued by an officially recognized academic institution, with its final vote;
 - Certificate of the proficiency exams (Transcripts) taken during the first and second level university course with relative vote.

These documents must be written in an Italian or English language, otherwise they will be excluded from the competition. In cases where the official documentation issued by the university where the qualification was obtained is not in English, the candidate must also attach a certified translation in Italian or English.

3. The academic qualification obtained abroad must be comparable, in period of study, level and disciplinary field, to an Italian second-level academic qualification.
4. The suitability of the foreign qualification is determined by the PhD programme admission committee, in accordance with the applicable regulations in force in Italy and in the country where the qualification was awarded, as well as with the applicable international treaties or agreements on the recognition of qualifications for the continuation of university studies.
5. Candidates holding the qualification obtained in foreign universities, if winners, will have to submit within the deadline for registration the degrees translated, legalized in Italian and accompanied by "*Dichiarazione di valore in loco*" (Declaration of Value) issued by the competent Italian Representations of the country in which the qualification was obtained, alternatively a so-called "*Attestato di comparabilità*" (Statement of Comparability of the foreign academic qualification) issued by the ENIC-NARIC centre in Italy (CIMEA), containing all the information necessary for the evaluation of the qualification.

ART. 4

Application for Admission

1. The application to participate in the selection, complete with the required documentation,



under penalty of exclusion, has to be compiled and submitted exclusively by electronic transmission, using the dedicated on-line procedure, which is available at: <https://pica.cineca.it/unimercatorum/dottorato-ciclo-39/> **from 12:00 (Italian time) 20 July 2023 and no later than 12:00 (Italian time) 28 August 2023.**

At the end of the procedure, the confirmation of the application will be sent to the e-mail address indicated by the candidate; it is the responsibility of the candidate to verify the correct receipt of the confirmation email. After that, the system will close automatically and will not allow the application.

The application submitted in different ways will not be taken into account for the purposes of participation in the competition. In any case, additions to the documentation will not be allowed after the above indicated deadline of the call.

2. Applicants are invited to complete their application to participate in the competition well in advance of the end of this call. It is the responsibility of the candidates to verify the correct conclusion of the procedure. Complaints will not be accepted for any malfunction of the computer system due to technical problems and/ or overloads of the communication line and/ or application systems.
3. The application must be accompanied by the documents, titles, the research project and the photocopy, in color, of a valid ID, in electronic PDF format. It will be the responsibility of the candidate to check the correct loading of the requested, taking into account that will be evaluated, for the purpose of participation in the competition, only and exclusively the titles correctly attached. The Administration assumes no responsibility in case it is impossible to read the documentation presented in electronic format due to corrupted files or folders.
4. When completing the online application, the candidates must choose the PhD course(s) and the scholarship(s) with a specific topic for which they intend to compete. Each candidate can compete for a maximum number of three topics. If there is an interest in competing for more research topics (maximum 3), it is mandatory to indicate the order of preference which will not be binding for the award of the scholarship as explained in the following art. 7. Candidates wishing to compete for more than one PhD program must complete an application for each course.
5. For all legal purposes, the application is to be considered as a self-certification, pursuant to articles 46 and 47 of Italian Presidential Decree 445/200, as amended, of the data contained therein and the documents attached to the same.
6. Candidates with disabilities and / or diagnosed with specific learning disabilities (SLD) who intend request the assistance required by current legislation, must fill in the "Invalidity Declaration" section within the online pre-registration application. Disability certifications must be:
 - issued by INPS, pursuant to Law 118/1971 (civil invalidity) and / or
 - issued by the competent public health structure of the territory according to Law 104/92 and subsequent additions (handicap certificate).SLD certifications must:
 - be issued by structures of the SSN or by accredited authority not earlier than 3 years from the date of taking the admission interview, except in the case of certifications drawn up after the age of majority (Article 3 of Law 170/2010 and subsequent State Agreement - Regions of 24/07/2012);



- meet the criteria of the 2011 Consensus Conference;
- be complete with diagnosis and nosographic reference codes, according to Law 170/2010.

Candidates with disabilities and / or with SLD resident in foreign countries, who intend to take advantage of the measures referred to in the previous paragraph, must submit a certificate certifying the status of disability or SLD issued in the country of residence, accompanied by a certified translation into the language Italian or English. The Commissions in charge of examining the certifications referred to in the preceding paragraphs ascertain that the foreign documentation certifies a specific disability or learning disorder recognized by Italian law.

ART. 5

Documents to be attached to the application

1. For the purposes of the assessment of qualifications, candidates must attach the following documents in PDF format to the application form:
 - Copy of a valid identity document;
 - *Curriculum vitae et studiorum*, dated and signed and containing the consent to the processing of personal data in accordance with the relevant legislation;
 - Title of study showing the study plan, the exams passed with relative marks and the passing of the final exam with relative vote. The document must be produced in certified copy or in simple copy, the conformity of which to the original is declared by the candidate in the telematic application.
 - Research project related to the theme of the PhD, drawn up by the candidate according to the standard model attached to this call (Annex A);
 - List of any publications accompanied by their abstracts;
 - Any documents attesting to the knowledge of the foreign language indicated in the descriptive sheet of the doctorate chosen by the candidate, as well as any additional linguistic knowledge or computer skills;
 - Any documents related to further training;
 - Possible letter of references of university lecturer with criteria of commission ASN or qualified international researcher;
 - Paper list of titles and publications annexed to the application.
2. Documents must be produced in Italian or English. Any document in a language other than Italian or English must be accompanied by a legalized translation into Italian or English, otherwise the same cannot be evaluated.
3. Applicants undertake full and exclusive responsibility for the truthfulness of the information entered in the application form and the content of the annexes. The University reserves the right to carry out the checks and verifications envisaged by the applicable regulations and reserves the right to adopt at any time, subject to adequate justification, the measures for excluding any applicants who have not complied with the provisions of this Call or who do not meet the requirements laid down herein.

ART. 6

Admission Tests and Evaluation of Qualifications

1. The admission tests to the PhD courses are designed to determine the candidate's ability to undertake scientific research and the candidate is also required to demonstrate a good

knowledge of the language indicated in the schedule of each PhD course attached to this call for applications.

2. The selection procedure involves **the assessment of qualifications**, including the mandatory submission of a **research project**, as well as an **interview**.
3. The above-mentioned **Research Project**, of no more than 800 words, drawn up in accordance with the Standard Model (Annex A), must indicate:
 - a) Title of the research project;
 - b) Possible Topic of research linked to PNRR;
 - c) Project objectives, related to the theme of the PhD Course and/or to the binding research topics indicated in the sheets of each PhD Course attached;
 - d) State of the art;
 - e) Methodology and relative timing on the 3 years of the doctorate;
 - f) Expected results and possible risk strategies;
 - g) Estimation of foreign period;
 - h) Degree of organizational and financial feasibility;
 - i) Possible involvement of Italian and/or international companies and/or research structures and/or researchers, with relative reasons;
 - j) Essential bibliography up to a maximum of 12 titles (outside the 800 words).
4. If the candidate is admitted to the PhD course, the research project submitted by the candidate does not normally represent a binding work programme; On the other hand, if a candidate is admitted to the PhD course with the award of a restricted scholarship, funded by an external public or private Entity, following the approval of a specific research project, the work programme is considered binding for the candidate, subject to any changes, during the course of the research, agreed in advance with the tutor and the Coordinator of the PhD Course and authorised by the funding Entity.
5. The **competition calendar will be published on the website of the University** indicated in the Description Sheets, by the President of the Examination Commission.
The publication of this notice, of the data contained in the descriptive sheets and of the competition calendar has the value of full notification. Therefore, competitors who have not been notified of their exclusion from the competition will have to take, without any further notice, the examination test according to the calendar indicated.
Any changes to the date and time of the selection tests will be published on the same website of the University indicated in the Description Sheets
6. The Examination Committee, referred to in the following Art. 7, for the evaluation of candidates has **100 points** divided as follows:

QUALIFICATIONS	Max 30 points
RESEARCH PROJECT	Max 20 points
INTERVIEW	Max 50 points

The minimum score to enter the interview is at least **15 points**.

7. For the purpose of evaluating the qualifications, without prejudice to the autonomy of the Examination Board, the following documents will be taken into account:



- a) **University degree (*laurea*)** showing the study plan, the exams passed with relative marks and the passing of the final exam with relative vote (or, for undergraduate candidates only, valid certificate of enrolment, showing the study plan, the exams passed with relative marks) **Max 8 points**
- b) **Graduation grade** (or, failing this, for only candidates graduating the weighted average grade of the exams taken) **Max 8 points**
- c) **Publications in peer-reviewed journals or series** (already published or with publisher's certificate, of acceptance and forthcoming publication) **Max 4 points**
Patents (evaluable if with specific relevance to the topics covered by the PhD)
- d) **Postgraduate degrees**, such as: *diploma di specializzazione* (postgraduate diploma), postgraduate programmes, master's degree requiring a period of study of at least one year (awarded by qualified universities or research institutions if they are consistent with the topics covered by the PhD) **Max 4 points**
- e) **Any professional and research experience** (collaboration grants for research activities, periods of study and research abroad -including the Erasmus programme -, awards from national and international scientific societies) **Max 3 points**
- f) **Language certification** (issued according to the Common European Framework of Reference for Foreign Languages and, for foreign students, also the certification of the Italian language at least level B1) **Max 2 points**
- g) **Other documents deemed useful** (participation in research activities, reference letter of university lecturer with criteria ASN commission or by qualified international researcher, appointment as a subject scholar) **Max 2 points**

For those who graduate by **31 October 2023**, the weighted average grade of the examinations, which replaces the graduation grade in b), must be determined by:

1. multiplying each exam grade by the respective number of credits (30 "cum laude" counts as 30);
2. adding up all the results obtained;
3. dividing the result by the sum of the useful credits (those of the graded examinations);
4. multiplying the average obtained by 110 and dividing the result by 30 (thus obtaining the grade in one hundred and tenths).

In accordance with the principle of loyal cooperation, the applicant must provide all the information necessary to enable the Commission to carry out the evaluation of the qualifications in a comprehensive and objective manner. It is understood that where the information provided by the candidate is deficient, inaccurate or incomplete, the Commission will not be able to give a score.

8. For the **Research** Project, in a short form (no more than 800 words) prepared according to the



indications in paragraphs 2 and 3 of this article and the format, the evaluation criteria are:

- a) *Relevance to the themes of the PhD Course* **Max 10 points**
 - b) *Scientific value, originality, innovation and articulation of the proposal* **Max 5 points**
 - c) *Consistency with one of the binding research topics indicated in the card of each PhD Course* **Max 5 points**
10. For the **assessment of the oral test** (interview), without prejudice to the autonomy of the Admission Commission, the evaluation criteria are:
- a) *Ability to answer in-depth questions about the research project presented* **Max 30 points**
 - b) *Adequate knowledge of the topics of the PhD Course* **Max 10 points**
 - c) *Clarity of presentation, skills of synthesis and critical approach* **Max 5 points**
 - d) *Ability to conduct part of the test in the foreign language indicated in the PhD Sheet* **Max 5 points**
10. During the interview will be verified the knowledge of the foreign language indicated in the descriptive sheets (Annexes B.1, B.2 and B.3) and, for foreign students, also the knowledge of the Italian language.
11. Candidates must present a valid identification document to take the tests.
12. The interview is public, and will take place on the day and at the appointed time and in the presence of one or more candidates who wish to attend voluntarily. It is forbidden to make the audio/video recording of the interview, as well as to disseminate the audio/video recording made.
13. The absence of the candidate on the day and time of the oral test will be considered as a waiver of the competition, whatever the cause.
14. The interview is considered passed if the candidate has a minimum overall score of **35 points** out of 50.

ART. 7

Examination Boards and related formalities

1. For admission to each PhD Course, the Examiner Commission will be appointed by Rector's Decree, composed according to the art. 14 of the University Regulations containing the rules on PhD cited in the preambles.
2. The composition of the individual Commissions will be published on the University website at the following link: <https://www.unimercatorum.it/iscriversi-a-un-dottorato>.
3. The individual admissions Committees are in charge of, in addition to other duties, the following:



- posting of the selection calendar on the University's website indicated in the descriptive sheets attached to this call;
- to define the procedures for carrying out the test (by videoconferencing or in presence);
- the publication of the results of the evaluation of qualifications and the research project;
- the timely publication of each evaluation (qualification evaluation and interview) on the University's website indicated in the Description Sheets according to the timing of the competition calendar.

4. Candidates will not receive any notice of the examination.

5. The Commission shall propose the allocation of the type of scholarship for each candidate, taking into account the evaluation of the research project, the evaluation of qualifications and the interview, in accordance with art. 6 above, and the possession of specific requirements required by the type of financing.
6. The identification of PhD students who are recipients of PNRR scholarships is done in relation to the ability of the doctoral research project to contribute to the achievement of the aims and objectives proper to the National Recovery and Resilience Plan (PNRR).
7. The preference expressed on the topic of the scholarship will not be binding on the commission.
8. The work of the Committee is scheduled to start, by 5 September 2023 at the latest, with the holding of the preliminary meeting to establish the criteria and procedures for the assessment of the selection examinations, in order to guarantee the proper and transparent comparative assessment of the candidates, and the work has to be concluded by 25 September 2023 at the latest.
9. The Examination Committee, at the end of the examination tests, draws up the general ranking of merit relating to the PhD course on the basis of the scores obtained by the candidates. Candidates are admitted to the Course in order of ranking up to the competition of the number of places available.
10. In the event that one or more of the vacancies available in a doctoral course are not submitted, in the event of resignation or the absence of suitable candidates on the same list, and in any case, the Commission may reserve the right to allocate the post, after verification of the requirements, to the first of the eligible persons.

ART. 8

Approval of the general ranking of merit

1. The Rector's decree establishes the general ranking list of merit for each selection, both ordinary and reserved, formulated in descending order of the total score of each candidate and indicating the type of grant awarded. If there is an equal number of points between two or more candidates, the deserving candidate with the youngest age has priority. The successful candidate who does not accept the type of scholarship awarded is not eligible for other types of scholarships on the same PhD Course and forfeits admission to the Course.
2. The general ranking lists of merit referred to above relating to individual selection procedures for admission to the Research Doctorate Courses - 39th cycle - are approved by Rectoral Decree **within 30 days of the completion of the work of the admissions Committees, and are**



published on the University website <https://www.unimercatorum.it/isciversi-a-un-dottorato>. This posting serves as official notification to interested parties, **therefore, no personal communications are sent to candidates.**

Art. 9

Enrolment in the PhD Course

1. The **successful candidates**, with or without scholarship, are required to apply for enrolment and submit the relevant declarations within the mandatory period indicated at the time of publication of the ranking list, exclusively in compliance with the operating procedures that are going to be published **on the University website**, in the dedicated section, at the following link: <https://www.unimercatorum.it/isciversi-a-un-dottorato>.
2. **Candidates who do not proceed to enrol by the established deadline are automatically and effectively considered to have forfeited their right to enrol**, and the vacancies are assigned to candidates with a useful position in the ranking list of merit.
3. **Successful candidates who complete their degree by the deadline of 31 October 2023, are required to self-certify their graduation by the specified deadline at the following e-mail address: dottorati@unimercatorum.it.**
4. If a candidate is successful in more than one ranking in different Doctoral Research Courses, the candidate is required to exercise the option for only one PhD Course.
5. Foreign citizens, who are not already legally resident in Italy, must present their residence permit within the deadline for registration.
6. Candidates who were found to be **eligible but who were not successful are invited to consult the information on the web page** specified above in order to obtain useful information on any changes in the general ranking lists of merit.

ART.10

Scholarships

1. Candidates are admitted to the courses according to the order of each ranking, in the manner defined in the previous Art.9.
2. The scholarships, which can also be financed with the help of several sources of funding, have a total duration of at least three years. They are allocated, for the entire duration of the course, to PhD course participants according to the order defined in the general ranking list of merit and are renewed, annually, after positive verification of the completion of the programme of activities planned for each year. The procedures for renewal are established by the Faculty Board and codified in the course regulations. If the scholarship is not renewed, or if the student renounces it, the unused amount of the scholarship is reinvested by the University for the funding of PhDs.
3. The amount of the scholarship for the academic year 2022/2023 is € 16,243.00, gross of social security charges payable by the beneficiary, and is paid in monthly instalments.
4. Scholarships granted for research activities abroad and authorised by the Teaching Board will be 50% higher, for a total period of 6 months.



5. 6. For research activities in Italy and abroad, in addition to the scholarship, the beneficiary is also granted a budget equal to 10% of the scholarship for each year of the programme. This budget is also granted to PhD students without a scholarship and will be allocated to the latter to support research and training activities.
6. If you have already received a grant for a PhD programme, you may not apply for a second grant.
7. Scholarships may not be combined with other scholarships for any reason whatsoever, except for those awarded by national or foreign institutions to supplement, stays abroad, training or research activities of scholarship holders abroad. Scholarships for PhD attendance are compatible with Erasmus scholarships.
8. The PhD scholarship is subject to the payment of separately managed INPS social security contributions, pursuant to article 2, paragraph 26, of Italian Law number 335, to the extent of two-thirds paid by the administration and one-third by the holder of the scholarship. PhD students benefit from the protections and related rights.
9. The PhD student is authorized by the Coordinator, subject to the approval of the supervisor/s for the following expenses:
 - a) postings of PhD students in Italy and abroad, registrations to conferences, seminars, etc;
 - b) purchase of research items relevant to the field of study (e.g. chemical reagents, electrical and electronic equipment, stationery, etc.);
 - c) goods/equipment (e.g. hardware, software, scientific equipment). All goods must be inventoried and as such, at the end of the PhD cycle, will remain the property of the University. Of course, no goods/equipment may be purchased for personal use (e.g.: mobile phones, tablets, etc.);
 - d) publication costs;
 - e) research-specific training (e.g. language programmes, higher education programmes, etc.);
 - f) events in the organisation of which PhD students are directly involved (e.g. PhDay);
 - g) if unused funds are available, the Teaching Committee may resolve to use them to pay for the travel expenses of foreign committee members for the discussion of the dissertation, which involves the award of an additional foreign qualification to the PhD student (e.g. doctor europaeus).
10. PhD students authorised abroad for research periods during which they benefit from the grant increase are also entitled to reimbursement per posting, in order to encourage international exchanges.

ART.11

Taxes and contributions

1. **No later than the enrolment deadline**, successful applicants, whether Italian or foreign and with or without a scholarship, are required to pay the service fee of € 50.00 and the regional university tax, which in the 2022/2023 academic year, amounts to € 140.00.
2. PhD students with a disability of at least 66% are exempt from paying the regional fee but are required to pay the service fee of € 50.00.

ART.12 Obligations and rights of PhD students

1. The doctoral course requires an exclusive and full-time commitment, without prejudice to *the provisions of article 12, paragraph 4 and article 10, paragraph 2, letter b) of Ministerial Decree 226/2021*. Doctoral candidates with or without a scholarship shall:
 - exclusively commit themselves to completing the training programme decided by the Teaching Committee;
 - continuously attend the programme activities as planned by the Teaching Committee;
 - participate in the common programmes within the PhD programme;
 - submit oral or written reports on their activities and research work;
 - draw up the personal activity reports referred to in paragraph 4 below;
 - comply with all other decisions by the Teaching Committee or provided for in the specifications for the implementation of specific funding to cover the doctoral scholarship;
 - prepare a doctoral thesis, at the end of the programme, with original contributions.
2. The activities of PhD students shall be recorded in special personal registers and include: coursework, research activities, personal study, bibliographic research and research in archives, in-progress verifications, participation in seminars, programmes and conferences, activities at facilities outside the University (other universities, research bodies, businesses), in Italy and abroad, any supplementary teaching and tutoring activities and any other activities decided by the Teaching Committee in relation to the PhD programme. It is absolutely forbidden to carry out doctoral research activities at private bodies or facilities, unless authorised by the Teaching Committee. Violation of this rule entails disqualification from the PhD programme.
3. **In addition to the provisions of this call for applications and the University Regulations governing PhD programmes, PhD recipients are required to comply with the specific provisions stipulated by the funding entities, including the compulsory period to be spent in entities/enterprises in Italy and abroad.**
4. The legitimacy of the different activities carried out by the PhD students is certified by the Coordinators based on the indications provided by the supervisor and by the co-supervisor/s.
5. At the end of each year of the Course, the Faculty Board, based on a detailed report on the activities and research carried out by each PhD student, decides on the admission to the following year or proposes to the Rector the exclusion from the course.
6. For proven reasons, the PhD student may ask the faculty board for an extension of the time allowed for the presentation of the PhD thesis, for a maximum duration of twelve months, without further financial charges.
7. The Faculty Board may decide to extend the duration of the PhD course for a period not exceeding twelve months, for justified scientific needs linked, among other things, to needs in the context of co-safeguards lasting more than three years. or the need for a proven increase in scientific productivity, (for example: for the submission or outcome of a patent application as well as in the event of an extension of the duration of a research project of significant national or international interest); in cases of extension, the corresponding duration of the scholarship must be ensured with funds from the University budget, therefore the motivated proposal for extension of the faculty board will be submitted for the approval of the Board of Directors for



the related financial verification. The beneficiary PhD students are obliged to comply with everything resolved by the faculty with reference to the extended training course, including carrying out the course activities.

8. For proven reasons provided for by current legislation such as maternity, serious illness and civil service, PhD students may request the suspension of the course for a maximum duration of six months. No scholarship or other equivalent funding is envisaged for the duration of the suspension.

The Faculty Board, following communication from the course coordinator, takes note of the suspensions. Suspension of more than thirty days for one of the above-mentioned reasons involves the obligation to fully recuperate the periods of interruption of the activity and, therefore, in such cases, the duration of the educational programme is extended for a period corresponding to the period of the interruption.

9. The extension and suspension periods referred to in paragraphs 6, 7 and 8 of this article may not exceed a total of eighteen months, except in specific cases provided for by law.
10. Without prejudice to the interventions for the right to study as per Italian Legislative Decree dated March 29 2012, number 68.
11. Without prejudice to the application of the rules for the protection of parenthood referred to in the decree of the Italian Minister of Labour and Social Security dated July 12, 2007, published in the Italian Official Gazette of October 23 2007, number 247, PhD students on leave retain the right to the scholarship that will be paid at the end of the suspension period, namely the resumption of the course attendance up to the total duration of the scholarship itself.
12. It is the responsibility of the PhD Course Coordinator to promptly notify the competent office of the interruption of the PhD student's activity for the consequent administrative measures.
13. The PhD student may be authorized by the faculty board to carry out paid activities that allow them to acquire skills relating to the educational environment of the PhD, after evaluating the compatibility of the same activities with the successful performance of the training, teaching and research activities of the PhD course. In such cases, the maximum income limit, which the PhD student can receive as compatible with the scholarship, is equal to the amount of the scholarship itself.
14. For each PhD student, the faculty board normally provides for the carrying out of research and training activities, consistent with the PhD project, at highly qualified institutions abroad, for a total period not exceeding twelve months. This period can be extended up to an overall maximum of eighteen months for PhDs co-supervised with foreign subjects or for those in aggregate form activated pursuant to article 3, paragraph 2, of Italian Ministerial Decree 226/2021. In planning the training activities abroad, the board can take into account the proposal of the supervisor and the co-supervisor/s of the PhD student who must propose the program of activities, the title of the project and the invitation letter from the foreign supervisor. For periods of attendance abroad in the amount the scholarship is increased by 50%.
15. PhD students have an obligation of confidentiality in relation to the research activities carried out with external bodies.
16. The use of research grants by PhD students without a scholarship is allowed as long as the

topic to which the grant refers is similar, in the judgement of the Faculty Board, to the topics of the PhD.

17. PhD students can carry out, as an integral part of the training project, subject to authorization from the faculty board and without any increase in the scholarship: - tutoring, including paid tutoring, of undergraduate and master's degree students; - supplementary teaching activities, within the limit of forty hours for each academic year. For the activities referred to in this paragraph, PhD students are paid the grants referred to in article 1, paragraph 1, letter b), of Italian Decree-Law dated May 9 2003, number 105, converted, with modifications, by Italian Law dated July 11 2003, number 170. 2. The performance of activities must be indicated in staff records. This is without prejudice to specific teaching collaborations provided for by specific national rules for which the related discipline applies. All other forms of teaching are strictly prohibited and it is the responsibility of the Coordinator to supervise compliance with this provision.

All information regarding the administrative aspects of doctoral students, as well as their careers, is published on the University's website: <https://www.unimercatorum.it/ricerca/dottorati-di-ricerca>. The publication referred to above replaces any other communication and, therefore, successful candidates are required to log on to the website referred to above for constant updates.

ART. 13

Final examination and qualification

1. The qualification of *Dottore di Ricerca*, abbreviated as "*Dott. Ric.*" or "Ph.D.", is awarded on the basis of a positive evaluation of a research thesis that contributes to the advancement of knowledge or methodologies in the chosen field of investigation. The PhD thesis must be written in Italian or English. It may also be written in any other foreign language, subject to authorisation by the Teaching Committee.
2. The thesis is discussed at the end of the PhD programme, subject to admission to the final examination by the "examiners"; the thesis discussion may be postponed for up to a maximum of 6 months, if requested by the "examiners", in the event that they deem significant additions or corrections to the thesis to be necessary.
3. As regards the procedures and deadlines for submitting the thesis, PhD students must comply with the provisions of the "University Regulations on PhD Programmes" (*Regolamento di Ateneo*).
4. The title of PhD is awarded by the Rector.

Art. 14

Processing of personal data

1. In compliance with articles 13 and 14 of the GDPR - EU General Data Protection Regulation number 2016/679, the personal data provided by candidates is collected at Universitas Mercatorum, for the purposes of managing the selection and is processed on paper and using an automated database. The provision of such data is mandatory for the purposes of verifying the requirements of participation in the selection and its management.

2. The Data Subject is entitled to the rights specified in Articles 15 to 22 of the previously mentioned EU Regulation 2016/679, which include the right of access to the data concerning the Data Subject, as well as certain complementary rights, including the right to have erroneous, incomplete, or unlawfully collected data rectified, updated, completed, or erased, as well as the right to object for legitimate reasons to their processing.
