While it is known for being a search engine, it has created other breakthrough products such as Gmail, Google Maps, Google Earth, Google Energy and Android.

One of the biggest leaps in search usage came about when they introduced their much improved spell checker giving birth to the "Did you mean..." feature. This instantly doubled their traffic.

In 2011, 96% of Google's \$37.9 billion revenue came from advertising alone.



Integrate Sensibly

The infamous "I feel lucky" is nearly never used. However, in trials it was found that removing it would somehow reduce the Google experience. It was a comfort button for users, so Google kept it.

Google's Android mobile operating system is the world's leading smartphone platform surpassing Nokia and Apple with a 33% share

Google has over 19,000 employees

- · 37% are research staff
 - · 37% are sales staff

Google searches its extensive database of 3 billion web pages every time a query is entered, with the average search taking 0.5 seconds to find the most relevant pages. If you were given the same task only taking a quick one-minute scan over each page the same task would take 5,707 years.

Give users what they want when they want it

The meaning of Google: "Googol" is the mathematical term for a 1 followed by 100 zeros. The term was coined by Milton Sirotta, nephew of American mathematician Edward Kasner, and was popularised in the book "Mathematics and the Imagination" by Kasner and James Newman. Google's play on the term reflects the company's mission to organise the immense amount of information available on the web.

Google might be the only company with the explicit goal to REDUCE the amount of time people spend on its site.

Branson's Virgin brand grew rapidly during the 1980s when he set up Virgin Atlantic Airways. Other brands that have followed since include Virgin Cola, Virgin Vodka, Virgin Mobile, Virgin

hundred others.

His company is called Virgin, because Sir Richard and the other co-founders were all "virgins to business".

Sir Richard's first successful business was at age 16, when he dropped out of secondary school and moved to London to set up a magazine called Student. His next business, a record mail-order company, led to his big break: a chain of record stores called Virgin Megastores, now with over 100 stores worldwide.

He has been involved in a number of world record-breaking attempts, including ocean crossings by both boat and hot air balloon.



Not all of Sir Richard's ventures have been a success: Virgin Trains damaged the company's reputation, as they inherited many of the problems left over from British Rail. He also had to sell Virgin Records in 1992 to keep his airline alive: a move he regretted, resulting in the launch of V2 Records a few years later.

Virgin Galactic plans to make flights to outer space available to the public with tickets priced at US \$200,000. In 2013, the price jumped 25% to \$250,000.

In 2011, Apple made and sold 70 million iPhones, 30 million iPads, and 59 million other products. In 2011, Apple's profit per employee was \$400,000.

Intuitive interfaces

In 2012, Apple sold 17 million iPads in the third quarter, which is an 84% increase year-over-year and a new record for a single quarter. Apple has now shipped more than 84 million iPads since the product launched in 2010.

Each Apple store generates an average of \$11.1 million in revenue and receives 17,000 visitors per week.

In 2013 the App Store offered 900,000 apps for download to iOS users. The App Store saw 50 billion total app downloads, **1.8 billion per month**. The top 200 apps available in the App Store generate **\$5.1** million in daily revenue.

1980's Apple III was the first completely new computer designed by Apple Computer, Inc. It was a commercial failure though, and people continued to buy the older Apple II. Apple listened to its consumers, and were certainly not deterred by failure. Three years later, the Apple IIe was the longest-lived Apple computer of all time, having a run of nearly eleven years.



THE APPRENTICE

By 1994, Trump had eliminated a large portion of his \$900 million personal debt and reduced significantly his nearly \$3.5 billion in business debt. While he was forced to relinquish the Trump Shuttle (which he had bought in 1989), he managed to retain Trump Tower in New York City and control of his three casinos in Atlantic City. He opened a new hotel and office building in New York City in 1996. In 1999, Trump indicated an interest in running for president on the Reform party

ticket in 2000.

In 2003, Trump became the executive producer and host of the NBC reality show, The Apprentice, in which a group of competitors battled for a high-level management job in one of Trump's commercial enterprises. At the end of each episode, Trump eliminates at least one contestant while uttering the catchphrase "You're fired." For the first year of the show Trump was paid \$50,000 per episode, but following the show's initial success, he is now paid a reported \$3 million per episode, making him one of the highest paid TV personalities.

Amazon has steadily branched into retail sales of music CDs, videotapes and DVDs, software, consumer electronics, kitchen items, tools, lawn and garden items, toys & games, baby products, apparel, sporting goods, gourmet food, jewelry, watches, health and personal-care items, beauty products, musical instruments, clothing, industrial & scientific supplies, groceries, and more.

Amazon introduced same-day shipping in seven major U.S. markets more than three years ago, but the e-commerce giant's significant 2012 expansion of its next-day and same-day delivery services was a jolt. Rivals such as Google, eBay and Walmart could only attempt to catch up.

Amazon's initial business plan was unusual: the company did not expect a profit for four to five years. The strategy was effective. Amazon grew steadily in the late 1990s while other Internet companies grew blindingly fast. Amazon's "slow" growth provoked stockholder complaints that the company was not reaching profitability fast enough. Amazon persevered, and, finally, turned its first profit in 2001 of \$5 million on revenues of more than \$1 billion. This was just 1¢ per share, but the profit was symbolically important. Revenues increased thanks to product diversification and an international presence, going up to \$10.7 billion in 2006.





On average eBay has more than 1 billion page views a day, with 600 million listings and 204 million registered users.

eBay has such high margins partly because it has no factories or inventory, but also because its customers do the work.

The world's time zones provide a kind of natural load-balancer. When there's a surge in traffic from US, that's generally when Europe [the second-largest region using eBay] is asleep – and vice versa.

eBay was created in September 1995 by Pierre Omidyar. eBay was initially called Auction Web and was a hobby website and experiment. In Q3 2011, 3 purchases per second were made using eBay mobile devices globally and eBay apps have been downloaded more than 50 million times globally.

eBay hosts nearly four million auctions every day, with almost half a million new items being added for sale every 24 hours.

A place for entrepreneurs to set up shop



In 2006, a luxury 405 foot yacht (sold by a company called 4Yacht) closed on eBay for, wait for it, **\$85 million**.

And that was just the deposit – it's full cost was \$168 million.




