Building Codes Introduction

Introduction to the National Fire Code - 2019 Alberta Edition (NFC(AE)) and the National Building Code - 2019 Alberta Edition (NBC(AE)) explains the purpose and function of each code relative to the position of a fire officer. This course introduces how the codes are developed, updated, and organized, and how they relate to each other. The course outlines the powers of enforcement the fire officer has.

Community Wildfire Protection Plans

Community Wildfire Protection Plans (CWPPs) are a tool used in creating fire-adapted communities in the United States. They are planning processes that bring local partners to a shared vision of wildfire mitigation and adaptation for their community. This course will help fire departments, forest/fire/water-shed community groups, and local government staff to write their own clear and actionable CWPPs. Learn and discuss how to empower leaders to better engage with their communities, identify and prioritize key projects, and open the path to collaboration for successful project implementation.

Traditional Fire Knowledge (October 23)

Learn about the practice of cultural burning that has been carried out since time immemorial by Indigenous peoples. Discover what remains of traditional fire knowledge, and how the practice could positively affect modern wildland firefighting, ecosystem restoration, cultural revitalization, and biodiversity. The Traditional Fire Knowledge course establishes a baseline knowledge for Indigenous peoples regarding historical cultural burning activities across Canada, and how these practices are being acknowledged as a critical part of future of forest management.
