Introduction

What is 21 Days of Prayer and Fasting?

In those days, I, Daniel, was mourning three full weeks. I ate no pleasant food, no meat or wine came into my mouth, nor did I anoint myself at all, till three whole weeks were fulfilled. (Daniel 10:2-3 NKJV)

As a spiritual discipline, we use fasting as a means to humble ourselves before God. As we deny the desires of our flesh, we focus our attention to seek Him. As we rest our body from the food that it craves, we give spiritual food to our spirit and mind.

21 Days of Prayer and Fasting is a spiritual discipline by abstaining from eating at certain times and/or abstaining from consuming certain foods for 21 days.

For every child of God, fasting is a lifestyle and the question is not “do I have to fast?” but “when should I fast”?

The Purpose of 21 Days of Prayer and Fasting

1. To obtain knowledge, understanding and wisdom, along with new dreams and visions, to live the year ahead (Daniel 1:17);
2. To dedicate everything we do in the year 2019 unto Him alone;
3. To discipline our flesh.

Fasting Guideline

1. Abstaining from eating at certain times
 - For those who have previously fasted, it is recommended to skip two meals. The fasting period is from 10pm every night until 6pm the next day. So you have a 4-hour eating window every day, i.e. from 6pm to 10pm every day;
 - For those who have just started fasting, it is recommended to just skip one meal you usually have. You can choose to skip either breakfast, lunch or dinner;
 - For those who are not physically fit, it is recommended to fast up till noon only.
2. Abstaining from consuming certain foods
Avoid consumption of certain meats (e.g. pork, fish, chicken, etc) or others foods that you consume on daily (e.g. chocolate, coffee, tea, bread, etc) for 21 days.

You may do both types of fasting or choose only one, depending on your commitment and personal ability.



Introduction



How do we lead our lives differently during our fast?

1. During 21 days, pray for at least 1 person that is need of Christ. Contact them and set aside time to meet them personally and pray over their needs;
2. Reduce the time we spend on gadget or social media. Set aside routing time to have devotional time with God. Worship Him, read 21 days Prayer and Fasting devotional book and meditate upon His word;
3. During devotional time, spend time to intercede for our family members who are in need of salvation, proclaim blessings upon them, intercede for our country and nation, and proclaim soul harvest upon our local church;
4. Ask God for His wisdom and vision to lead us throughout 2019;
5. Attend corporate prayer at your local and share testimony to strengthen the body of Christ.

Always maintain a clean and compassionate heart. Remember that this prayer and fasting period is not simply a matter of not eating or drinking, but rather giving ourselves to spend more time with God. As we withdraw from our fleshly desires, we draw closer to God. When we focus on God, we will discover that God has been waiting to show us great and wonderful things beyond what we could ever ask or think of (Isaiah 30:18).

DAY 1

January 7



Having Reasonable Expectation

These things I have spoken to you, that in Me you may have peace. In the world you will have tribulation; but be of good cheer, I have overcome the world.”(John 16:33 NKJV)

What is a promise? A promise is a declaration that one will do or refrain from doing something specific. Once a promise is declared, the receiver expects the promisor to fulfill it. For example: when a man and a woman get married, both of them carry different expectations. The man may expect that his wife will be like his own mother. It turns out that she does not have the skill needed and he feels disappointed.

Most Christians get upset with God because they have wrong expectations. Many of us are taught to believe that if we follow Christ, our lives will be free from troubles, whether it's financial, family problem, or ministry issues. However, Jesus did not say that we will have no tribulation (John 16). He said that even when we are faced with tribulations, we can still have peace because He is greater than any challenges we face. Be assured that He is always faithful; He will never leave us nor forsake us.

Today, we have learned not to have wrong expectation from God and His promises. Once we understand it, we will not be disappointed in our walk with Christ.

Prayer:

Lord, I pray for the wisdom to discern between the truth of God's Word and the opinions of men upon me. Help me to reflect on my life. If there is any bitterness that has not been healed, help me to confess and pray for healing; be it relationship with God or other people in my life. In the name of Jesus. Amen.



The Wrong Motivation

DAY 2

January 8

You ask and do not receive, because you ask amiss, that you may spend it on your pleasures. (James 4:3 NKJV)

Every human have desires: whether it's wealth, fame, popularity or success. Is it wrong to ask God to grant our desires? Before we can answer that question, we need to reflect on why we ask God to fulfill our desires.

It is not wrong to have desires and goals in life. However, anything that takes precedence before God is an idol and idolatry is a sin. Idolatry prevents us from having intimacy with God.

When it comes to listening to God's promises, we need to reflect and discern whether it comes from God or our self-centered desires. Am I serving to glorify Christ or to seek approval from other people? Is my giving coming out of willingness of my heart or for a selfish reward? Believe that God loves us and will provide for us. Because of His love, He wants to protect us from anything that will cause separation from Him, even if that means saying no to our desires.

We might wonder why God has not fulfill our requests and desires, why we have not been promoted at our job or in our leadership position. The focus should be on how ready we are to receive those blessings in our life. Every blessing that God has entrusted to us comes with responsibility.

Prayer:

Take time to reflect whether our unfulfilled desires are for our own satisfaction or to be used to glorify Him. Do we have the right heart, motivation, and skills to carry the responsibilities that comes with the blessings? Pray for a pure heart that longs to glorify Him alone. Moreover, pray for wisdom, strength and faithfulness to carry the responsibilities that God has entrusted and will entrust in our life.

DAY 3

January 9

Waiting Is Faith In Action, Not Idling

Be sober, be vigilant; because your adversary the devil walks about like a roaring lion, seeking whom he may devour. Resist him, steadfast in the faith, knowing that the same sufferings are experienced by your brotherhood in the world. But may the God of all grace, who called us to His eternal glory by Christ Jesus, after you have suffered a while, perfect, establish, strengthen, and settle you. (1 Peter 5:8-10 NKJV)

No one likes to wait. Waiting for God's promises to happen is one of the most difficult things to do, especially when we cannot see any changes taking place. For some of us, we might start to doubt whether God still remembers that promise, or whether God even made the promise in the first place.

In order to hold fast to the promise of God, we have to make sure that our focus is not in what we see, but in God's word. What can we do to keep our focus aligned with God's word?

1. Meditate on His Word

We have to focus our minds on what God actually says, not on the opinions of the world. The more we meditate on His Word, the better we become at filtering God's voice from what the world teaches.

2. Pray

When we pray, we shift our focus from the situation to God. Pray not just for a breakthrough to happen, but also to give praises and thanks to God as well. This allows us to set our minds on who God is, His nature, His goodness, and His sovereignty.

3. Be rooted in a Christ-centered community

The devil likes to isolate us from our support system. It is always easier to hunt isolated preys than those in a group. Our testimonies and fellowship within a community will strengthen and encourage us.

We cannot control what happens in our lives, but we can control our response to what happens. Waiting is not staying idle and doing nothing. Waiting is living our lives; believing God is faithful to fulfill His promises.

Prayer:

Dear God, give me faith and patience to wait upon You and Your promises.

January 10



The Radiance Of The Glory Of God

The Son is the radiance of God's glory and the exact representation of his being, sustaining all things by his powerful word. After he had provided purification for sins, he sat down at the right hand of the Majesty in heaven. (Hebrews 1:3 NIV)

Sunlight that we see during the day is an electromagnetic radiation given off by the sun. We cannot see the sun directly. However, we can feel and experience the power of sun through sunlight. Sunlight is the exact representation of the power of the sun.

1. The sun and its sunlight are inseparable. Jesus has existed from the beginning co-eternally with God (John 1:AMP);
2. Sunlight source of radiation is from the power of the sun. Jesus radiates the characters, power, and act of God;

DAY 5

January 11

When we have problem with our health, we go to the doctor to seek consultation for our physical condition. We often look for a business consultant to seek opinion on how to expand our business. To do our taxes properly and efficiently, we go to a tax consultant. To know what is going on in the world, we read media every day. However, news that we read from others might have bias opinion and even use false data. Consultations we received might not be the best solution for our situation.

God communicates to us, offers solutions, and even consults us in our life, characters, and situation through His word. God's word is:

1. Trustworthy. Promises and words spoken by man have limitations. Their advices vary depending on their past experiences, qualifications, or education. God and His word are limitless. His word has existed since the beginning of creation, tested through generations, kingdoms, and accepted in different cultures. His word is the only constant thing in this uncertain world. Like how we can trust that the sun will always rise every morning, we can trust that His word will always prevail.

Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will never pass away. (Matthew 24:35 NIV)

2. Creates things. In the beginning, God spoke and it came to be (Genesis 1). His word creates something out of nothing. Start speaking His word in our life!

3. Holds power. God spoke and the lame walks, the blind sees, and the deaf hears.

Sometimes challenges or disappointments in our life hinder us from seeing and believing that His word will come to pass. However, His word and its fulfillment do not depend on our circumstances but on the faithful character of God. Make a commitment to prioritize reading His word and let His revelations through His word guide our life.

Prayer:

Pray for Psalm 119:9-16 fulfilled in our life. Let His word be our delight and keep our ways pure.

DAY 6

January 12

Name Above All Names



Some trust in chariots and some in horses, but we trust in the name of the LORD our God. (Psalm 20:7 NIV)

Expecting parents always search for the best name for their babies. Name and its meaning are very important because, a person or an object is referred to and described as. Everything on this earth has a name. Whether it's sickness, plantati on, animals, machines, all has a name. Jesus' name is above all names that ever existed, above all principality, and governor. A few of the names of God are:

1. Wonderful counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of peace (Isaiah 9:6);
2. The Lord who heals you (Exodus 15:26). His name is above all sickness whether it's physical, spiritual, or mental illness;

Lord Jesus, we believe through every challenges we will run to Your name and Your glory will be revealed (Proverbs 18:10).

January 16

Reward And Eternal Life



Blessed is the man who endures temptation; for when he has been approved, he will receive the crown of life which the Lord has promised to those who love Him (James 1:12 KJV)

God promises to give us the crown of life. The crown of life is totally different from the eternal life that God also promises to give to his believers (John 3:36). Eternal life is a gift from God, given freely to us. There are no necessary requirements to get this gift other than to just believe in Jesus and accept Him as your Lord and Savior.

Another word for crown is "prize" or "reward." In Greek tradition, a crown is given to the winner of the Olympics. In real life, God will not necessarily put an actual crown on our heads but a "crown" points to special blessing, honor, privilege, or recognition in the future.

To whom is it given? To those who persevere in faith through temptation, tribulation and persecution (James 1:12). The crown is a reward for special acts of service and perseverance under trial. So if you are being insulted because of the name of Christ or you face temptation or persecution, be encouraged and persevere. Like a runner in the race, run in such a way to get the prize (1 Corinthians 9:24).

It is encouraging for us to know that when we are facing trials, there is a safe hand to hold us securely and never abandon us. God will always be there to love, comfort, protect, and restore us. This crown encourages us to remain faithful, stay strong, and keep the course. This is a special way that Jesus rewards and recognizes those who faithfully serve and honor Him.

Prayer:

Dear Lord Jesus, I believe that You are the founder and the perfecter of my faith. Please help me to focus my gaze on You in the moment of trials. Strengthen my faith so I remain faithful in the course. In Jesus name, Amen.



God is Faithful

Don't be afraid, for I am with you. Don't be discouraged, for I am your God. I will strengthen you and help you. I will hold you up with my victorious right hand. (Isaiah 41:10 NLT)

"Life is unfair!" Fires devour cities, people loses their homes, businesses, family members and pets. Gun-shots are everywhere in the news, taking the lives of loved ones. If you have questions or doubt God, frustrated about life, come to God and worship Him. He is faithful. He promises you that He will be there to give assurance and security. He is holding you by your hand, protecting and showing you His righteous path. Trust Him. He is a faithful God.

Prayer:

Dear faithful Father, I run to You as I am. Forgive my attempts to avoid You and try to find solutions to problems my way. I acknowledge that without You I can do nothing. Please open my eyes to see what You are doing, hold my hands and help me to feel Your presence. I declare that when You are present, miracles happen. I want to experience that miracle. I trust You, Amen.

DAY 12

January 18



Keep Being Alert

Not one of all the Lord's good promises to Israel failed; everyone was fulfilled. (Joshua 21:45 NIV)

When someone makes a promise or we make one to someone, the recipient will wait expectantly. A promise is a declaration that one will do or refrain from doing something. Many of the promises we give or receive are broken rather than fulfilled. This creates disappointment but Jesus' promises never do.

We all have been in a moment of waiting in our lives. In times full of uncertainty humans tend to think negatively. However, the Lord reminds us that His Word cannot be altered and He will absolutely keep His Word and fulfill it. It is only the time and the how that we do not know.

God promises to give us hope for the future. We need to trust in the Promise Giver and claim these things. When we ask God to show us what we should do, He will answer us through His Word. Believing When The Answer Seems Too Faraway

Look, the Lord takes notice of his loyal followers, those who wait for him to demonstrate his faithfulness (Psalms 33:18 NET)

Is there something in your life that needed miracle? Have you been walking too long to reach the winning line? Sometimes running towards our breakthrough in life is similar to running in a marathon.

1. "Preparation before the marathon" is our foundation in Christ, keeping values, all the right mindset according to His Words (Proverbs 1:7);
2. "Our energy intake throughout the marathon" is daily relationship with Him. To on His words" (Mathew 4:4) and our iCare those who bears with us along the journey to "fill" us when our appetite is gone;
3. "Keeping stamina throughout the marathon" is enjoying life and maintaining mental health. Fight for the situation, pray and fast to the matter, and rest properly. (Ecclesiastes 3:13, Ecclesiastes 5:19);
4. "Light and proper clothing" is letting go of every bad habit, all the wrong kinds of friends that might weighing our step;
5. Keep records of each breakthroughs (small and big) to see how God is with us all along and to see how far we've gone;
6. Keep alert on every curve and turns. Many things can happen during the long run. Ask for guidance and wisdom;
7. Keep your eyes on the finish line. Knows God spesific promises for the matter, speak on it, set the standard to it.

And in all these, know that God is there in each step to carry us when we're down. For the battles is not ours solely, but ultimately His. To everything He has called us to do, He'll provide everything we need. (Philippians 3:13-14 MKJV)

Prayer:

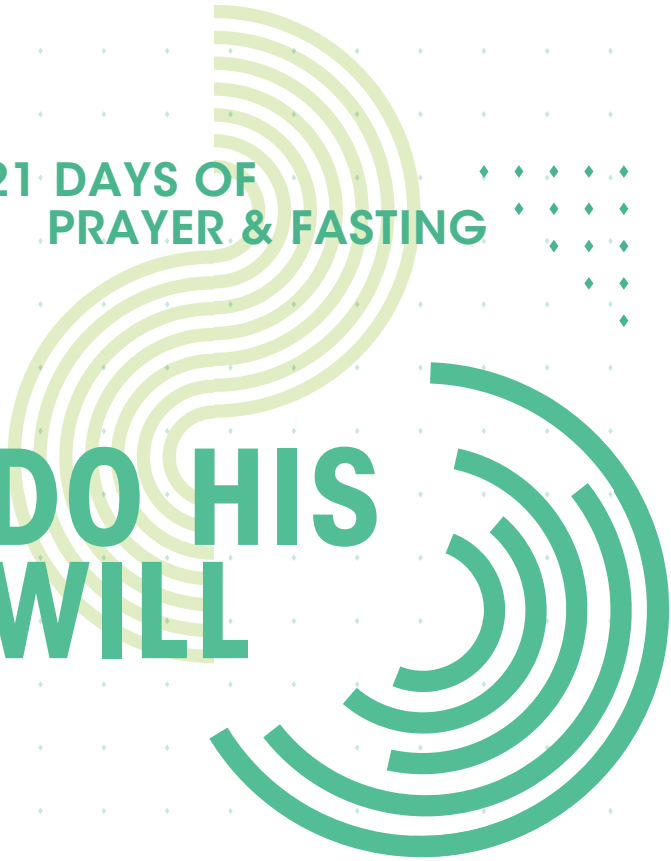
