- Federal Emergency Management Agency announced federal sister assistance is available to the state of California to supplement recovery efforts in the areas affected by wildfires from January 7 and continuing. Individuals and business owners who sustained losses in the designated areas can begin applying for assistance by registering online, calling 1-800-621-3362, or by using the FEMA app.

Transportation

- **Road Closures:** For information about road closures, you may dial 511 or obtain information online at https://roads.dot.ca.gov.
- **Uber**: Residents in Los Angeles County who've been ordered to vacate their homes can get a credit from Uber to get to an evacuation site. The \$40 will only be valid for trips to an active shelter and by using the code **WILDFIRE25**.
- Lyft (announcement): Riders in need can use the code CAFIRERELIEF25, valid for 2 rides up to \$25 each (\$50 total) for 15,000 riders from now until 1/15 at 11:59 p.m. Lyft recommends following local guidelines when going to a public disaster shelter.

WorkplaceSolutions[®]

• YMCA of Metropolitan Los Angeles is <u>opening its locations</u> that aren't affected by the fires for temporary shelter, showers, basic amenities, and mental health support. They are also providing childcare services (5 years and up) for first responders and families affected by the fires.

The Hotel Association of Los Angeles: There is a <u>compiled list of hotels</u> in the Los Angeles area that have rooms available and are offering special rates for fire victims. The list, which is accessible from a Google spreadsheet, is continuously being updated and contains contact information and details on any fire-related special rate.

The City of Anaheim has <u>compiled an online list of hotels</u> within the city that are offering discounted rates for victims who have been displaced by the fire. The 39 hotels offering discounts include Laguna Cliffs Marriott Resort and Spa, Clementine Hotel and Suites Anaheim, Clarion Hotel Anaheim Resort, and Cambria Hotel and Suites Anaheim.

San Diego Tourism Authority has an <u>online list of San Diego-area hotels</u> that are offering special accommodation rates for fire victims. The 34 hotels offering discounts include, Town and Country Resort, Intercontinental San Diego, Bahia Resort Hotel, Rancho Bernardo Inn, La Jolla Shores Hotel and more.

Visit Santa Barbara created <u>an online list of Santa Barbara-area discounted lodging rates</u> for those affected by the fire. Due to high demand, availability may be limited. The organization recommends contacting any of the 23 hotels listed directly for the most up-to-date information on daily activities.

Discover Torrance has created an <u>online tool</u> where fire victims can type in their dates for stay and number of guests to see which hotels in the Torrance area <u>have availability for special</u> <u>rates</u>.
