




Fondue Gondolas







This rich offering means it more than holds its own against the big cities: just take gallery collection Hauser & Wirth, for example, whose new location in St. Moritz followed glitzy openings in New York and Hong Kong.


Once you've browsed the contemporary art in the galleries, head to the region's numerous museums to embark on a journey through the past. The Segantini Museum houses the world's most comprehensive and significant collection of Segantini's works, while the 21 exhibition rooms of the Museum Engiadinais replicate historical interiors from across five centuries. Prior to her death, Swiss artist Mili Weber transformed every part of her St. Moritz home into a lovingly crafted work of art to be enjoyed by visitors.

The operations of the Tschuggen Collection, including the Carlton Hotel, have been completely climate-neutral since 2019. Now, our Green Globe certification – obtained for the first time in 2022 – proves we've gone one step further, marking us as one of the most sustainable premium hotel groups in Switzerland. But our aspirations don't stop there. Having already reduced our use of fossil fuels by 40% in the last 10 years, we're seeking to completely phase out their use by 2025.

Alongside this, we're dedicated to supporting local and national projects in the field of nature conservation. It is in this spirit of sustainability that the Tschuggen Collection celebrated its 100-year anniversary – with a ski race in aid of the natural world. Our Race for Nature, which took place in Arosa in March 2023, raised more than CHF 355,000 for various nature conservation organisations.

Moorland is a natural phenomenon whose significance is vastly underestimated. Healthy, functioning moors have enormous carbon storage potential. Worldwide, moorland soils store 30 per cent of all soil carbon despite covering just three per cent of the total land area.

Despite these benefits, many areas of moorland have been drained in recent decades to allow them to be used for agriculture. Restoration of this moorland is an important tool in the fight against global warming. With this in mind, the Tschuggen Collection has collaborated with the Pro Terra Engiadina Foundation, our partner myclimate, and local farmers and landowners to launch a brand new nature conservation project: the restoration of the lowland moor near Bos-Cha in the Lower Engadin, not far from the Carlton Hotel. The project was conceived based on the following key considerations.

- Restored moorlands improve flood protection, water storage and water purification.
- Restored moors function as major carbon stores. 3,000 tonnes of CO₂ are expected to be stored annually (if the moors are maintained for 50 years).
- Healthy, functioning moorlands promote biodiversity. This project will involve the rewetting of some 3.7 hectares, providing a valuable habitat for rare animal and plant species.
