

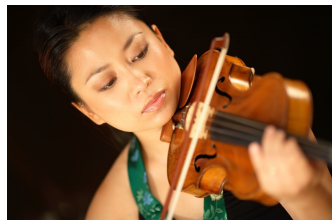

Beethoven MS Orchestra - 4:30 p.m. Mrs. Karen Walker McAfee, Conductor



KAREN WALKER McAFEE comes from a family of educators and musicians. A native of Lubbock, Texas, she retired from the Midland Independent School District in Midland, Texas serving 28 of her total 56 years in education as the Orchestra Director at Robert E. Lee Senior High School. Mrs. McAfee received her Bachelor of Music Education degree from West Texas State University in Canyon, Texas, taught three years in the Amarillo Public Schools, and in 1976 was recruited to start a string program in the Midland Independent School District. During her tenure with the Midland Public Schools, her freshman and high school orchestras were consistent sweepstakes winners and were named as the "Outstanding Orchestra" in several national festivals. Many of her students were named to the All-Region Orchestra each year with a select group of masterful students achieving an All-State designation. Karen is an accomplished violinist, currently performing with the Midland-Odessa Symphony. In recent years, she has also played in the Amarillo, San Angelo, and Big Spring Symphonies. In August 2011 and August 2013, she performed in the All African American Gateways Music Festival on the Eastman School of Music campus in Rochester, New York. Her professional affiliations include memberships in Texas Music Educators Association, Texas Orchestra Directors Association, Texas Music Adjudicators Association, American String Teachers Association, and Texas Classroom Teachers Association. She is a past president of Mu Omicron, honorary orchestra fraternity and a member of Mu Phi Epsilon and Delta Sigma Theta sororities. Karen is also a past president of Texas Orchestra Directors Association and served on the board for the Texas chapter of American String Teachers Association. Mrs. McAfee has worked on the summer music camp faculty for Baylor University, Texas State University, and Texas Tech University. In the 28 years she was at Lee High School, she was selected as "Teacher of the Year" four times. Each year she is called upon to conduct various region orchestras in Texas and to serve on UIL adjudication panels. On four different occasions she had the privilege of conducting the All-Area Orchestra in Omaha, Nebraska. In addition, she has conducted groups from Alabama and Arkansas. Upon retirement, the MISD School Board of Trustees, as a token of appreciation for her exceptional years of service to the district, named the Orchestra Hall at Lee High School the "Karen Walker McAfee Orchestra Hall". A most humble distinction came when the Texas Orchestra Directors Board selected Karen as the 2011 Texas Orchestra Director of the Year. In November 2018, she was inducted into the Lee "Wall of Legacy" – rounding off and putting the finishing touches on an incredible career in Orchestra education. She is extremely grateful and humbled by the many awards bestowed on her. Karen is a devoted wife to retired MISD administrator Dr. John W. McAfee, Sr. and a mother to five young adults – Veronica McAfee, Charlotte McAfee, John McAfee, Jr. Christopher Walker, and Derrick Walker; a mother-in-law to two wonderful daughters – Marci Walker and Stephanie Walker; and a grandmother to seven fabulous grandchildren – Jordan Collins-Walker, Cydney McAfee, Jacob Collins-Walker, Jade Walker, Jessalyn Walker, Mya Walker and Brayden Walker.

Philharmonic HS Orchestra – 5:30 p.m. Mr. Creston Herron, Conductor



CRESTON HERRON is currently the Director of Fine Arts at Klein ISD in Klein, TX and conductor of the Campanile Orchestra at Rice University, Shepherd School of Music. Prior to this position he served as the Director of Orchestras and Fine Arts Department Chair at Klein High School, and the Director of Orchestras at YES Prep Public Schools (Houston, TX). His groups have enjoyed the success of consistent UIL Sweepstakes awards, first division ratings and “best in class” awards at festivals across the country. Under his direction, the Klein Chamber Orchestra and Symphony Orchestra have been recognized as the TMEA String Honor Orchestra, national winners of the Mark of Excellence Competition, Grand Champions of the coveted Orchestra Cup at the National Orchestra Cup Finals held in New York City, Grand Champions of the ASTA National Orchestra Festival, and national winners of The American Prize. Recently, the Klein Chamber Orchestra was invited to perform at the 75th Midwest Clinic which will be held in December 2021. Mr. Herron is a graduate of the University of Kansas in Lawrence, Kansas, where he received his bachelor’s degree, Rice University, Shepherd School of Music in Houston, TX, where he received his master degree on scholarship as a Provost Fellow and a Brown Scholar, and recently received a master degree in school leadership from Sam Houston State University. During the summer seasons, he serves on the AFA Summer Conservatory faculty as a faculty artist. As a violinist, he has performed with various orchestras, and organizations around the world. His orchestral experience includes performances with Trans-Siberian Orchestra, CCM Spoleto festival in Italy, Pasadena Philharmonic, Galveston Symphony, concertmaster of the Eutiner Festspiele Opera in Eutin, Germany, and Houston Latin Philharmonic. As a conductor, he has participated in master classes with Dr. Cliff Evans, Gary Lewis, Larry Livingston, Larry Rachleff and Don Schleicher. Mr. Herron was recognized in 2017 as the Teacher of the Year at Klein High School and was awarded the 2018 Marjorie Keller Outstanding Young Teacher of the Year Award by the State Board of the Texas Chapter of The American String Teacher’s Association. The Houston Symphony awarded Mr. Herron with the Spec’s Charitable Award for Excellence in Music Education. He is a proud member of the Texas Music Educators Association, American String Teachers Association, Texas Music Adjudicators Association and the Texas Orchestra Directors Association. In addition to teaching and performing, Mr. Herron is an active clinician and adjudicator, giving numerous professional development workshops and clinics with many orchestras and school districts across the state as well as conducting all-region orchestras, all-state orchestras, judging UIL competitions and solo and ensembles contests. Herron currently lives in Tomball, TX with his wife Dawn and two children.

Symphony HS Orchestra - 6:00 p.m. Mr. David Itkin, Conductor



The 2021-2022 season marks **DAVID ITKIN’S** 17th season as Music Director and Conductor of the Abilene Philharmonic, and his 14th year serving as Professor of Music and Director of Orchestral Studies at the University of North Texas College of Music. Maestro Itkin’s ‘21-’22 calendar features complete, revitalized concert seasons with the Abilene Philharmonic and the UNT Symphony Orchestra, as well as appearances with the Lubbock Symphony Orchestra, *Messiah* for the Abilene Opera Association, a complete, concert production of Verdi’s *Otello* at the UNT College of Music, and an appearance with the Texas Region 25 Honors Orchestra. Highlights in recent seasons include Mahler Symphony No. 4, Verdi’s *Requiem*, Beethoven Symphony No. 9, Puccini’s *Turandot* in concert, Janacek’s *The Cunning Little Vixen* with the UNT Opera Theatre, and *West Side Story* for the Abilene Opera Company. Following a distinguished 17-year tenure, Maestro Itkin was named Conductor Laureate of the Arkansas Symphony Orchestra in July 2010. Previously Mr. Itkin served as Music Director & Conductor of the Las Vegas Philharmonic, Artistic Director and

Conductor of the McCall Summerfest in McCall, Idaho, and as Music Director & Conductor of the Lake Forest Symphony (Chicago), the Kingsport Symphony, the Birmingham Opera Theatre, and the Lucius Woods Music Festival (Wisconsin). During past seasons Maestro Itkin’s career has taken him to 45 U.S. states and 15 countries in Europe, the Middle East, and Asia, including concerts and recordings with the Winnipeg Symphony Orchestra, the Slovenska Filharmonija, the San Diego Symphony, and the Seoul Philharmonic. Other guest conducting appearances include concerts with the Colorado Philharmonic, the Annapolis Symphony, the National Repertory Orchestra, the Fort Worth Symphony, the Illinois Symphony, the Delaware Symphony, the New Hampshire Symphony, the Cheyenne Symphony, and the Indianapolis, Baltimore, and Reno Chamber Orchestras. During the Summer of 2006 Maestro Itkin appeared once again with the Slovenska Filharmonija in Ljubljana, Slovenia, conducting the opening concert of the 14th World Saxophone Congress. His book, *Conducting Concerti*, was released in August 2014 to considerable critical acclaim. Leonard Slatkin called *Conducting Concerti* “a valuable textbook for the aspiring Maestro...highly recommended,” and Samuel Adler called it “an invaluable addition to the world of conducting textbooks.” Mr. Itkin’s next book, *The Conductor’s Craft*, will be published by GIA Publications (Chicago) in December 2021. Mr. Itkin’s first film score (“Sugar Creek”) was recorded in 2006 by the Arkansas Symphony for the film’s 2007 release. His most recent major work, “Exodus”, an oratorio, was premiered in April 2005 in Little Rock, with William Shatner narrating. “Exodus” was released worldwide on CD in 2007. In May 2009 Maestro Itkin was awarded both an Honorary Doctorate of Humane Letters by Lyon College and the *Above the Barre* award by Ballet Arkansas. In addition to his professional schedule, Maestro Itkin regularly serves as a guest conductor/clinician, including concerts with the Arkansas All-State Orchestra, the Southern California High School Honors Orchestra, the Maine All-State Orchestra, the Las Vegas Senior Honors Orchestra, and several Texas all-region Honors Orchestras.

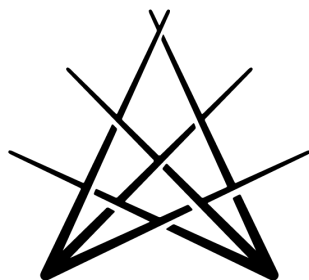
