How to take UPA

Take one pill as soon as you can after unprotected sex (within 120 hours).

Do not take this pill if you have:

- used hormonal contraception in the last 5 days (UPA will not be as effective)
- taken an LNG emergency contraceptive pill in the last 7 days e.g. Levonelle (UPA may interact)
- taken St John's Wort or prescription medication for TB, epilepsy, HIV, asthma (inhalers are not a problem), stomach acid levels or liver problems (UPA will not be as effective)
- $\cdot\,$ an allergy to lactose or ulipristal acetate.

If you vomit within 3 hours of taking UPA, get in touch as you may need another dose.

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THINGS TO CONSIDER:

- if you have already ovulated, the emergency contraceptive pill will not have any effect as it works by delaying ovulation
- \cdot if you are breastfeeding, discard your milk for 36 hours after taking UPA
- this pill will not prevent pregnancy after future unprotected sex
- \cdot this pill does not protect against STIs, so you may want to take an STI test
- your period may be a bit earlier or later than usual, you may also experience some spotting. If your period is over a week late, you may want to take a pregnancy test.

RESTARTING YOUR REGULAR CONTRACEPTION:

If you usually take the pill, or use the patch or ring, do not start for 5 days after taking UPA. Then use extra protection (condoms) for the first 7 days after restarting (2 days for POP).
