But before we do that, let's take a moment to better understand today's key vocabulary words. Have quick cards with word and image to help students gain access to the language quickly. Pass out article excerpt and worksheet.	Students should repeat vocabulary words and definitions.	If students are not following along: 1st Observance: Narrate the positive behavior, "I see John following along with his finger, and I can see that Amanda is, too." 2nd Observance: Silently hold up your index finger, make eye contact with student(s), and then model following along on your own article.
	Now, as I read through this short article, I want you to follow along using your index finger, like this (model with first sentence). After reading, model a fact based open: After reading, I now feel like I can use one of the facts that I discovered, 'Plastic straws are not biodegradable' to state my fact-based opinion: 'Plastic straws should be banned because they are not biodegradable.' To make this even stronger – be ready to support the argument in favor of keeping plastic straws.	Students should track on their paper with an index finger.
