UNDERSTANDING





- HISA is a private, nongovernmental organization empowered by the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Act.
- » HISA's programs are the Racetrack Safety Program and the Anti-Doping and Medication Control (ADMC) Program.
- W HISA's Racetrack Safety Committee and ADMC Committee draft the rules for the respective Programs. The rules must be approved by the Federal Trade Commission.
- » HISA administers and enforces its Racetrack Safety Program, while HIWU administers and enforces HISA's ADMC Program.

- HIWU is a division of Drug Free Sport International, a private company that has been a leader in human drug testing since 1999.
- » HIWU is not a part/ division/ department/ branch of HISA.
- » HIWU is an independent entity that has been contracted to enforce HISA's ADMC rules.
- There are no "HIWU rules." HIWU's role is to enforce HISA's ADMC rules and investigate potential violations of those rules.
