

CASE RESOLUTION WITHOUT HEARING

ADMC Program Rule 3212/Presence of a Banned Substance and/or its Metabolites or Markers

Covered Person: Efren Loza, Jr. Covered Horses: Mexicoffee

On April 22, 2024, Efren Loza, Jr. agreed to an Admission of Equine Anti-Doping Rule Violation(s) and Acceptance of Consequences pursuant to the Anti-Doping and Medication Control (ADMC) Program in connection with the above-referenced matter. This matter involved the presence of a Banned Substance and/or its Metabolites or Markers (ADMC Program Rule 3212) in a Post-Race/Vet's List Sample – Clenbuterol. The Banned Substance was found to be present in a blood Sample collected after Race 4 at Gulfstream Park in Hallandale Beach, Florida on February 14, 2024.

As a result, the following Consequences were imposed against Mr. Loza under the ADMC Program:

- 1. A period of Ineligibility for you of eighteen (18) months, beginning on April 17, 2024, the date of the imposition of your Provisional Suspension, and continuing through October 16, 2025, pursuant to ADMC Program Rule 3223;
- 2. A period of Ineligibility for the Covered Horse Mexicoffee of fourteen (14) months, beginning on February 14, 2024, and continuing through April 13, 2025, pursuant to ADMC Program Rule 3222 and subject to a Negative Finding in a Re-Entry Test for all Banned Substances:
- Disqualification of the results of Mexicoffee obtained in Race 4 at Gulfstream Park in Hallandale Beach, Florida on February 14, 2024, and forfeiture of all purses and other compensation, prizes, trophies, points, and rankings and repayment or surrender (as applicable) to the Race Organizer pursuant to ADMC Program Rule 3221;
- 4. A fine of \$12,500 in accordance with ADMC Program Rule 3223; and
- 5. Public reporting in accordance with ADMC Program Rule 3610(b) and Public Disclosure in accordance with ADMC Program Rule 3620.
