

## **CASE RESOLUTION WITHOUT HEARING**

ADMC Program Rule 3312/Presence of a Controlled Medication Substance and/or its Metabolites or Markers/Use of a Controlled Medication Method Within the Race Period

Covered Person: William Martin Covered Horses: Pittsburgh

On July 30, 2025, William Martin agreed to Admission of Equine Controlled Medication Rule Violation(s) and Acceptance of Consequences pursuant to the Anti-Doping and Medication Control (ADMC) Program in connection with the above-referenced matter. This matter involves the use of a Controlled Medication Method (ADMC Program Rule 3313), i.e., the alkalinization or Use/Administration of an alkalinizing agent (ADMC Program Rule 4221), with respect to the Covered Horse Pittsburgh. TCO2 in excess of the level set forth in ADMC Program Rule 4221 was found in a blood Sample collected from Pittsburgh prior to Race 4 at Oaklawn Park in Hot Springs, Arkansas on February 28, 2025.

As a result, the following Consequences were imposed against Mr. Martin under the ADMC Program:

- A period of Ineligibility of fifteen (15) days, beginning on August 1, 2025, and continuing through August 15, 2025, pursuant to ADMC Program Rule 3323, with partial credit given for the period of Ineligibility Mr. Martin served in connection with ADMC Program Case involving the Covered Horse Wild Irish;
- 2. Disqualification of the results of Pittsburgh obtained in Race 4 at Oaklawn Park in Hot Springs, Arkansas on February 28, 2025, and forfeiture of all purses and other compensation, prizes, trophies, points, and rankings and repayment or surrender (as applicable) to the Race Organizer pursuant to ADMC Program Rule 3321;
- 3. A fine of \$2,500 in accordance with ADMC Program Rule 3323;
- 4. Assignment of 3 Penalty Points (ADMC Program Rule 3328); and
- 5. Public reporting in accordance with ADMC Program Rule 3610(b) and Public Disclosure in accordance with ADMC Program Rule 3620.
