

CASE RESOLUTION WITHOUT HEARING

ADMC Program Rule 3213/Use or Attempted Use of a Banned Substance/ADMC Program Rule 3214(a)/Possession of a Banned Substance

Covered Person: Calixto Juarez

Covered Horse: Seafarer

On August 5, 2025, Calixto Juarez agreed to Admissions of Equine Anti-Doping Rule Violation and Acceptances of Consequences pursuant to the Anti-Doping and Medication Control (ADMC) Program in connection with the above-referenced matter. These matters involved the Use and Possession of the Banned Substance Ethanol in violation of ADMC Program Rules 3213 and 3214(a), respectively. On June 4, 2025, Mr. Juarez was observed and recorded giving an oral substance to the Covered Horse Seafarer at Delaware Park in Wilmington, Delaware, and that substance was found to be the Banned Substance Ethanol. The bottle of the Banned Substance was also located in his barn and seized on that same date.

As a result, the following Consequences were imposed against Mr. Juarez under the ADMC Program:

- 1. A period of Ineligibility of eighteen (18) months for a violation of ADMC Program Rule 3213, as described in ADMC Program Rule 3223 (Protocol), beginning on August 8, 2025, and continuing through February 7, 2027;
- 2. A period of Ineligibility of eighteen (18) months for a violation of ADMC Program Rule 3214(a), as described in ADMC Program Rule 3223 (Protocol), beginning on February 8, 2027, and continuing through August 7, 2028;
- 3. A fine of \$12,500.00 USD for a violation of ADMC Program Rule 3213, in accordance with ADMC Program Rule 3223 (Protocol);
- 4. A fine of \$12,500.00 USD for a violation of ADMC Program Rule 3214(a), in accordance with ADMC Program Rule 3223 (Protocol);
- 5. A period of Ineligibility of sixty (60) days for the Covered Horse Seafarer, beginning on June 4, 2025, and subject to a Negative Re-Entry Test, pursuant to ADMC Program Rule 3222; and
- 6. Public Disclosure in accordance with ADMC Program Rule 3620 (Protocol).

The total period of Ineligibility is thirty-six (36) months, and the total fine is \$25,000.
