LOCAL

Local officials include but are not limited to positions like **mayor, council members, comptroller, city planner, and department heads.**

Responsibilities include but are not limited to:

- Parks and Recreation Services
- Police and Fire
- Emergency Medical
- Municipal Courts
- Public Works

STATE

State officials include but are not limited to **governor, state comptroller, attorney general, secretary of state, lieutenant governor.**

Responsibilities Include but are not limited to:

- Property Ownership
- Benefit Program Implementation
- Intrastate Regulation

FEDERAL

Federal officials include but are not limited to **President of the United States, Vice President of the United States, U.S. Senators, U.S. House Representatives.**

Responsibilities Include but are not limited to:

- Interstate Commerce
- Foreign Commerce
- Declaration of War
- Foreign Affairs
- National Policies

Local Government Areas

Areas governed by local governments may be called:

- municipalities
- counties
- cities
- towns
- boroughs

In the United States, the state and federal governments share some responsibilities to support its citizens.
