



## SCREENING VISIT

### Meet with the Principal Investigator (PI)

- Ask questions
- Physical exam, evaluation and medical history
- Evaluation testing, which may include health and lifestyle questionnaires, managing your condition, etc.

### Meet with the Study Coordinator

- Receive and review your trial journey book

### Discuss and Sign Paperwork

- Informed Consent form and Sponsor materials
- Discuss safety, side effects, number of visits and financial considerations
- Questionnaires on health, work issues, depression, coping mechanisms, managing your condition, etc.

### Evaluation Testing

- Depending on the trial protocol, these could include lab tests, X-rays, CT scan, physical exam, etc.



## BASELINE OR ENTRY VISIT

### Meet with the PI and Study Coordinator

- Discuss any changes to medical history or medications you are taking
- Learn about home monitoring
- Reconfirm your consent and eligibility

### Receive Your Study Medication

- Dosing information
- Conduct lab tests done to get baseline value
- Start your study treatment



## ONGOING CLINICAL TRIAL VISITS (MULTIPLE)

### Brief physical exam may take place and/or benchmark testing

### Discuss side-effects you may be experiencing

### Discuss and account for drug intakes

### Review your trial diary

### Sponsor questionnaires or forms may be filled out

### Receive your trial treatment

### At-home monitoring continues



## YOUR LAST CLINICAL TRIAL VISIT

### A final physical exam and lab tests performed

### Discuss and account for drug intakes

### Review your diary

### Final benchmark tests and Sponsor materials



## THE POST-TRIAL FOLLOW-UP VISIT

### In-person or telephone follow-ups with the research coordinator

### You may have one follow-up visit or you may have several over months or years
