Keeping your home in good repair



To make sure your home stays in good condition, it's important to inspect it at least once a year, to check for any damage. If you repair this damage early on, it could save you a lot of time, trouble and expense in the future. Here are some things you should look out for.

Roof and chimneys

Check for:

- loose or missing slates or tiles
- holes or slits in flat roofs
- damp patches in the attic or roof spaces
- cracked or loose chimney pots.

Maintenance:

- Always call in a roofing professional to carry out any repairs.
- If you have an open fire, get your chimney swept regularly.

Safety first:

□ Don't climb up onto the roof yourself – look from outside, using binoculars if possible.

Drainage

Check for:

- blocked gutters and downpipes
- □ leaking gutters and pipes
- plants growing in gutters
- damp patches on the wall
- □ rubbish leaves or plants in the drains.

Maintenance:

- Clear out gutters out least once a year.
- Clear out drains regularly.

Safety first:

□ If you need to use a ladder to clear out the gutters, make sure you do this safely.

Walls

Check for:

- large cracks or crumbling in harling or other rendered surfaces
- eroding mortar between bricks or stones
- damp patches
- wide cracks that have recently appeared.

Maintenance:

- Hire a builder to repoint the mortar between stones and bricks.
- □ Touch up painted or limewashed masonry when necessary.

External paintwork

Check for:

- cracked or splitting paintwork
- rotting wood.

Maintenance:

Repaint every five to seven years.

Damp

Check for:

- condensation
- mould and fungi
- damp patches on walls and ceilings
- leaking plumbing
- breaks in the damp proof course.

Maintenance:

- Make sure kitchens and bathrooms have adequate ventilation – install an extractor fan or window vents or simply open windows regularly.
- Only dry laundry in well ventilated areas.
- □ Line windowsills with absorbent strips.
- Put silica containers in areas susceptible to condensation, such as windowsills and kitchen cupboards.
- Install a dehumidifier.
- Clean mould and fungi from walls with an anti-bacterial wash.
- □ Install or replace your damp proof course.

Ladder safety

- Always use a ladder that's long enough so you don't have to reach too far.
- Make sure the ladder is standing on a firm, level base.
- Ask someone to hold the ladder steady for you at all times.
- □ Always keep one hand on the ladder.
- Never reach too far or lean backwards.
- □ Don't rely on the strength of a gutter to support the ladder or you!
- Don't go up a ladder in windy weather.

Hiring a contractor

DO ask around for recommendations. DON'T hire anyone you don't trust. DO make sure the contractor is a member of a reputable trade association. DON'T let sales people pressure you. DO get at least three estimates. DON'T pay cash in hand. DO ask for a warranty. DON'T pay up until you're satisfied.
